The Ark Encounter Will be Permanently Lit with Rainbow Lights

Answers in Genesis founder Ken Ham has announced the ministry's Noah's Arkthemed park will now be permanently lit up with rainbow lights as

a reminder that God owns the rainbow - not the LGBT community.

On Facebook, Ham shared a photo of The Ark Encounter in Williamstown, Ky. lit up in red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet.

"We now have new permanent rainbow lights at the Ark Encounter so all can see that it is God's rainbow and He determines its meaning in Genesis 6," Ham captioned the photo.

He explained that the rainbow is a reminder that "God will never again judge the wickedness of man with a global Flood-next time the world will be judged by fire."

"The Ark is lit permanently at night with a rainbow to remind the world that God owns it and He decreed it's a sign of His covenant with man after the Flood-Christians need to take back the rainbow as we do at the Ark Encounter," Ham said.



"Sadly, people ignore what God intended the rainbow to represent and proudly wave rainbow-colored flags in defiance of God's command and design for

marriage," Ham wrote. "Because of this, many Christians shy away from using the rainbow colors.... As Christians, we need to take the rainbow back and teach our young people its true meaning."

"The chasm between what's obviously Christian - what the Bible actually teaches - and what culture teaches has widened," he said. "America used to be very christianized in its worldview as a culture. Now, there's a big separation."

Part of the problem lies with the Church, Ham said, as many pastors and religious leaders "water down" the truth of the gospel and compromise God's word to "fit in" with culture.

He added, "We're on the precipice of catastrophic change in this nation. In fact, I believe it's already happening. Romans 1 talks about the wrath of God being revealed against unrighteousness, that God turns those who reject Him over to their depraved minds. I believe we're seeing Romans 1 play out in our culture right before our eyes.



A Word From the Heart

A Christian has to live in two worlds. One, of course, is the world of work, trial and sin. We do not always like this world and do not feel very comfortable in it. Not only do we face an inner battle but must face the misunderstandings of the world around us. One moment we feel close to the Lord and at another we feel lust, envy and are dissatisfied with our lot in life. We hate to admit it but most of the things that we count precious are material things. It may be what we possess, such as cars, homes and savings. It may be relationships and even family. Our families are of great value to us. But when we suffer loss of any of them, we naturally, hurt. We might even think that the things we value the most have been taken from us and might well question God's concern for our well be-



ing. That reaction often causes us to feel like spiritual failures and we feel guilty.

The other world we must live in, if we are to live like Christians, is the spiritual world. That means I must learn to look at the things that are not seen not just the things I can see. I will be the first to admit that it is easier said than done .But no matter how hard it is, we must learn to value spiritual things or suffer much spiritual anguish.

Spend some time in First Peter. The believers were suffering the loss of goods and life by a hostile government. Peter's letter does not give a false hope of better times. His one goal is to lift their hearts above the pain of loss to the riches they have in Christ. To encourage them in God's program. To focus their attention on things of real value. Four times in this letter Peter uses the word precious. That is, of course, things that ought to be of great value to us. In 1:7 Peter says that the trial of our faith is more precious than the gold that perishes. How in the world can the trial of faith be precious? Trials bring us closer to the Lord. They help us focus on the real issues of life. They lift our hearts above this world and help us realize that we are saved so that we can one day be in our Lord's glorious kingdom. Do not see trials as intrusions, but as God's way of drawing close to us.

In 1:19 Peter says that we are saved by the precious blood of Christ. Why ought the blood of Christ be of great value to us? Because we are saved. His blood paid for all our sins and has brought us into

an eternal relationship with the Father. No matter what happens here we come to Christ to be healthy or wealthy then you might not find the blood of Christ precious. He has not saved us just to make life prosperous and enjoyable. No one can rob us of the precious blood of Christ.

In 2:4 Peter says that Christ is precious to God. It is through Christ that God has reconciled man to himself. As the imperial power fades, God is building a kingdom. Things in this world collapse. We are part of a lasting kingdom and important members. In 2:7 Peter reminds us that Christ is precious to those who believe. To some he is worthless. They do not find Him fit to build anything in their lives. But to those who believe He is worth more than anything the world can offer. As we get to know Him, He is more and more precious to us.

NFL Great Tony Dungy Applauds Ben Watson for Calling Abortion 'Ultimate Form of Racism'



National Football League hall-of-famer Tony Dungy has "applauded" Baltimore Ravens tight end Benjamin Watson, an outspoken Christian, for his widely read comments opposing abortion and Planned Parenthood. "I applaud my brother @BenjaminSWatson for speaking the truth on a controversial issue. Thank you," Dungy's tweet reads.

Dungy was responding to a tweet posted by pro-life activist group Live Action, which published an article summarizing comments that Watson made last summer in an interview with the pro-life Turning Point Pregnancy Resource center. In the interview, Watson did not hold back in communicating what he thinks of Planned Parenthood, the nation's largest abortion provider which kills over 300,000 unborn babies each year.

In the interview, Watson went into great detail about how race plays a role when it comes to the issue of abortion and pointed out that Planned Parenthood was founded by Margaret Sanger, who is often accused of being a racist and eugenicist.

DC's Museum of the Bible

Museum of the Bible, the 430,000-square-foot museum opening on Nov. 17 just three blocks from the U.S. Capitol, announced today it will not charge a fee for general admission. Similar to the admission policies of other museums, such as the Metropolitan Museum of Art and the American Museum of Natural History, Museum of the Bible will instead suggest a \$15 donation, with guests under no obligation to pay anything. Museum of the Bible will also offer guests the ability to reserve timed-entry tickets.

"Our mission is to invite all people to engage with the Bible," said Museum of the Bible President Cary Summers. "We can think of no more fundamental way to give people access to the treasures and experiences inside this museum than to offer public admission coupled with the ability to reserve timed-entry tickets."

The museum will comprise eight floors, including expansive exhibit and gallery space, visiting libraries and temporary exhibit space, a restaurant and biblical garden, a performing arts theater, a grand ballroom, and event space. In total, the museum's immense amount of content could take the average person many days to view.



Museum of the Bible has been recognized by CNN as one of the most anticipated and beautifully designed museums opening in 2017; by Smithsonian.com as one of the "must-see" museums opening this year; and by Forbes as one of the top 100 nonprofits in the U.S. Other national media attention around the opening of the museum has come from Time, The Washington Post, The New York Times, Fox News and many other media organizations.





Pastors Launch Christian Alternative to Facebook

A new social media platform has been started by Christians who were banned from Facebook.

According to The Christian Post, the new Christian alternative to Facebook is called SocialCross.org. It was started by a group of pastors who were suspended multiple times from Facebook for posting unpopular thoughts and opinions on LGBT issues.

The pastors hope that the new social networking platform will be a place for Christians to freely express their beliefs and engage in conversations without fearing backlash.

SocialCross launched three weeks ago, and has thus far gained 2,300 users.

"This is a place where we can all come together as people who believe in Christ who want to share with one another and learn from each other and do so without an environment of fear of having people report our post or Facebook blocking us for 30 days," said the website's co-founder, Rich Penkoski, a West Virginia-based preacher and cofounder of the online ministry Warriors for Christ.



Penkoski was spurred on to create Social-Cross after his Facebook account was banned for 30 days on multiple occasions. Once, it was banned because Penkoski said he would ban anyone who posted the rainbow flag emoji on his ministry's Facebook page.

"The whole idea is that it's a Christian site, run by Christians, designed by Christians and based on biblical principles," Penkoski explained. "But anybody and their brother can join so long as they understand that we are a Christian site run by Christians."

He added that "LGBT members are welcome so long as they are not going to try to cram that garbage down our throats. If you want to come and ask honest questions and have honest dialogue, you are more than welcome. But if the goal is to comment and force their lifestyle on others, that is not going to be allowed."

Trump Administration Expands International Pro-Life Policy

One of President Donald Trump's first official actions in January was to put back into effect the Mexico City Policy. That rule, first instituted by President Ronald Reagan, is intended to block U.S. taxpayer money from aiding family planning programs abroad run by non-governmental organizations (NGOs) that perform or promote abortion. In his executive order, President Trump also directed the Secretary of State to determine how to extend that policy to "global health assistance furnished by all departments or agencies."

In compliance with the President's directive, the State Department announced a "Protecting Life in Global Health Assistance" plan applying the Mexico City Policy's pro-life requirement to a much broader set of "global health assistance" funding, including U.S. programs to address HIV/ AIDS, maternal and child health, malaria, global health security, and reproductive health.

While the previous policy, which had been rescinded during the Obama and Clinton administrations, governed a pool of about half

a billion dollars, the Trump administration's new rule will now safeguard nearly nine billion dollars.

In a Daily Signal column, Rep. Chris Smith (R-N.J.), a champion for human life and human dignity who chairs the Global Health Subcommittee of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, said:



For years, pro-abortion organizations have used U.S. taxpayer funds to weaken, undermine, or reverse pro-life laws in other nations and systematically destroy the precious lives of unborn children. Scores of countries throughout the world have been besieged by aggressive and well-funded campaigns to overturn their pro-life laws and

policies. The Protecting Life in Global Health Assistance policy will significantly mitigate U.S. taxpayer complicity in global abortion.

Significantly, the new rule does not reduce the amount of funding designated for global health programs. Rather, it simply ensures abortion activists are not subsidized by those American taxpayer dollars.

D. James Kennedy Ministries Files Defamation Suit against Southern Poverty Law Center

D. James Kennedy Ministries (DJKM) filed suit in the United States District Court against the Southern Poverty Law Center (SPLC) on Wednesday – just days after CNN put the spotlight on a controversial, discredited report by the organization that puts the "hate group" label on many conservative Christian organizations that are not hate groups.

"We embarked today on a journey to right a terrible wrong," said Dr. Frank Wright, DJKM's President & Chief Executive Officer, in announcing the filed suit. "Those who knowingly label Christian ministries as 'hate' groups, solely for subscribing to the historic Christian faith, are either woefully uninformed or willfully deceitful. In the case of the Southern Poverty Law Center, our lawsuit alleges the latter."

The DJKM lawsuit alleges, among other things, that the SPLC illegally trafficked in false and misleading descriptions of the services offered by DJKM and committed defamation against DJKM arising from the publication and distribution of false information that libels the ministry's reputation and subjects the ministry to disgrace, ridicule, odium, and contempt in the estimation of the public.

On August 18, CNN published SPLC's list of "hate groups," displaying the location of each on a map. While CNN indicated within the article that the data on "hate groups" is from the SPLC, the original headline on the story did not note the source. That headline was later changed to cite SPLC. The story was also updated to provide direct links to the full list from the SPLC as opposed to publishing the entire list, and context was added regarding some groups who oppose their inclusion on the SPLC list, including the American Family Association, which shot back at CNN for its lack of journalistic integrity.

"CNN's citing of the SPLC underscores why many Americans don't trust CNN for honest reporting," said AFA President Tim Wildmon in a statement. "The Southern Poverty Law Center has been widely discredited over the years because of

its false labeling of Christian organizations as 'hate groups.' In fact, the Obama administration's Department of Justice quietly reprimanded SPLC and its attorneys because their conduct 'overstepped the bounds of zealous advocacy and was unprofessional.' CNN has further proven to be an illegitimate news source that lacks journalistic integrity."

In his statement Wednesday, Wright said, SPLC's "false and illegal characterizations have a chilling effect on the free exercise of religion and on religious free speech for all people of faith."

"After having given the SPLC an opportunity to retract, we have undertaken this legal action, seeking a trial by a jury of our peers, to preserve our own rights under the law and to defend the religious free speech rights of all Americans," he concluded.

In related news, late last month, Senator James Lankford (R-Okla.) called out ABC News for irresponsibly parroting SPLC's "hate group" label when identifying Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF). Reporting on a speaking engagement of U.S. Attorney General Jeff Sessions, ABC called ADF an "anti-LGBT hate group" in its headline and article text. The article also linked to SPLC's page attacking ADF.

In a letter to ABC President James Goldston, Lankford rebuked the network and defended ADF as "peaceful" and "reputable." "I found it odd that ABC would designate ADF as a hate group not based on any actual crime or action, but apparently based on their belief in religious liberty or traditional MES marriage," he stated.

KENNEDY MINISTRIES Similar criticism was levied against an NBC affiliate in Ari-

zona for its story, "What are Arizona's hate groups?" which relied entirely on SPLC's accusations.

"12 News, an NBC affiliate, and The Arizona Republic have committed journalistic malpractice," said ADF Legal Counsel and Director of Communications Kerri Kupec in a statement, noting also the publishing of SPLC's list by Arizona's largest daily newspaper, which is part of the USA Today Network.

"SPLC spends its time and money attacking veterans, nuns, Muslims who oppose terrorism, Catholics, Evangelicals, and anyone else who dares disagree with its far-left ideology. Meanwhile, ADF works every day to peacefully preserve and affirm free speech and the free exercise of religion for people from all walks of life and all backgrounds, because we believe freedom is for everyone," she added.

ADF has called on 12 News, The Arizona Republic, and ABC to issue an apology to them and retract their defamatory stories.

In his letter to ABC, Sen. Lankord emphasized the responsibility of those with powerful voices in the public square to take care in the words they use. Lankford said that "disagreement is not the same as discrimination and it's not the same as hate." He warned, "Labeling ADF a 'hate group' feeds into a narrative that the news media frequently editorializes beyond the facts. This ultimately harms American trust in the press."
