A CLIMB TOWARD VICTORY ON **MOUNT EVEREST: CHARLIE LINVILLE**



His right leg throbbing and his head pounding, Charlie Linville scanned the horizon from atop Planet Earth.

What a wonderful world God has created, he thought, as he looked out across the rugged ridges of the majestic Himalayan mountains, situated on the border of Nepal and Tibet.

The winds were howling at 60 miles per hour and the windchill was hovering at -30 degrees. But this 30-year-old retired Marine staff sergeant had just accomplished what had seemed like an insurmountable feat. He had become the first combat wounded amputee to scale Mount Everest, the world's highest mountain.

Unable to remove their goggles or gloves for fear of frostbite, Charlie and climbing mate Tim Medvetz, founder of The Heroes Project, let the moment wash

They had tried to ascend the 29,029-foot Everest in 2014 from the south side. But when a powerful avalanche rushed down the slope and killed 16 Nepalese guides, the mountain was shut down and they had to put their dream on hold. The two attempted the climb again in 2015-this time on the north sidebut they were thwarted once more when a 7.8-magnitude earthquake rocked Nepal and killed nearly 9,000 people.

The earthquake also triggered an avalanche on the south side that claimed the lives of 19 climbers and Sherpas at Everest Base Camp. Out of deference for those who had died, Charlie and Tim cut short their mission in order to join Team Rubicon, a veterans or-



So here they were, finally fulfilling their longtime aspiration.

What a blessed moment for Charlie. Only five years before, he lay in a hospital bed after suffering a severe injury while on duty with a bomb-disposal unit in Afghanistan. A buried explosive device had detonated when Charlie stepped on it, catapulting him 15 feet into the air. He suffered a traumatic brain injury, amputated index and ring fingers on his right hand and a mangled right foot. Fourteen surgeries over an 18-month period-characterized by constant pain and painkillers-couldn't save the foot, so he had his leg amputated just below the knee in 2012. He was medically retired in September 2013

While soaking in his victory at the summit, Charlie reflected: What a fantastic feeling to be at the top. I'm thankful I was able to push this war-torn body of mine to its max and be successful in the ambitious goal that I had set for myself.

"Some people exhaust all their energy to get to the top," Charlie said soon after his return. "But the top is only halfway. The goal is not only to reach the summit. Your mission is to get back down alive."

And after being up on the mountain April 17 through May 23, indeed he did!

Billy Graham: Here's What to Say to Couples Living Together Before Marriage

Evangelist Billy Graham has said that when addressing couples who are living together but are unmarried, it's important to remind them that they run the risk of "great unhappiness" in the future.

In a Q&A published Thursday by the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, Graham was asked: "My nephew just moved in with his girlfriend, and when I told him I thought it was morally wrong, he just laughed and said no one believes that anymore. Anyway, he said, he's not interested in God, because the only thing that counts is being happy. What can I say to him?"



The 98-year-old evangelist responded by saying that first of all, it may be difficult to say anything that will change the minds of the couple living together.

"From what you say, he's interested only in

what's happening in the present moment, and he doesn't want anyone to interfere with what he's doing-including God," Graham said.

However, he advised talking about the future: "First, remind him that although he thinks he's found happiness, he actually is running the risk of great unhappiness in the future," he explained. "Relationships like this always lack one thing: stability. The reason is because-unlike marriage-they lack true commitment, and can unravel at any moment. What happens if one of them gets bored, or upset, or finds someone more attractive?"

It's also important to remind couples of their need for God's guidance and wisdom, Graham said.



"A life lived only for self is empty and insecure-but God loves us, and He knows what is best for us," he said. "Pray for your nephew, that he will face his need for God's forgiveness and new life. Pray too that you will be an example to him of Christ's love-a love that far exceeds the pleasures of the moment."

According to statistics, cohabitation has increased by nearly 900 percent over the last 50 years, with 7.8 million couples living together without walking down the aisle, compared to 2.9 million in 1996.

Unfortunately, research also indicates that couples who cohabit before marriage have a 50 - 80 percent higher divorce rate than those who don't. They also have higher rates of domestic violence and are more likely to be involved in sexual affairs.

In an earlier "My Answers" column, Graham further weighed in on the problem with cohabitation before marriage: "On a practical level, the problem with simply living together is that there's no real commitment, either to each other or to marriage," he explained. "What's to keep your boyfriend from deciding he doesn't want to be tied down, and suddenly casting you aside? Or what's to keep you from leaving after a minor disagreement (as happens in almost any relationship)? The answer is simple: precisely nothing."

He also offered up a reminder that God gave marriage to us for our happiness and mutual help.

"In His eyes it's a solemn commitment to be faithful to each other, no matter what happens. This is why the Bible commands us to avoid sexual relations outside of marriage. Only then can true love flourish, and only then will your relationship grow stronger over the years."

Facebook Apologizes for Suspending Christian Mom Over Post on Homosexuality

Facebook recently froze the public Facebook page of Elizabeth Johnston, an Ohio homeschool mother of 10 who runs the popular blog and Facebook account "The Activist Mommy."

"The Activist Mommy" Facebook account was frozen on Feb. 9 because of a comment Johnston posted over six months ago that cited passages from the New Testament and Old Testament, including how Leviticus states that homosexuality is a "detestable" sin and an "abomination."

The comment, which included no namecalling, was simply Johnston's commentary in response to another Facebook user, who had commented on one of Johnston's videos and argued that Christians are hypocrites for condemning homosexuality.

Johnston received a message from Facebook saying that the post in question was removed because "it doesn't follow the Facebook Community Standards." Additionally, her account was frozen for a period of three days.

After she regained access to her account on Feb. 12, Johnston published a post explaining to her follow-

ers that her Facebook account had been frozen. The post included a screengrab of her original Bible commentary and the message that she received from Facebook. She concluded the post with the hashtag #FacebookCensorsBible.

It didn't take long for Facebook to remove the Feb. 12 post and freeze Johnston's account for an additional seven days.

After news of Johnston's claims were reported on by CP and picked up by numerous media outlets worldwide, Facebook is now offering an apology.



A spokesperson for the social media company told CP on Thursday that the removal of Johnston's post and the suspension of her account was done by mistake and "in error." The spokesperson as-

sured that both posts in question have been restored.


"The post was removed in error and we restored it as soon as we were able to investigate," the Facebook spokesperson wrote in an email. "Our team processes millions of reports each week and we sometimes get things wrong."

"We are sorry for any inconvenience this may have caused," the spokesperson added.

Along with the statement sent to CP, Facebook also notified Johnston on Thursday to



GOSPEL ARTIST DONNIE MCCLURKIN SHARES WHY CHRISTIANS SHOULD PRAY FOR DONALD TRUMP

Gospel artist Donnie McClurkin has shared why he believes Christians should pray for U.S. President Donald Trump - even if they don't agree with his policies.

"Now is our time to pray for him. This is the job of the church," the 57-year-old "Great Is Your Mercy" artist said during an appearance on the syndicated radio show Get Up! Mornings With Erica Campbell.

"Let the world protest but the job of the church now is to go into prayer and pray that, number one, he succeeds, because if he fails, we have to deal with the consequences as a nation," he added, quoting 2 Chronicles 7:14. "America is in a place that it has never been before and the Christian has got to be who God has called us to be."



McClurkin, who serves as the pastor of Perfecting Faith Church in Freeport, New York, also suggested that the rallies carried out across the U.S. protesting Trump's policies on immigration and other issues aren't helpful: "We need to know what our vote really means and how to utilize it. But I don't want us to get caught up in this protest," he said. "The protests do nothing but rile up. It causes people's anger to rise up and it gives us a false sense of involvement."



The Death of a Life Legend



"History will remember her as Jane Roe.' But eternity will forever know her as Norma McCorvey, a child of God." That's how Dr. Jim Garlow starts a moving piece memorializing the face of the most significant abortion case in America. In one of the greatest redemption stories in decades, he shares how the woman who became synonymous with abortion experienced the transforming love of Jesus Christ and became one of the most powerful voices in the prolife movement.

What most people don't know about McCorvey, who was 22 and struggling at the time of the pregnancy that led to the Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade case, is that she never stepped foot in the courtroom and never had an abortion. When the devastating 7-2 decision came down, her baby was already two and a half years old and placed for adoption. Even though it's after her namesake that Roe v. Wade is named (for privacy's sake, she was referred to as Jane Roe), most people now acknowledge that the entire case was built on a lie. The abortion lobby took advantage of Norma to push their deadly agenda on America -- and succeeded.

But one person who didn't buy the argument was Norma herself. Years after her conversion, she called the case the "biggest mistake of her life." That change of heart was largely due to a pastor and pro-life activist you may recognize: Flip Benham, dad of the Benham Brothers. Through his gentle persistence, he befriended McCorvey

and slowly led her to the Lord in 1995. For the rest of her life, she tried to reverse the decision that has led to the slaughter of 58 million innocent children, even testifying before Congress against abortion.

Over the weekend, while she was still very much an active champion of the pro-life movement, Norma passed away. At 69, she'd spent the last two decades "serving the Lord and helping women save babies." Dr. Garlow remembers Norma from the first church service she attended. Anxious about how the congregation would respond to the poster woman of the abortion movement, she drove around the parking lot debating whether or not to go in. Eventually, she saw Pastor Benham and decided to go in.

"I still recall exactly where they sat that Sunday," Jim writes, "off to my left from my view from the platform... With her permission, I introduced her at the end of the service, telling the congregation that 'Jane Roe' of Roe v. Wade had come to Christ and had experienced forgiveness for her sins. I explained that she was present in the auditorium. I asked her to stand. She did. The crowd erupted in an extended standing ovation. McCorvey was shocked. She did not expect that. After the service ended, nearly the entire church congregation formed an extremely long line to give her a hug and welcome her into the family of God. It was a profoundly moving and tender moment. Norma McCorvey... had experienced the love and forgiveness of Jesus. She had now experienced the love and forgiveness of the body of Christ -- the church. It was an exhilarating day for us all."

Together with the rest of the pro-life community, we mourn the loss of a true warrior for the unborn. She has been a powerful witness of conversion and truth in a sea of lies surrounding Roe v. Wade. In her honor, we will continue to fight until her namesake is vindicated and Roe is overturned.

12th Dead Sea Scrolls' Cave Found in Israel, 'Best Discovery in 60 Years'

Evidence of a 12th cave related to the Dead Sea scrolls was found this week by Hebrew University of Jerusalem researchers. Archeologists, including Oren Gutfeld and Ahiad Ovadia from the university's Institute of Archeology -- aided by Randall Price and students of Liberty University in Virginia -- are the first people in more than 60 years to have discovered a new scroll cave. Prior to this find, it was believed only 11 caves had contained the coveted scrolls.

A new cave found near Jersulaem was proclaimed to be the 12th one containing the famour Dead Sea Scrolls. The only scroll found in the Qumran cave, however, was blank, though archaeologists believe that in ancient times it was being prepared for writing. Oren Gutfeld & Ahiad Ovadia

Prior to this find, it was believed only 11 caves had contained the coveted scrolls.

The scrolls are thought to be from the Second Temple period. After excavating the ancient hollow, located near the sea's northwestern shore, the researchers concluded the additional scrolls were looted by Bedouin residents in the middle of the last century, reports The Jerusalem Post.

"Numerous storage jars and lids from the Second Temple period were found hidden in niches along the walls of the cave and deep inside a long tunnel at its rear," said Gutfeld, who directed the dig.

"The jars were all broken and their contents removed, and the discovery toward the end of the excavation of a pair of iron pickax heads from the 1950s, stored within the tunnel for later use, proves the cave was looted."

Scholars said that like in "Cave 8," in which scroll jars but no scrolls were found, this cave will receive the designation Q12 (the

Q=Qumran, standing in front of the number to indicate no scrolls were found).

Between 1947 and 1956, the Dead Sea Scrolls were found in a series of 11 caves located near the site of Qumran in what is now the West Bank. The scrolls contain copies of books of the Hebrew Bible along with community rules, calendars and astronomical texts, among other writings.

"This exciting excavation is the closest we've come to discovering new Dead Sea scrolls in 60 years," said Gutfeld. "Until now, it was accepted that Dead Sea scrolls were found only in 11 caves at Qumran, but now there is no doubt that this is the 12th cave."


Despite not finding more scrolls, Gutfeld said the evidence uncovered in the cave unequivocally confirms it once contained the documents. "Although at the end of the day no scroll was found, and instead we 'only' found a piece of parchment rolled up in a jug that was being processed for writing, the findings indicate beyond any doubt that the cave contained scrolls that were stolen," he said.

"Those findings include the jars in which the scrolls and their coverings were hidden, a leather strap for binding the scroll, a cloth that wrapped the scrolls, tendons and pieces of skin connecting fragments, and more."

The finds from the excavation also include fragments of scroll wrappings, a string that tied the scrolls, and a piece of leather that was a part of a scroll, he said.

Gutfeld said relics of pottery, numerous flint blades, arrowheads and a decorated stamp seal made of carnelian (a semi-precious stone), also revealed the cave was used in the Chalcolithic and Neolithic, or Bronze and Stone Age, periods.

"This first excavation to take place in the northern part of the Judean Desert as part of 'Operation Scroll' will open the door to further understanding the function of the caves with respect to the scrolls, with the potential of finding new scroll material," he said.



"The material, when published, will provide important new evidence for scholars of the archeology of Qumran and the Dead Sea caves."

Israel Hasson, director-general of the Israel Antiquities Authority, said this important discovery of another scroll cave attests to the fact that work remains to be done in the Judean Desert. He believes finds of huge importance are still waiting to be discovered.

"We are in a race against time, as antiquities thieves steal heritage assets worldwide for financial gain. The State of Israel needs to mobilize and allocate the necessary resources in order to launch a historic operation, together with the public, to carry out a systematic excavation of all the caves of the Judean Desert."

Some of the thousands of fragments of Dead Sea Scrolls now in museums or private collections could have come from this new cave rather than the 11 previously known caves, Gutfeld said in Yahoo Live Science. "Finding this additional scroll cave means we can no longer be certain that the original locations (Caves 1 through 11) attributed to the Dead Sea scrolls that reached the market via the Bedouins are accurate," Gutfeld said in a statement.

The excavation was supported in part by the Civil Administration of Judea and Samaria, Israel Nature and Parks Authority, and Israel Antiquities Authority. Its findings are now part of the new "Operation Scroll," launched by Hasson to undertake systematic surveys and to excavate the caves in the Judean Desert.

TOO BUSY TO HELP

Nearly 30 years a study was conducted at Princeton University, USA, designed to figure out the conditions under which good people would act for good, or at least be helpful. Two psychologists asked a group of theology students to walk to another building on campus to give a short speech, either about their motives for studying theology or about the biblical parable of the

Good Samaritan. Meanwhile, the

psychologists had arranged for an actor to be stationed on the path between the two buildings, slumped over, coughing and obviously in bad shape. The two experimenters

> had also led half the students to believe they were late for their speaking appointment, and half that they had ample time.

> So, what do you think the responses were? Who was most likely to help: those with the story of the Good Samaritan uppermost in their mind or

those thinking about the motives for studying theology? There was a significance difference between groups, but it was not along the lines of speech content. The content of the speech made no difference. About the same number of Good Samaritan speakers and theology motivation students stopped. What did mid make a difference was how rushed the students thought themselves to be. Only 10 percent of those led to believe they were running late stopped to help. Of those told that they had plenty of time, 60 percent stopped to help.

Trump Washes His Hands of Bathroom Order



If you thought President Trump hit the ground running, you should see Jeff Sessions. The new attorney general was probably still unpacking his office when he got to work turning the page at the Justice Department after eight years of scandal. First up? The Obama bathroom mandate for public schools.

Less than 48 hours after his confirmation, Sessions's DOJ made it clear the agency was under new management by refusing to defend the controversial order to let students of both sexes use any locker room, shower, or restroom they want. Since last May when President Obama shocked the country with his decree, the issue has been working its way through the courts -- thanks to a huge pushback from states like Texas. By summer's end, a federal judge agreed with parents: the Obama administration had overstepped its boundaries. In a huge win for the Constitution and common sense, Reed O'Connor blocked the rule from taking effect, at least temporarily. Frustrated, the Obama attorneys asked the court to lift its ban in every state except the 13 who sued the government over it. O'Connor refused, insisting:

"It is clear from Supreme Court and Fifth Circuit precedent that this Court has the power to issue a nationwide injunction where appropriate. Both Title IX and Title VII rely on the consistent, uniform application of national standards in education and workplace policy. A nationwide injunction is necessary because the alleged violation extends nationwide," he wrote. "Should the Court only limit the injunction to the plaintiff states who are a party to this cause of action, the Court risks a 'substantial likelihood that a geographically-limited injunction would be ineffective."

Not surprisingly, the Obama administration appealed. But thanks to the Trump team's quick thinking, the court date originally scheduled for tomorrow has been can-

celed. "The parties are currently considering how best to proceed," Justice officials wrote. Of course, most Americans hope that "proceeding" includes the formal withdrawal of an edict that's already had a deleterious effect on girls' privacy and safety. From Virginia to Oklahoma, the groundswell of opposition exploded. While some districts may have waffled on the rule, parents refused to take the government's coercion lying down. In Palatine, Illinois, where girls were so afraid to change in the locker room that they wore their gym clothes under their school clothes, the Trump administration's move is a positive step. No child's innocence should be sacrificed on the altar of political correctness.

Donald Trump argued before the election that the federal government had no business forcing extreme bathroom and shower policies on schools. "The state should make the decision," he argued. Hopefully, the new White House will give them that opportunity by overturning Obama's order -- once and for all.

NFL Tries to Down Privacy Bill by Contact

If NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell thinks "football unites us," then why is his league taking political sides? Good question, one NFL is having a tough time answering. With league ratings in the basement after the Colin Kaepernick controversy, you'd think Goodell and company would have learned their les-

son about wading into the culture wars. Not so, scream today's headlines. Instead of distancing themselves from the kinds of debates that divide fans, the NFL is digging in its cleats on a losing issue: gender-free bathrooms.

Days after hosting a hugely successful Houston Super Bowl -- both from a PR and revenue standpoint -- the league is starting the off-season with empty threats over the Texas Privacy Act. "If a proposal that is discrimina-

tory or inconsistent with our values were to become law [in Texas], that would certainly be a factor considered when thinking about awarding future events," warned NFL spokesman Brian McCarthy.



Of course,

the irony is that the very city where the championship game was just held -- Houston -- overwhelmingly rejected the very legislation the NFL says it supports. And did the league pitch a fit then? No. All it did was reaffirm its commitment to "inclusivity," which the Texas Privacy Act supports. Believe it or not, if Goodell issued a blanket policy that every NFL stadium had to make its bathrooms gender-free, the Lone Star bill would let him! "Despite persistent misinformation in the media, under Senate Bill 6, all Texas teams will be able to set their own policies at the stadiums and arenas where they play and hold their events. There is no conflict with the NFL's statement today and Senate

But here's the league's dirty little secret. This isn't about what happens at their own stadiums. If it were, the league would have already relabeled its facilities. This is about the NFL being used by activists to leverage their power against the people and their elected leaders. And at this point -- eight days after a Super Bowl in the very state it's criticizing -- the NFIs after-the-fact warnings are almost comical.

If Goodell hoped to scare Texas leaders, he'll have to try harder. Texas Governor Greg Abbott (R), who cares more about protecting

his citizens than the NFI's misguided politics, jabbed the league on Twitter, saying "NFL decision makers also benched Tom Brady last season. It ended with NFL handing the Super Bowl trophy to Brady." Much like ESPN, which saw viewership slump after a few too many liberal rants, the NFL is on precarious ground. "The steady decline in NFL television ratings has been the biggest story of the football season, and arguably the biggest sports-business story of 2016," Yahoo!

Finance wrote. Across every demographic, the league's defense of Colin Kaepernick led to a protest from which the league might not recover. Surely, the league knows better than to involve the NFL in an equally combustible debate over bathrooms. Or does it?





Continued from "Facebook Apologizes" page 3 inform her that a member of the Facebook team "accidentally removed" the two posts.

"This was a mistake," the notification read. "We apologize for the error."

Johnston wrote in an email to CP that she appreciates Facebook's apology. However, she stressed the fact that Facebook didn't feel the need to take action until after the issue was highlighted by major media outlets.

"Saying this was an accident is a joke! They sent me the post and said it specifically violated their community guidelines. Now they are saying they accidentally stated that and banned me for 10 days accidentally? No! It took a national news story to get my content returned to my page. What about the average Facebook user who doesn't have that luxury?" Johnston asked. "I am on a mission now to speak for them. I am receiving

messages, screenshots and evidence from all over the world which proves that Facebook's system for filtering and banning is punitive against conservatives and Christians."

"If Facebook needed time to review the post that someone complained about, then why didn't they simply delete my comment until they had time to review it?" Johnston continued. "Why did they punish me with a 10-day ban? This is damage control because my story hit mainstream media."

Johnston is not letting up on her claims that Facebook is censoring her account. Johnston started a thread on her Facebook page asking her over 78,000 followers to submit any information on how her page is being censored by Facebook.

"One person told me my videos had no 'share' buttons on them while everyone else's do," Johnston wrote. "Another woman just told me nothing happens when she clicks or shares my posts while she can share other people's posts."

One Facebook user wrote: "I had your page 'liked' before but I just went to it and it wasn't 'liked' so I re-liked it."

Johnston said that she understands that Facebook is a private company and does not have to uphold free speech standards.

"But here is where Americans are crying foul: Zuckerberg is saying Facebook is unbiased. But in reality, it appears he is using the platform to further his personal political, religious and globalist agenda," Johnston argued. "He is using Facebook as an ideological weapon and punishing those of us who



Target Sales into Rough Waters

The NFL doesn't have to look far to see where this kind of political pigheadedness leads. For the last 10 months, the Target company has taken a beating on Wall Street for racing to embrace the transgender movement. The backlash for opening their fitting rooms and restrooms to anyone has been so severe that executives are scrambling to stop the bleeding. After 1.5 million Americans joined the Target boycott first launched by American Family Association, the company has been racing to make up the deficits -- not just in their bank account, but in the public trust.

After Christmas (and a slew of missed projections), executives went back to the drawing board. Two months into the New Year,



nothing is working. In fact, the situation is so dire for the retailer that they've had to call off a major expansion in sales. "Target announced the end of two projects as the stock price hit \$64.77 at market close on February 8. That's down from \$83 when the

boycott began once the company made its transgender policy change on April 19. The stock price drop has slashed roughly \$10 billion from the company's value on Wall Street." The closure was so unexpected, Breitbart explains, that it "even caught the project's manager by surprise." Although the company tried to pass it off as a "normal ebb and flow of business," the reality is that they have nothing but their controversial bathroom policy to blame.

And financial experts agree. At Cabot Wealth Network, Crista Huff couldn't believe the company didn't know better than to pander to a tiny vocal minority. "I immediately knew that Target's revenue would drop be-

If you take 1.5 million people's consumer dollars away from Target, and direct most of those dollars toward their obvious rival, Wal-Mart, then yes, Wal-Mart is going to have an upside surprise in quarterly sales while Target's numbers disappoint." takeaway? Huff says, "My recommendation that shareholders sell [Target] stock and reinvest their capital into the stock of a company with strong earnings growth" - and, we would add,
