

recent history, with catastrophic results. Its time to take note and act accordingly.



A Word From the Heart



The 106th Psalm is one of the numerous Psalms that show God's work on behalf of His children and also their failure to acknowledge His works and to give thanks to Him. It shows the propensity of the human heart to forget God's wonderful works on their behalf. The sixth verse says "we have sinned like our fathers". There is an arrogance that points out the sins of previous generations and at the same time excuses themselves from blame for their own faults. It makes little difference if the present generation hopes to re-invent the church or national government; no generation is guiltless.

Their fathers saw the miraculous powers of God in the plagues of Egypt. But their spiritual senses had been dulled by the long stay in Egypt and the idolatry of that kingdom. When our spiritual sens-

es are blunted by the world around us, it is easy to forget who God is and what he is able to do for his people. Be careful of limiting God because you don't understand Him and His ways of working. Each generation must find Christ a living reality and obey Him regardless of our present circumstances.

The inclination of the human heart to not believe is revealed over and over in the scriptures. God will test our faith. Israel was lead by God to the Red Sea. They were hemmed in, mountains on both sides and the sea in front of them. They began to complain to Moses and doubted that God was leading them to the very place. What did they forget? They forgot that they had been miraculously redeemed and now were under His protective covering. They had recently experienced the display of God's powers freeing them from Egypt. How soon they forgot His gracious salvation on their behalf, only to think that their present circumstance would confuse God and limit His power. Think back and remember your salvation and the joy of deliverance from sin through Jesus Christ. Remember the victory you experienced over something that held you captive. It was faith in God that worked for you then, and it is faith that will sustain you in your present trials.



Verses 13-15 of Psalm 106 teaches that forgetting God leads to self-seeking, and faults God for our problems. After the excitement of deliverance from Egypt, they settled down to a day-to-day routine. They soon forgot that God was leading them step by step. They stopped asking for His counsel. (vs.13) The result was a self-seeking life. They settled down to a day-to-day routine. They were eager to have their own way and failed to see what God was actually doing. We do not like waiting for the Lord to give us counsel and guidance. He had provided them with what was sufficient for living in the barren wilderness. God always knew what was good for them. But they said it wasn't good enough and was not fulfilling for their own cravings. Did they miss their old life of subjugation

in Egypt? We love religious exhilaration and feel we deserve a better portion in life from Jesus Christ. This life became a mania with them. Suddenly, the things God provided grew tasteless and they felt they knew better than God. They longed for their sensual needs to be met and were confident that to have those desires satisfied were just what they needed. What is shocking is that God gave them their requests. That He gives us our desires is no proof we are objects of divine favor. The request was granted, but the result was meagerness in their soul. Without God's blessings the meat He provided them became loathsome to them. As your wealth grows does your life weaken? Remember that Israel in the wilderness got what they wanted and were literally "fed up" with it.

As you read this Psalm look up all of the story references and read the entire account of their attitudes and rebellion toward our God. The self-righteous attitudes displayed in society among politicians and various religious groups, come from those that have aligned themselves with "The prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience", and has little right to accuse those who came before us of sins worse then theirs.


The parents of the boys rescued from a Thailand cave were celebrating, and among them were the father and mother of a boy who is sponsored through Compassion International.

After 4-Year Delay, Movie about Abortionist Kermit Gosnell Will Come to Theaters



This October, the film Gosnell: The Trial of America's Biggest Serial Killer will hit theaters after a nearly four-year delay. The film, which depicts the trial of infamous Philadelphia abortionist Kermit Gosnell, was made in 2014. But, due to the sensitive nature of the film and its controversial content, distributers stayed away from the movie until this year.

Back in 2016, the film's producers said that Hollywood was avoiding the movie because "they don't want anything that asks difficult questions about abortion." The film draws attention to Gosnell's crimes of murdering infants born in his abortion facility and the corruption that allowed them to continue for so many years. In 2013, a Philadelphia court charged Gosnell to life in prison for the murder of three infants born alive in his

abortion facility and the involuntary manslaughter of one mother.

While the case was under investigation, the media actively avoided covering it. Now, even years after the trial, executive producer John Sullivan says that the story still faces pushback from mainstream culture. "Hollywood is afraid of this content," he explained. "It's a true story the media tried to ignore from the very beginning, so I wasn't sur-

prised to see Hollywood ignore [our film]."

The film also encountered legal issues in 2017. According to The Daily Wire, judge Jeffery Minehart, who "presided over Gosnell's trial, sued to stop the film's release." His concern was that the film depicted him as one of the corrupt governing officials who took part in covering up Gosnell's crimes. The Hollywood Reporter says that the legal matter is finally resolved, however.

GVN Releasing finally picked up the movie this year, ending the long wait. Now, more than 700 theaters across the nation are slated to show the movie when it comes out in October. The filmmakers hope that the movie will be a fair telling of a story that needs to be told. As one producer put it, "The cover-up stops here."

A CAMPAIGN TO BLITZ THE COUNTRY WITH 'IN GOD WE TRUST' LAWS TAKES ROOT




As the summer heat waxes and state legislative sessions wane, the Congressional Prayer Caucus Foundation has scored a few small but significant victories.

This year, five state legislatures passed laws mandating that every public school prominently display the U.S. motto, "In God We Trust." The addition of Arkansas, which passed such a law in 2017, brings to six the number of states with public school mandates, including Alabama, Florida, Arizona, Louisiana and Tennessee.

Those laws, mostly sponsored by legislative prayer caucuses in about 30 states, were inspired by the foundation's 2017 manual known as Project Blitz, a 116-page guide for state legislators listing 20 model bills of which "In God We Trust" is the first.

For a foundation begun in late 2005 as an offshoot of the Congressional Prayer Caucus, that's an impressive start.

'God Loves You': Actor Chris Pratt Delivers Faith-Filled Speech at MTV Movie Awards



Actor Christ Pratt accepted the MTV Movie & TV Awards' Generation Award and proceeded to list "nine rules" to live by – four of which mentioned his Christian faith. He even referenced Christ's atonement.

"God is real. God loves you. God wants the best for you. Believe that -- I do," he said to applause.

The actor known for his roles in Parks and Recreation, Jurassic World, and theGuardians of the Galaxy series has a Christian background. He "gave his soul to Jesus" and worked for Jews for Jesus at age 19, he told Esquire in 2014. He discusses his faith frequently.

"This being the generation award, I'm going to cut to the chase and I'm going to speak to you, the next generation," he said, looking at the camera and to a laughing audience.

He then gave his "nine rules from Christ Pratt."

The rules referenced the soul, prayer, God, and the cross.

"Nobody is perfect," he said. "People are going to tell you [that] you're perfect just the way that you are. You're not. You're imperfect. You always will be, but there is a powerful force that designed you that way, and if you're willing to accept that, you will have grace. And grace is a gift. And like the freedom that we enjoy in this country, that grace was paid for with somebody else's blood. Do not forget it. Don't take it for granted."

Following are some of his "rules."

- "Breathe. If you don't, you will suffocate."
- "You have a soul. Be careful with it."
- "Don't be a turd. If you're strong, be a protector, and if you are smart, be a humble influencer. Strength and intelligence can be weapons, and do not wield them against the weak. That makes you a bully Be bigger than that"

- "When giving a dog medicine, put the medicine in a little piece of hamburger. They won't even know they're eating medicine"
- "It doesn't matter what it is. Earn it. A good deed. Reach out to someone in pain. Be of service. It feels good and it's good for your soul."
- "God is real. God loves you. God wants the best for you. Believe that -- I do." – said to loud applause.
- "Learn to pray. It's easy, and it's so good for your soul."
- "Nobody is perfect. People are going to tell you [that] you're perfect just the way that you are. You're not. You're imperfect. You always will be, but there is a powerful force that designed you that way, and if you're willing to accept that, you will have grace. And grace is a gift. And like the freedom that we enjoy in this country, that grace was paid for with somebody else's blood. Do not forget it. Don't take it for granted."

He ended by telling the audience: "God bless you."



For KING & COUNTRY Declares the Power of 'Joy' Amid Trials

Following the celebration around their RIAA Certified Gold Album, RUN WILD. LIVE FREE. LOVE STRONG., for KING & COUNTRY is gearing up for the release of their highly anticipated third full-length album and the two say they believe the joy of the Lord can help the current state of America.

The musical sibling duo just wrapped up the "joy UNLEASHED" tour where they debuted their new single, "Joy." The song was received with much praise at their Orlando concert at the Amway Center on May 5.

"Joy — a big theme for us over the last few years," Joel Smallbone told The Christian Post backstage at their concert.

The Australian native shared that he became an American citizen last year, during a time when the country is facing a lot of social and political unrest. The group believes joy is the perfect antidote.

"When you're faced with hardships, when you're faced with trials — even as a nation — questions, and division, what do you turn to? Do you turn to finger pointing, do you turn to despair, ... anger? Or just maybe in all of it, we turn to joy!" he maintained.

When asked how they think joy plays a factor in helping the state of the world today, Luke Smallbone explained the power he believes godly joy can truly possess.



"It's easier said than done. I think that's part of the reason why the Bible talks about joy a good bit," he shared. "I don't think Jesus is too concerned with our happiness but I do think He's very concerned about our joy because that's way more attractive."

Luke maintained that there is a distinct difference between happiness and joy, revealing that people who have joy are able to get through the battles of life, still intact

"Happiness, to me, is when everything is going well for you ... But when you see someobody with joy and then you find out a hardship that that person's been going through ... that must mean that there's something else going on in their life that's trumping all of the noise, and for me, I think it's pursuing the heart of Jesus. I don't know what else breeds joy like that," Luke explained.

"If you're looking for Jesus in things you will find it. And if you're looking for Jesus, in ways, when you find it, to me, that is what produces joy," the younger Smallbone brother concluded.

The successful group were the only artists in Christian music to receive both a Gold album and two Gold single certifications from the RIAA in 2017. The two-time Grammy Award winner's new single, "Joy," is now available and their third album is to follow.





Jets Lag during Push for Pastor's Release

What does a new fleet of F-35 fighter jets have to do with Christian persecution? A lot, according to a group of bipartisan senators.

When the latest Joint Strike Fighters rolled off the assembly line at Lockheed Martin, at least 100 of them were earmarked for Turkey, part of what would normally be a routine sale to a NATO-allied country. But the shipment is on hold, at least for now, thanks to Senator Jeanne Shaheen (D-N.H.) and Thom Tillis (R-N.H.). The unlikely duo is trying to force Turkey's hand in the case of American Pastor Andrew Brunson, who's been held under bogus charges since last October.

If the government refuses to release him, a vast majority of the Senate (66 members, to be exact), will take "measures" to ensure that "the government of Turkey respects the right of law-abiding American citizens to

travel to, reside in, and work in Turkey without fear of persecution." President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, who was just reelected, "has continued down a path of reckless governance and disregard for the rule of law," Senator James Lankford (R-Okla.) insisted. "Individual freedoms have been increasingly diminished as Erdogan consolidates

power for himself, and Turkey's strategic decisions regrettably fall more and more out of line with, and at times in contrast to, U.S. interests."

Their biggest weapon for blocking the sale is the National Defense Authorization Act, which the Senate approved last week. In an amendment added by Shaheen and Tillis, the Senate version bars the Pentagon from



moving the jets until Pastor Brunson is set free. The House version of the bill also puts a hold on the fighters, but under different terms. In the upper chamber's draft, the Trump administration would have to certify that Turkey "is not threatening NATO," a process that could take months. The difference will be worked out in a House and Senate conference committee.

Chick-fil-A Tops the American Consumer Satisfaction Index's List of Best Restaurants

Chick-fil-A has once again emerged as America's top-rated fast food restaurant, according to a report from the American Customer Satisfaction Index.

The Christian Post reports that the ACSI rates restaurants on a 100-point scale, and Chick-fil-A scored an 87. The survey polled 22,522 customers.

This marks the third year in a row that Chickfil-A has topped the ACSI's list. Additionally, before Chick-fil-A came on the scene, no restaurant had scored higher than 86.

In addition to providing delicious chicken sandwiches, Chick-fil-A restaurants prioritize excellent customer service and Christian values, such as being closed on Sundays and playing Christian music in their establishments. ACSI also credited Chick-fil-A's "product focus" as a reason for their continued success

Although the fast food chain often comes under criticism for these Christian values, it also continues to be popular with customers, as the ACSI report shows.

ARCHEOLOGISTS DISCOVER BIBLICAL GATE RELATED TO 12 TRIBES OF ISRAEL



Archaeologists in Israel say they've uncovered the entrance gate to Zer, a biblical city from the Old Testament they say was later known as Bethsaida in the New Testament.

The find in the Golan Heights area was made in the past two weeks and was announced by the Golan Regional Council, according to The Jerusalem Post. Zer is mentioned in Joshua 19:35 as one of the fortified cities for the people of Naphtali, one of the 12 tribes of Israel. The verse reads: "The fortified cities are Ziddim, Zer, Hammath, Rakkath, Chinnereth ..."

Archaeologists say Zer was known as Bethsaida in the New Testament. Bethsaida is where Jesus healed a blind man (Mark 8) and fed the 5,000 (Luke 9). It also is where Andrew, Peter and Philip were from (John 1:44).

The gate find was made by about 20 archaeologists working with Hebrew Union College, The Post reported. Rami Arav, director of the Bethsaida Project, is helping lead the effort.

DOJ to Churches: To Each His Zone

At Ragamuffins Coffee House, owners are probably most famous for this blend: community service and worship. That's because the Maryland spot isn't just another business on Laurel's Main Street. It's run by a church that opens its doors -- and its arms -- to the area's homeless and needy families, offering coffee six days a week and a shot of God everyday, especially on Sunday. It's a concept they hoped would help them connect with the city. And it did -- until Laurel's government got involved.

City officials got a whiff of Redemption Church's plans and informed Pastor Jeremy Tuinstra that he'd have to file for a special exemption -- a slow and expensive process that didn't apply to other non-religious groups. On top of a non-refundable \$2,000 filing fee, the church was told it had to hire an engineer and submit plans to comply with the vague terms of the zoning law. And even when Ragamuffins did that, there was no guarantee the city wouldn't reject it.

"Three days after they first looked through the property and walked through it with a city official, the city started to change its laws," Alliance Defending Freedom attorney Christian Holcomb explained. "First it banned nonprofit organizations and then secondly it changed the law to make houses of worship restricted to...second-class or second tier in their zoning." Redemption complied with the new laws, but officials still ordered Ragamuffins to stop holding Sunday services -- or face a \$250 fine for each day it didn't comply. The church made a different decision -- it sued.

With a tiny congregation and staff, there was no way the church could afford almost \$2,000 in fines every week. Besides, Holcomb points out, "Federal law makes it very clear that cities cannot discriminate against religious uses and allow secular uses." Erik Stanley, who also works for ADF, can't believe the double standard. "Laurel officials allow secular groups such as cinemas, the-

atres, comedy clubs, schools. and health clubs to locate downtown, but not this small church that wants to serve its community. That's not legal or constitutional."

Unfortunately, Ragamuffins's situation is more common than you might think. Churches, home groups, syna-

gogues, Bible studies, and schools have run smack dab into this local intolerance for religious exercise. But, thanks to Attorney General Jeff Sessions, cities who want to exploit or discriminate against faith-based groups will have a lot tougher time of it now. The Justice Department put its foot down against these subtle attacks on religious freedom. In a speech at the Orthodox Union Advocacy Center, Jeff Sessions announced a new "Place to Worship" initiative that would enforce the protections that already exist for churches like Redemption when it comes to buying, building, expanding, or rent facilities.

"The Constitution doesn't just protect freedom to worship in private," Sessions pointed out, "it protects the public exercise of religious belief, including where people worship together. Under the laws of this country, government cannot discriminate against people based on their religion -- not in law enforcement, not in grant-making, not in hiring, and not in local zoning laws." A lot of Americans, he went on, think their religious freedom is under attack.

This feeling is understandable. Religious Americans have heard themselves called 'de-



plorables.' They've heard themselves called 'bitter clingers.' I believe this concern -- this unease.

As part of this new Justice initiative, Sessions's team is also launching a suit against a New Jersey town that blocked a group of orthodox Jews from moving their meetings out of a single-family home into a new building. The city refused their request, turned down construction applications, and even went so far as to seize property that the Valley Chabad tried to buy for a school. "In order to sustain a democracy, it is necessary that we exercise true tolerance," Sessions insisted. "...We shouldn't have to go to court to co-exist in peace."

This is a major step forward for Americans of all faiths. For a year and a half, this administration has shown the world that it's fully committed to defending the freedom of everyone to live and work according to their beliefs. This president is advancing values we care about -- instead of forcing us to abandon our faith just to enter the public square.


FRUITY POPSICLES

1 can (8 oz.) crushed pineapple, undrained 1 can (15 oz.) peaches canned in juice, undrained 1/2 of a 12 oz. can frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed 3/4 c. water

Combine all ingredients in blender. Process until smooth. Transfer to popsicles molds and freeze until firm. Makes about 20. Tip: Be sure to check for possible peach pit pieces before blending.







Two soccer players from opposing teams playing in the 2018 World Cup in Russia joined on the field on Monday after a game to pray together.

Belgium player Romelu Lukaku, a Roman Catholic, and Panama player Fidel Escobar, an evangelical Christian, knelt on the field after the match between the two countries. Belgium won 3-0.

"Lukaku and Fidel Escobar kneeling and praying at the final whistle was a beautiful moment for many. Both players may represent different religions and had differing results, yet they found peace in what they were doing," wrote Oscar Flex - Kibet, a digital content creator, on Twitter.

"Love for the game, God above all," he added.

The image of the two soccer players praying after the game was widely circulated on social media. Many called it the "image of the day," according to reports.

Lukaku is the star of the Manchester United English Premier League. He scored two of Monday's winning goals. He has been vocal about his faith, using his Instagram account to talk about it.

Earlier in 2017, British tabloid newspapers said Lukaku was Muslim, but Lukaku had publically talked about his Christian faith in years before. In 2016, he was featured in a Christian Today article, "Five Christian superstars of Euro 2016" and in 2014, he was quoted in The Sun as posting on his Instagram: "Belief has always been important to me. Live from Lourdes. God is great."
