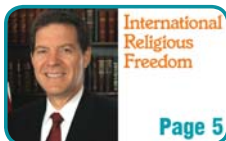

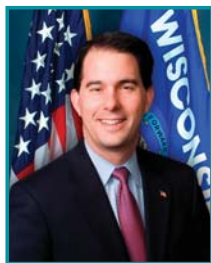

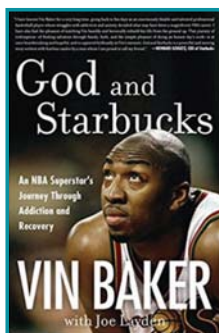
their tickets early as the event is always sold out (see page 5 for order form).

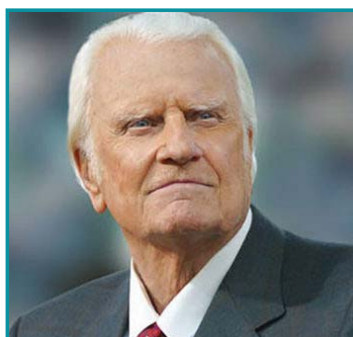

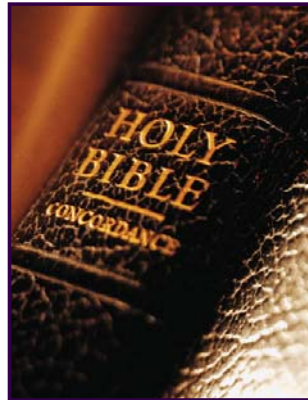
A Word From the Heart

I am sure we would consider the Apostle Paul a busy man. He had plans to travel to unknown territory to advance the gospel among those who had not yet heard the message of God's grace. The care of the churches was a daily burden. He wrote letters to problem churches, he helped guide teams of coworkers, and was always involved with those who sought his spiritual insights. He was concerned about the possible loss of troubled local churches. The loss of a church would make his efforts seem in vain. I do not see Paul so driven to success and the praises of man that he became sloppy with his spiritual goals. In second Corinthians 5:9-10 the apostle says "We make it our aim...to be well pleasing to Him".

What is your aim in life? Not every believer is ambitious for the Lord. Do you want success in business? The esteem of your peers? Is your desire for successful ministry for Jesus Christ? No matter what your goal in life is, if you are a believer in Jesus Christ it ought to be "well pleasing to Him". But that is where the difficulty lies. If we would put as much energy into christian living and service as we do in politics, sports or business, the gospel would make a greater impact in the world.

Because Paul believed he would give an account to God he was ambitious to be well pleasing to the Lord. It is not just because of the judgment seat of Christ but for our lives at any stage, time or place. How can we prepare for the Judgment Seat of Christ? In second Corinthians 5:11-12 Paul mentions the word conscience. He wants a clear conscience. While he sought to serve he realized the need to watch how he did things as well as the motives that drove him. Are



we acting according to Godly principles? Does your conscience testify of Godly Sincerity?

We are not to depend on the praises of men. To live for the praise of people will not win the Lord's praises at the Judgement seat of Christ. Paul did not go out of his way to offend or ignore others opinions. He shows a great sensitivity to others scruples. At the same time he was far more concerned about ignoring God then to receive man's praises. Paul ignored the criticisms of others. His enemies said he was out of touch with the world and out of his mind. He would not use all of the world's methods or accept their world view because they might be unworthy of God even though others might approve. His spiritual life would influence what he did and how he did it. Not only

is the political madness of the time begging for our acceptance and involvement but it is tell us that our lives and message for Christ are worthless. Our vice president stated a simple and clear principle of moral conduct and has been ridiculed by people who have no idea what he is talking about. Their minds and consciences are polluted by sin. In 1948, when the Billy Graham team realized God was blessing them, they joined together and laid out a series of resolutions or commitment among themselves of biblical morality and integrity so that God's word would be preached with power. Look up and read the Modesto manifesto. They knew what God's work said and what God wanted of them. They followed that all through the years of success. That is the same principle our vice president spoke of.

If we will look beyond our present goals to that day of judgment we will seek to make our lives pleasing to Him. That is true ambition.

Mike Pence Says His Children Gave Lives to Christ at Billy Graham Crusade

Vice President Mike Pence remembered the life of Billy Graham and shared how two of his children embraced Christianity thanks to the ministry of the late evangelist.

During a speech delivered on Tuesday at the National Religious Broadcasters' 75th annual meeting in Nashville, Pence praised Graham, who died at age 99, as a "man of towering faith."

"He was an example and his ministry for the Gospel and his matchless voice inspired our nation and the world," Pence said, adding that Graham's message was "consistent throughout his life."

In 1999, Pence, his wife, and his three children attended one of Graham's crusades in Indianapolis, Indiana.

"I'll never forget that night," he said. "I put my faith in Jesus Christ as a young man in college. But when our kids came along, Karen and I wanted our young family to hear Billy lead."

The family watched as Graham gave a "stirring" presentation of the Gospel, and just as "Just as I Am" started playing, Pence's 8-year-old son and 6-year-old daughter headed to the floor of the arena along with thousands of others to give their lives to Christ.

"My wife holding my youngest turned to me and said, 'go after them!'" Pence recalled. "My son looked up at me with those big brown eyes and said, 'Dad, I want to go down.' And so, we went. We prayed with a volunteer pastor."

That prayer, Pence said, forever changed the lives of his children. Today, Pence's daughter is a writer in Los Angeles and his son is a lieutenant in the U.S. Army.

Pence pointed out that Graham is the first person to lie in honor in the U.S. Capitol in over a decade. President Donald Trump and members of Congress paid their respects to Graham at the Capitol.

"Thank you, Billy Graham, and God bless you," Pence said. "The debt this country owes Billy Graham can only be repaid by relentless imitation of his example, which I know is what all of you will continue to do, because that's what NRB members have been doing with distinction for 75 years."

The NRB Convention is held annually and is attended by those in the field of Christian communications.

Pence stressed to Christian communicators that their ministry and message "are needed now more than ever before."

"Every day, every hour, you speak strength to the heart of the American people. You shape our country. You water the roots of this nation," he said, noting that they have the power to "strengthen the character of this nation."

Pro-life activist group Operation Rescue announced last week that U.S. President Donald Trump has won its 2017 Pro-Life Person of the Year Malachi Award for his work in "protecting the pre-born."

"Operation Rescue is grateful Pres. Trump for having the courage to keep promises made during the campaign that provide greater protections for the pre-born and deny Federal funds from those who commit abortions," said Operation Rescue

President Troy Newman in the press release.

"He has proven to be the most pro-life president we have had in modern history and has backed up his pro-life rhetoric with action like no other before him."

MARYLAND CITY TO CHURCH: STOP WORSHIP SERVICES OR LEAVE

ADF attorneys file suit against city of Laurel for discriminatory zoning practices. Alliance Defending Freedom attorneys filed a federal lawsuit Friday on behalf of a church against the city of Laurel, Maryland, after officials changed zoning laws to stop the church from holding Sunday worship services and serving the underprivileged in the community.

Anne Graham Lotz Event Draws 500,000 in India; Multitudes Accept Jesus as Savior

Evangelist Anne Graham Lotz drew close to 500,000 people at a prayer event in India earlier this month. And at a separate gathering of 10,000, almost "every hand" went up when people were asked if they want to receive Jesus Christ as Savior, her ministry reported.

According to Vicki Bentley, a member of AnGeL Ministries Board who traveled with Lotz to India, there were advertisements all over the city of Hyderabad for the second annual "National Day of Prayer," which Lotz was a speaker at.

Local organizers helped put together the large gathering, with thousands of people arriving on trains, buses, and other forms of transportation from the countryside as well.

AnGeL Ministries noted that according to police estimates, as many as 500,000 people in total attended the prayer call.

"Anne preached on Daniel the prophet. She explained from Daniel 9 that 'one man, who knew God and prayed, moved heaven and changed a nation.' Then she challenged those present to pray as Daniel did," Bentley recounted.

"As far as the eye could see and beyond, people cried out to heaven, agreeing together as Anne led in prayer for personal and national revival."

The Hindu website also reported that "five lakh believers," which is equal to 500,000 people, were expected to attend the State and National prayer meeting on January 5.

The meeting was organized by the Christian Council of Telangana, which brought together bishops from different denominations, including the Roman Catholic Church, Church of South India and Methodist churches.

On another day, Lotz joined a worship gathering in the countryside, where over 450 churches had participated.

"Over 10,000 crowded inside an open air tent with thousands more outside, all listening with rapt attention as Anne shared from John 14: Hope for the New Year. Young and old, male and female, children and adults, all sat quietly, taking in every word," Bentley described.

"When the invitation was given to place their faith in Jesus as Savior a virtual sea of hands went up. It looked as though every hand in



the audience was raised. Many came into the kingdom for the first time while many others were renewed in their sure hope."

The minority Christian faith has continued growing in India over the past several years, but they have faced significant persecution at the hands of Hindu radicals.

Persecution watchdog group Open Doors ranked the country as the 11th worst place in the world for Christians in its 2018 World Watch List.

International Religious Freedom Ambassador Confirmed



The U.S. Senate confirmed the nomination of Kansas Governor Sam Brownback for the post of U.S. Ambassador-at-Large for International Religious Freedom.

Dr. Jerry A. Johnson, president & CEO of National Religious Broadcasters, who had previously encouraged the White House to move quickly to fill this pivotal position, welcomed the vote. "Governor Brownback is a tried and true hero in the defense of the dignity of every person, including every individual's inalienable right to religious freedom," said Johnson. "President Trump made an excellent choice as Sam Brownback not only has the commitment, but also the

skill and the will to advance respect for our nation's first freedom at the highest levels abroad."

Among others welcoming Brownback's confirmation was former Rep. Frank Wolf (R-Va.), who authored the 1998 law establishing the International Religious Freedom Office at the U.S. State Department. Calling international religious freedom "fundamental to our identity as Americans and also essential to our national security," Wolf added, "In Sam Brownback, we have a leader who not only understands the intricacies of Capitol Hill, he has a heart and the demonstrated passion for the mission of this office."

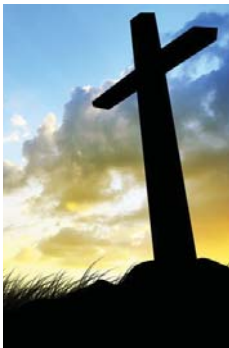

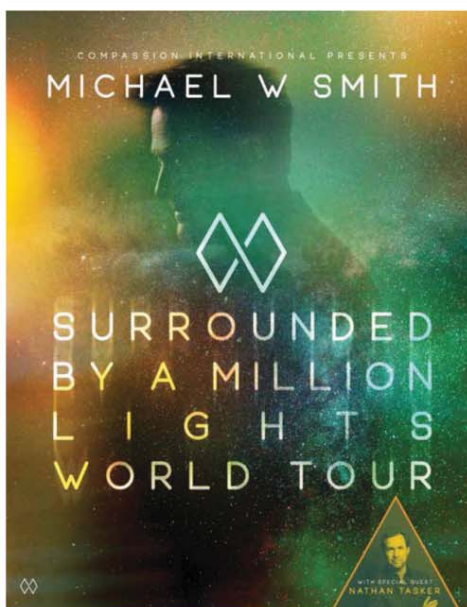

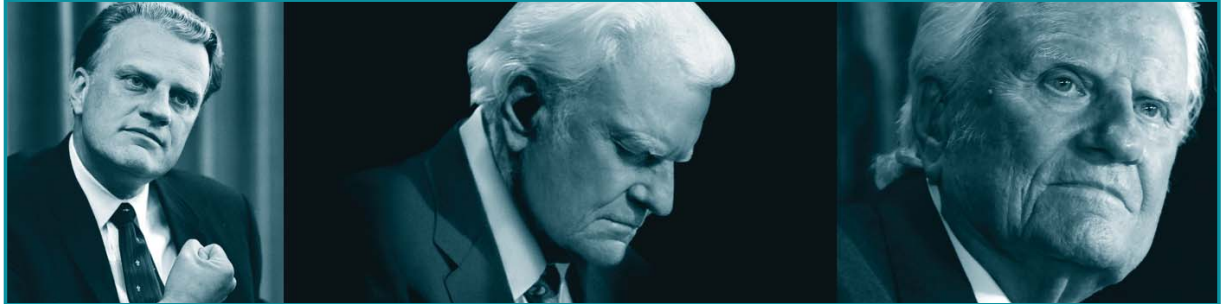

BILLY GRAHAM HAS A NEW ADDRESS

The 21st of February, 2018 God called Billy Graham to his new home - HEAVEN! As everyone knew, he was packed and ready for the move for a number of years. His health failing, and unable to preach like he used to, he was able to sit back and recollect the many years of preaching the Gospel to over 215 million people in 185 countries. More than any other person in history. Great memories for him to reflect on as he waited for his eternal resting place.



THE GOSPEL IS BROUGHT TO LOCAL THEATRES IN MILWAUKEE

The Graham ministry had its influence in the Milwaukee area starting in the late '60's with the films from World Wide Pictures (an arm of the Graham Association) when "The Restless Ones"; "Time to Run"; and many others came to local theaters and the places were packed each day for these showings. Invitations were given in the theaters and many people accepted Christ right then and there. Unheard of for film showing/theatres.

GLENDA HURNI MEYER SETS UP LOCAL OFFICE FOR "REACH OUT" CRUSADE

The inquiries were made about Billy himself coming to Milwaukee for a Crusade. The city didn't seem ready for it but the idea was to send Billy's brother-in-law Leighton Ford (who was also doing Crusades called "Reach Outs") to come to Milwaukee first. The wheels started to roll for this event, and in 1972 Glenda Hurni was sent to Milwaukee to set up an office for the Leighton Ford Reach Out Crusade at the Milwaukee Auditorium (4,444 seats). Word started to circulate that maybe Billy Graham would pay a visit the last evening, so the Arena (13,000 seats) was reserved. Billy gave greetings that evening to a full house. By the way, Glenda did a great job running the Crusade office and she liked Milwaukee so much she decided to stay here, not move on to another city and ended up marrying Tom Meyer (both very active at Eastbrook Church and other ministries).

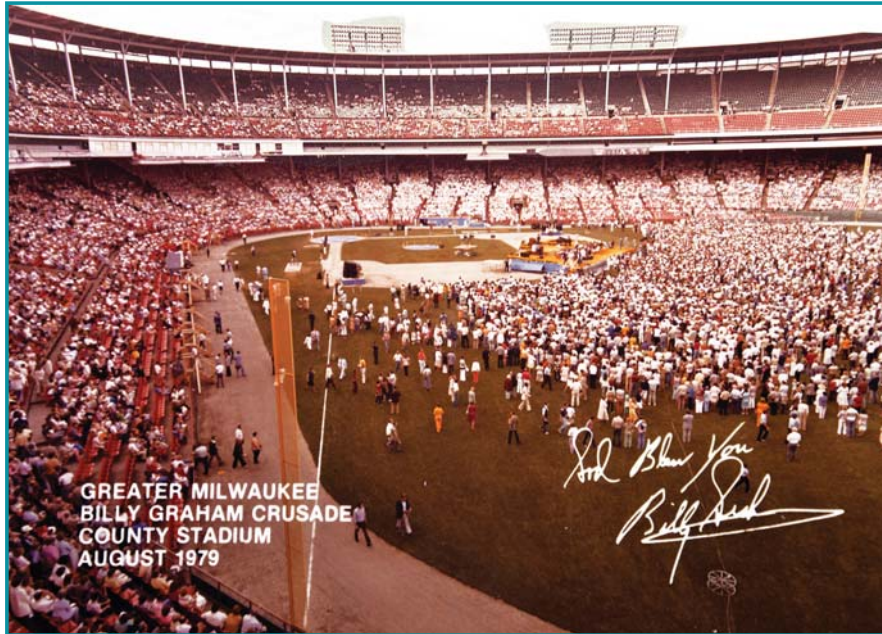

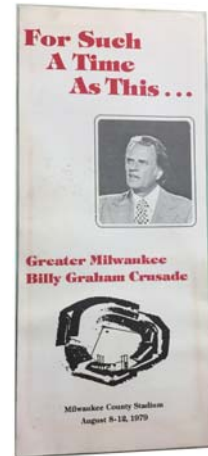
Greater Milwaukee Billy Graham Crusade

The next steps were in the works. An invitation to Billy Graham to have a Crusade in Milwaukee. It was suggested that an invitation be prepared and given in person to the team at the Lausanne Congress on Evangelism in Lausanne, Switzerland in 1974. Art Riemer and John Fisco presented the invitation. The rest is history. The Crusade came to Milwaukee in 1979 and had a great impact on the midwest. The old County Stadium was used for the event with over 150,000 people in attendance. Many churches grew from the results, new churches founded, Bible studies scattered all across the miles.

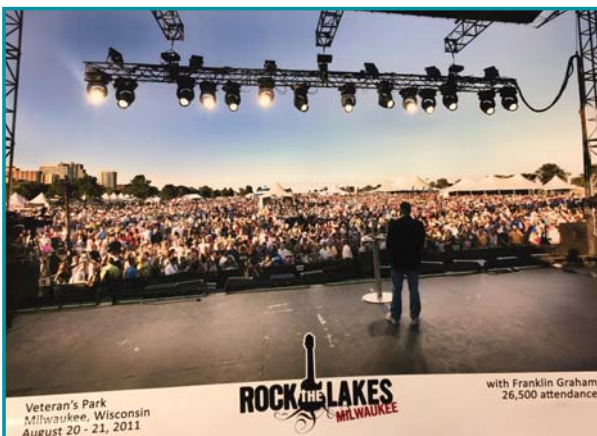


Picture of the Sunday afternoon crown at the old Milwaukee County Stadium. Over 150,000 people attended that week.

Another great impact with the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the Milwaukee area.



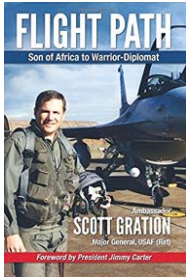

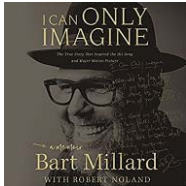

"We're all going to die," Roebuck said.

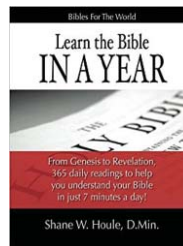
He recalled his last day of filming for "The Palau Movie" when he discovered that popular evangelist Luis Palau was diagnosed with stage four cancer.

This bean recipe is "from scratch". Canned refried beans can be substituted.

1 pound dry pinto beans

1 1/2 tsp. cumin

1 1/2 tsp. chili powder

1/2 tsp. pepper

1 large onion chopped and saut ed

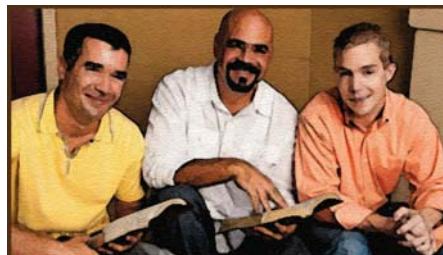
1-2 fresh garlic cloves, minced

1 1/4 tsp. salt

Sort pinto beans, checking for stones/

ANDY STANLEY URGES PASTORS TO MOVE AWAY FROM SPOTLIGHT AND RAISE NEW LEADERS



North Point Community Church Senior Pastor Andy Stanley stressed the need for pastors to move the spotlight off of themselves and make leaders of the rising generation.

"If you live for yourself, if you lead for yourself, in the end, you will have nothing to show for yourself but yourself," Stanley told church leaders and other attendees at the Exponential Conference.

"You have to decide to do this or you won't do it. It is not intuitive to give your life away, it's not intuitive to give your leadership away, it's not intuitive to give your opportunities away, it's not intuitive to say 'let's move the spotlight off of me.'"

The influential megachurch pastor said that church leaders who do not seek to make new leaders will limit their impact and limit church growth, with Stanley saying they are "not multipliers."

"If you're not a multiplier, you're like a blockage in the bowel system. Everything backs up behind you. And your organization gets sick. And it's your fault," he said.

The History and Vision of Pioneering Missions to Romania

"LORD, I will go wherever you want, do whatever you want, and become whatever you want, to bring the gospel to the children of Romania!" - Brad Hayes, Director



These were the words I spoke to the Lord in June, 1996, on the return flight of my first trip to Romania. I was deeply impacted by all I had seen while traveling through parts of that country; especially seeing the homeless street kids, referred to as nobody's children.

I witnessed how these children existed in unthinkable conditions; living in sewers with rats, garbage, and toxic fumes. I was so shaken by what I experienced that I cried uncontrollably for hours on the plane back to the States. I was not only shaken, but also compelled to return to Milwaukee and work diligently towards long-term solutions to help the children in Romania.

In 1997, our family, with many people from Wisconsin and Romania, started to build a home for orphan girls in Calarasi, Romania. Three years later we decided to move our family to Romania. In 2001, we sold our home, gave away our possessions, and were sent out as missionaries to Romania.

After our move to Romania the Lord prompted us to step out even further. Our first year in Romania we helped direct the daily activities of the girl's home. But, in the fall of 2002, with the help of close friends from Milwaukee, we formed Outstretched Hands of Romania (OH). Our vision is to "raise an army of children and poor to bring the gospel to the unreached parts of Romania." As part of our plan, we began by working with a few existing local churches around Calarasi to evangelize and establish more churches. As of 2018, we have now planted 15 churches (in the last 9 years) and hope to start 3 more churches in 2018.

Philadelphia Eagles Give Glory to God

Doug Pederson, the head coach of freshly crowned Super Bowl LII champions the Philadelphia Eagles, gave glory to God in his reaction to the historic victory.

"I can only give the praise to my Lord and savior Jesus Christ for giving me this opportunity. And I'm going to tell you something. I've got the best players in the world, and it's a resilient group," Pederson said in a post-game interview.

The Eagles' 41-33 victory over the New England Patriots marked their first-ever Super Bowl title at the U.S. Bank Stadium in Minneapolis, Minnesota, having previously lost title games in 1981 and 2005.

Eagles quarterback Nick Foles, who was named the game's Most Valuable Player, saw God's hand in his path to the final, commentators who spoke with him said.

Tony Dungy, former head coach of the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and of the Indianapolis Colts, said in a post-game interview "Nick Foles told me last week in Philadelphia he thought the Lord had him here for just this time. He knows this is Carson Wentz's team, but he was ready to go tonight, and he played like a champion."

Foles has not kept his Christian faith a secret, describing himself on Twitter as a "believer in Jesus Christ, husband, father, son, brother." The 29-year-old star athlete has said in the past that after his football career comes to an end, he is thinking of becoming a pastor.

"I want to be a pastor in a high school," Foles said at a news conference ahead of the Super Bowl.

"It's on my heart. I took a leap of faith last year and signed up to take classes at seminary. I wanted to continue to learn and challenge my faith. It's a challenge because you are writing papers that are biblically correct. You want to impact people's hearts," he said.



Foles explained that high school is a very challenging time for young men and young women.

"So much temptation in this world, so much going on with social media and the internet that you want to talk to them and address it, and share all the weaknesses I have because I've fallen many times," he stated.

"Someone asked me recently if I didn't think God was unfair, allowing me to have Parkinson's and other medical problems when I have tried to serve him faithfully. I replied that I did not see it that way at all. Suffering is part of the human condition, and it comes to us all. The key is how we react to it, either turning away from God in anger and bitterness or growing closer to him in trust and confidence."

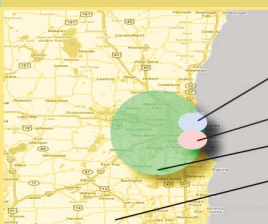

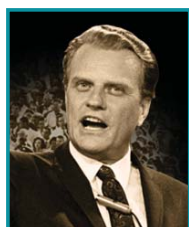
