
A Word From the Heart

The current political and religious scene is unsettling. We have always known that the gospel message of salvation, in Jesus Christ, is seen as exclusive and narrow minded. The gospel message has emphasized "One way salvation" as well as living a life that honors our Savior. We have gone about our daily lives knowing that we can face hostility or rejection from Employers, education institutes, or political parties. Those who venture into the messy world of politics and the field of education understand they will face opposition because of their beliefs and personal convictions.

Their conscience can remain sensitive, although those who dislike what Christians believe will not allow them to even hold biblical convictions. The

Apostles warned us of allowing our conscience to grow insensitive to moral issues, as well as being molded into the dishonest and corrupt power grab of self interested people. The last few years have begun to clearly define what those in powers actually believe about men in office who hold biblical standards of living. Recent occurrences of this very issue have been troubling. A politician in England and leader of his party has been ousted by party members because he holds homosexuality is a sin. During a TV interview he was pressed to explain himself. The pressure became relentless when a news paper found an interview from 2007 that suggested he believed that abortion is wrong although this man was in agreement with many other views of his party. He stepped down as party leader saying "To be a political leader, in 2017, and to live as a committed Christian, to hold faithfully to the Bible's teaching has felt impossible" He added "I seem to have been the subject of suspicion because of what I believe and who my faith is in" (Wall Street Journal June 15,2017) The party welcomes believers insofar as religion can be useful to their political agenda. Meanwhile in the "land of the free and the home of the brave" a senator, who has been around Washington for years and has become popular and powerful, has relentlessly questioned a presidential nominee about his own Christian convictions. According to



the nominee, people who do know Jesus Christ as God's son and redeemer "do not know God". This is a basic Christian Doctrine teaching that faith in the God-Man is essential to salvation. The senator went further arguing that the nominee's views were Islamaphobic and hateful. The implication is that a devout Christian can't hold his faith's basic belief and serve in public office. Read the Constitution's Article VI. This important Article makes it clear that there is never to be a test of one's religion to hold a position in government. In England and here it appears that these men are asked not to live by their conscience. To disagree with someone's theology means that you hate them. Nonsense! What ought to be our answer to this destruction of our founding fathers document?

The answer to this is found in Paul's writing and especially in First Peter. Christians are not to give up their beliefs to Rome or any other ideas contrary to the Word of God they have learned and put to practice in their lives. The recipients of Peters epistle would need to be reminded of the work of God through the "precious blood of Christ." Peter reminds them that the new birth came to them through the Word of God and the power of the Holy Spirit. They must grow in the faith through the Word of God. That will mean allowing the bible to give them discernment regarding the world around them and the need for Christians not to change their lives and convictions.

If the above illustrations are of any importance to us it appears that the parties involved want to silence our voice and control our conscience. They want us to agree with them or stay out of the way. It seems to me they are asking godly moral people to stay out of the public square. As certain laws are added to the books of law we, as followers of Christ, might someday be held as law breakers. The wedding cake and flower store owners have already suffered under the weight of laws that ought not to have been written. Be strong in His Grace and the power of His might.

Queen Elizabeth Honors 'In Christ Alone' Author Keith Getty for 'Music and Modern Hymn Writing'

Nashville-based music artist, Keith Getty was honored as an "Officer of the Order of the British Empire" (OBE) by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The award, which commemorates Getty's contribution to "Music and Modern Hymn Writing," marks the first occasion that the award has been given to an individual involved in the world of contemporary church music.

Getty, along with collaborators including his wife, Kristyn, as well as Stuart Townend, has written over 60 of the most popular 2,000 hymns sung in the U.S. and United Kingdom, according to Christian Copyright Licensing International (CCLI). The Getty-Townend hymn, "In Christ Alone," is the #1 most popular hymn sung in the UK for the past nine years and is also among the top 10 in the USA. According to their publishers, it is estimated that over 100 million people sang this one hymn in the last 12 months. Getty-penned hymns are popular across all Christian denominations and their music has been performed at national celebrations in several countries as well as recorded by well-known artists.

Keith Getty says, "When I first received the call, I was shocked. As a Brit living in Amer-

ica it is an incredible gift to receive from home especially given the long history of the award and the legacy of individuals who have received it. It is also wonderful to see hymnody and the great hymn-writing heritage I am from in the U.K. be recognized in this way. I am very grateful to her Majesty the Oueen for this honor."

Beyond just their work as hymn writers, Keith and Kristyn Getty have spent the last decade as ambassadors of the genre, leading a worldwide revival of congregational hymn singing.

Together with their band, the Gettys have performed at such notable venues as Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center in Washington, DC, and London's Royal Albert Hall. With performances for world leaders such as former US President George W. Bush and former South Korean President Lee Myungbak, some 200,000 people have also seen their annual Irish Christmas concert, which was also aired on American public television to more than 45 million homes.

Getty continues, "I'm so grateful to my wife Kristyn and also profoundly thankful for Stuart Townend, whose hymn writing part-



nership gave us both this opportunity. It has been thrilling to see the impact of these hymns around the world. Kristyn and I feel utterly privileged to be able to serve the church in such a way and will continue to write and lead people in singing as we have breath to."

On June 25, the Gettys led their second Global Hymn Sing (www.globalhymnsing.com). The Gettys' 2016 hymn sing resulted in more than 1.1 million congregants in 5400-plus churches in 100 countries around the world joining together in song.

Later this year, Keith and Kristyn launch their Sing! campaign with their first book, Sing! How Worship Transforms Your Life, Family, and Church, will be published internationally and first Sing! conference in Nashville. (www.gettymusicworshipconference.com).



Justin Bieber Shares Rich Wilkerson Sermon, Says 'This is What I Believe'

Justin Bieber has once again proclaimed his Christian faith by sharing a sermon from Rich Wilkerson, Jr. on the importance of trusting in God and not in man, fame, or earthly riches.

Over the weekend, the 23-yearold "Despacito" singer shared a screenshot of Wilkerson, lead pastor of Vous Church, Miami, FL, and a link to a sermon, entitled "Life in the Wheelbarrow."

"If anyone wishes to check out what I believe the link is in my bio," the singer captioned the photo.

In the sermon, Wilkerson, lead pastor of VOUS Church, Miami, FL, said, "Sometime, we get seduced by success...and think it'll lead to a place of contentment. But, can I remind you...contentment is not found in a place; it's only found in a person, and his name is Jesus Christ. What is it today that you keep putting your trust in that keeps leaving you in trouble?"

The "Rich in Faith" star said that when he looks at the world today, it's "riddled with doubt and insecurity and fear."

"I believe that Jesus gives you the answer," he said. 'Jesus said, 'Don't let your hearts be troubled - in fact, he's commanding us here - do not worry. That sounds like a direct command from Jesus."

"Worry doesn't change anything," he added. "What if trust is the remedy to your trouble? What if trusting in Jesus is the answer to every one of your problems? Trust. What is it you're putting your confidence in today? What is it you're putting your trust in?"

The pastor said that people will never bring true satisfaction: "You can think it's your job and your money and your status and your Instagram account. I'm telling you, that stuff will go away," he said. "You need to have something bigger, something deeper - you need a firm foundation, a solid rock. His name is Jesus."

The sermon was part of Vous' annual conference, this year titled "In God We Trust."

"Trusting God doesn't always feel sturdy and safe," reads the sermon description. "At times, we might even wonder what we got ourselves into, but when we place our trust in Jesus, he gives us a vision, direction, and constant companionship. These things allow us to go on the journey with a sense of confidence and peace, knowing that while we aren't exactly sure how, we're going to safely cross to the other side of any trial we may face."

Wilkerson's sermon mirrors a sentiment Bieber made back in 2015, when the singer opened up about the dangers of worshiping people like himself instead of the One who truly deserves praise.

"I would really suggest to people, 'Don't put your faith in me,'" Bieber said. "Because I'm gonna disappoint you every time. Yeah. It's scary. But I want them to know that I'm not going to be able to solve their problems... I'm not that higher power. I'll never be. I'm not perfect. I've made so many mistakes. I just want to get to a place where... I just want people to know humans aren't meant to be worshiped. We're just not. So when a human is being worshiped, this is dangerous. 'Cause it does nothing but give you pride."

Along with Wilkerson, Bieber has made friendships with other well-known Evangelical pastors, including Judah Smith of The City Church in Seattle, Washington, and Carl Lentz of Hillsong Church in New York City, New York.

NRB APPLAUDS DECISIVE RELIGIOUS FREEDOM VICTORY AT SUPREME COURT

The U.S. Supreme Court delivered a decisive 7-2 ruling in favor of religious freedom recently. In a much anticipated decision to resolve Trinity Lutheran Church of Columbia v. Comer, the justices did not disappoint. Writing for the court, Chief Justice John Roberts said "the exclusion of Trinity Lu-



theran from a public benefit for which it is otherwise qualified, solely because it is a church, is odious to our Constitution."

Dr. Jerry A. Johnson, NRB President & CEO, praised the ruling and called it "yet another breath of fresh air for those who value faith and freedom." He hopes it will strengthen the message to government officials that they "must respect, not bully, people of faith."

This case featured a Missouri church-run preschool that was discriminated against in a public playground re-surfacing program by the state of Missouri solely because it is a religious entity. Even though the preschool ranked as a highly qualified candidate for a grant under the program's rules, the state cited a provision in its constitution – known as a Blaine Amendment – that prohibited it from supplying aid to a religion.

Pro-Basketball-Player-Turned-Pastor David Chadwick on How to Be Great In God's Eyes

Pro-basketball-player-turned-pastor David Chadwick is concerned about the way our culture defines greatness.

As a former member of the 1969 NCAA Final Four Basketball Team who played for legendary College Basketball Hall of Famer Coach Dean Smith at UNC-Chapel Hill from 1968-71, Chadwick is all too familiar with the damaging effects of buying into the world's idea of success.

"When I played basketball and I would make headlines and get a lot of attention, pride would fill my heart and make me feel like I was bullet proof, "he shared in an exclusive interview with The Gospel Herald. "When you place yourself on those pedestals and accept the world's applause, you're very vulnerable to a heavy fall. That's what happened in my life. Once basketball was no longer a part of my life and that god was eliminated from me, I didn't know where to turn. That time of pride in my own efforts only set me up for the fall that soon happened thereafter."

Thankfully, God had bigger plans for Chadwick's life: "The Lord met me in my desperation, and that's when I discovered His grace, mercy and kindness, "he said. "The best call of all was to play on God's team."

Today, Chadwick has MDiv and DMin degrees from Columbia Theological Seminary and pastors Forest Hill Church in Charlotte, North Carolina. In his latest book, From Superficial To Significant: What It Means To Become Great In God's Eyes, Chadwick uses stories from his time as a pro-basketball player to explore issues of faith, redemption, sin and grace.


"Coach Smith taught about the fundamentals being so important in basketball, and how practicing them over and over again is what leads to a successful individual and team, "Chadwick told GH. "Similarly, throughout the Bible, there are fundamentals in the Christian faith that define greatness from God's standpoint."

The book is available for purchase. Below is the exclusive interview with David Chadwick.

GH: Tell us about your background as a pro basketball player and how coach Dean Smith influenced you.

DC: I had the privilege of playing for Coach Dean Smith, who is considered one of the world's greatest coaches ever; he won two national championships at UNC and an Olympic gold medal. I played three years in the European professional league after playing for Coach Smith, and then I felt God's call to the ministry. Oftentimes, I reflect on how Coach Smith taught me about how

the team is more important than the individual; how it's important that you persevere through difficult times; how you need to sacrifice for the sake of the whole team. All of those great principles he taught me are applicable to life, ministry, and biblical truth. He had a profound impact on my life and I'm greatly thankful to God for giving me the opportunity of playing under him.



DC: As a minister of a local church for 37 years in Charlotte NC - and I've seen it grow from 100 members to now over 6,000 - I've been very concerned with how our culture defines greatness. In many ways, we've become like world has in sporting events; we have the top 25 college football or basketball teams - that's where we've gone with the church. Far too often, we define greatness in numbers instead of defining greatness as God defines it, and that is in faithfulness.

Through this book, I want readers to see the superficiality of the Christian faith in our culture that many of us have fallen prey to; a "prosperity gospel " that believes it's all about us. That's not what the gospel is all about; it's all about the Lord. I want people to move from the superficiality of the spirituality of so many Christians in America to a depth of discipling under the Lord that will allow them to make disciples of other people. The Lord's call upon our lives is not just information, it's transformation.

GH: In your book, you lay out ten fundamentals in the Christian faith that define greatness from God's standpoint. Can you touch upon a few of these fundamentals and their importance in advancing the kingdom of God?

DC: Absolutely. Everything in the book is built on the gospel, because it does begin there.

The first one is the "Great Exchange" which is basically the gospel, it's the great trade that God has made with us; we give Him our sinfulness and unrighteousness, and He exchanges to us His perfect righteousness in Jesus and what He did on the cross.

Another one would be the "Great Reversal" - the last will be first and the first will be



last. God abhors pride; that's what makes people last in His eyes. But, He thinks people are great when we choose humility, when we choose to acknowledge that everything we have comes as a free gift from Him.

Finally, the "Great Commandment," which I divided into two chapters, the first one being that we're great in God's eyes when we

learn to place Him first. The second chapter is that we love God by loving that which He loves the most, which is our neighbor as ourselves. When we love God and love our neighbor, we are great in God's sight.

GH: What are some dangers associated with accepting the world's definition of greatness?

DC: It's a shallow understanding of greatness. The world says "I'm great when I posses, when I have have, when I hoard, when I succeed and I get all that self-exaltation." That's the root to separation from God, the unwillingness to admit that I'm a sinner. It's saying, "I'm strong", so you're never weak to understand His sufficiency. When you realize true greatness in His eyes, that's when you say, "I'm nothing, He's everything. "Then you can live as a servant, not a superstar. That's when you can ready yourself to hear the most precious words that God could ever speak to you, and that is - "Well done, my good and faithful servant."

GH: You talk a lot about the damaging effects of pride. How can one overcome pride?

DC: The first thing to do is, when your feet hit the floor every morning, begin the day with this prayer: "Thank you, Lord, for another day. It's a total gift from you. "Then, throughout the day think about your next breath, the food you eat, the clothes on your back, the car you drive, the family and friends - all of those are gifts from God. When you realize everything in life is a gift, you operate in humility and you live each day with a recognition of that giftedness.

Also, apologize to your spouse when you offend them - even though it's not easy. Before every meal, bow your head and give thanks to God and say, "I recognize that everything I have before me is a gift from You. " When you continually practice these tips, they become habit. By expressing humility, you defeat the poison of pride.



Evangelist to Launch 50,000 Teenagers to Share Gospel, Believes Great Revival Coming

Teens today face a host of challenges that were unimaginable to past generations, especially as the culture now even calls into question what it means to be male or female. But one Colorado evangelist is not deterred and is empowering tens of thousands of them with the Gospel.

"Henry David Thoreau said that 'for every thousand hacking at the leaves of evil, one strikes at the root," Greg Stier, founder of Dare 2 Share, told The Christian Post. "What I tell people is that it really is a sin issue, and we need to attack that and the only thing that can attack that, just as in our lives, is the Gospel of Christ."

"And so if I meet somebody who is transgender, I share the Gospel. I don't deal with the transgender issue" right then, he said.

Stier believes Christians oftentimes "do it backwards" by dealing with and trying to fix the issues in trying to "win our culture back." But it can't be done through "polemic debate or through politics," he stressed.

"The way we are going to win our culture back is we're going reach the next generation, and we're going to disciple the next generation, give them a renewed heart and renewed mind," he said. "And then, guess what? That will filter down into the moral fiber of our nation and it will filter into our politics."

And that's what Stier has been doing for the last 25 years through Dare 2 Share. Thus far, through training events and resources for youth ministers, Dare 2 Share has empowered over a million teens to be bold in their faith.

Stier, who resides in Denver, started the youth organization with the belief that teenagers are powerful and can change the world. They just need to be unleashed.

Stier was raised in a troubled home in a rough urban environment, never knew his biological father, and had an extremely dysfunctional family. But a preacher from the Denver suburbs reached out to one of his toughest uncles and after that his family "fell like dominoes" in coming to Christ. Stier got involved with the youth ministry led by this pastor who saw it as essential to raise up teenagers to share the Gospel.

"They believed that teens came to Christ quicker and shared the Gospel faster," he recalled, noting that even as a young teenager he felt equipped enough to navigate any Gospel question.

"And it wasn't because I was exceptional, it was because we were all equipped and trained and inspired by this pastor and our youth leaders to share the Gospel now."

That same vision and passion to evangelize would give birth to Dare 2 Share. Because he saw his local community transformed by the Gospel he dared to dream bigger, believing that this could happen all over the nation and the world.

On September 23, Dare 2 Share will host a simulcast event called Dare 2 Share LIVE and dozens of churches across the U.S. have already signed up to host local gatherings.

The day-long event will include local worship bands alongside recording artists Tenth Avenue North and rapper Propaganda.

In each city, teens will have outreach to do that day — including collecting food and sharing their faith with social media utilities — and will learn how to open discussion about their faith. Dare 2 Share LIVE will allow the organization to reach more teens in one day than they typically can in a whole year. They are aiming for 50,000 teens to begin at least 300,000 faith conversations, all while serving their communities in a practical way.

Already, Dare 2 Share LIVE is being saturated in prayer and Stier is asking as many people as possible to join in intercession "that God would strike the nation with revival on September 23." He has his clock set for 9:23 a.m. and 9:23 p.m. every day to pray.

"What I tell people is that we can't manufacture revival but we can put in the plumbing and ask God to turn on the faucet," he said.

Stier's efforts to raise up youth to minister has several precedents in American religious history.

He explained to CP that the First Great Awakening with George Whitefield and John Wesley, the Second Great Awakening with D.L. Moody, the YMCA, and The Salvation Army were all heavily comprised of young people.

In fact, young people being on the edge of great moves of God goes back even farther.

"If you look at Jesus, I'm convinced that most of his disciples were teenagers," Stier said.

In Matthew 17:24-27, Peter, Jesus, and his disciples all go on to Capernaum but only Peter and Jesus pay the temple tax.

"If you cross-reference that with Exodus 30:14, the temple tax was for those 20 years old and older. So if I'm reading that right, Jesus was a youth leader with one adult sponsor."

And once empowered by the Holy Spirit, that group of young people were unstoppable, he said, a theme he unpacks in his book Gospelize Your Youth Ministry.

When Stier speaks with postmodern teenagers who do not know Christ they find



the Gospel intriguing, especially when it is framed as a relationship with God and not a dry religion; it is a love story of God taking our sin upon Himself in Jesus that we might know Him, he says.

And when people come to the Lord and the Holy Spirit begins to dwell in them, they are regenerated and He begins a process of transformation, Stier explained. Followers of Jesus have to allow time for that process to unfold.

Stier added that it is vitally important for evangelistic efforts to be coupled with discipleship and the best person to disciple a new Christian is the one who led him or her to Christ.

"The one that leads them to Christ is the one who grows them in Christ," he explained.

Yet he believes an even larger shift needs to take place.

"We've taken the onus of evangelism and discipleship from the people and we've put it on the professionals," he said.

"And the work of youth ministry is evangelism and disciple-making."

The Reformation transformed the world when the Word of God became more widely accessible and got into the hands of common people through the Gutenberg printing press, he said, and another reformation will occur when the work of God gets into the hands of His people.
