Are You Satisfied with Christmas? by Jeff Griffis

Scriptures: Matthew 2:1-15

Many songs we sing at Christmas are reminders that Christmastime is supposed to be happy. Songs like "It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year," "Have a Holly Jolly Christmas," "Chestnuts Roasting on an Open Fire," "Jingle Bells," and "Walking in a Winter Wonderland" all communicate that Christmas time is to be a joyous, trouble-free season.

But let me ask you honestly: Is that what you are experiencing this season? Probably not. For some of you , personal problems are keeping you from experiencing the joy of the season. For others, you feel like one crisis after another has run you over. With such an avalanche of problems it is hard to have a holly-jolly Christmas.

Some of you are so busy and working so hard that there is no time for sitting around a fire roasting chestnuts. Or, maybe there is not anything really wrong, but for some reason you are just not enjoying Christmas. It is not providing the emotional lift that you expected. In fact, it is almost depressing. The world does not look like a winter wonderland. It just looks like winter.

Disillusionment at Christmas is not an unusual thing. We get so hyped up with expectations about what Christmas is supposed to be that often the real thing doesn't measure up, and we are disappointed.

What can you do this Christmas to avoid disillusionment? How can you improve your level of joy this Christmas? The answer is found in the story of the magi in Matthew 2. Magi , wise men from the East, saw a star that indicated the birth of a new king in Israel. Wanting to honor Him with gifts, they set out on a journey following the star to find this newborn King . From the attitudes of these wise men and the events that surrounded their journey , we see how we can raise our level of joy at Christmas.

There are three lessons we learn from this story.

I. WHAT DO YOU SEEK?

Your level of joy at Christmas is directly related to what it is you seek. Ask the question: What is it I want

to get out of Christmas? What is it that would make your Christmas wonderful and satisfying? Snow? All the family together and happy? A feeling you define as the holiday spirit? Finding the right present to give? Getting the present you have been hoping for? The problem with all these is that they can leave us disappointed.


Have you ever had that kind of experience - when you were disappointed by Christmas because it did not deliver what you thought it would? The problem is not Christmas. It is in our expectations. We are looking for the wrong thing.

The magi show us how to increase our level of joy at Christmas by looking for the right thing. What was it they were looking for? Verse 2 tells us. They came to Jerusalem and said, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him." They were looking for Jesus. Christmas for them was an opportunity to worship Jesus.

That is what we need to be looking for and expecting this Christmas - an experience of worship, a fresh glimpse of He who was born King of the Jews. If our goal this Christmas is to worship Jesus, then I doubt very seriously we will be dissatisfied with our experience.

II. WHERE DO YOU LOOK?

Your level of joy at Christmas is directly related to where you look. We learn from the magi that there are wrong and right places to look for Christmas. They started by looking in the wrong place. They looked where their own human reasoning said they should look. The star indicated the birth of a new king in Israel. The magi went where kings should be born - to the palace of Herod the Great in the capital city of Jerusalem. But what a mistake that was! When Herod heard of the birth of a new king, he jealousy sought to destroy him.

We, too, are tempted to look for joy at Christmas in the wrong places. We think by getting or giving the right gift we will be satisfied. We imagine that being with family will be joyful. All these can easily disappoint us. You may not be able to afford the right gift for a loved one. Family members may be missing from

A Word From the Heart



Those who write on the life of the Apostle Paul usually spare no praise in describing this man. Concerning christianities rudimentary beginnings it is said of Paul, "the moment Paul appeared on the stage was in the utmost need of a man of extraordinary endowments, who being possessed with its genius, should incorporate it with the general history of the world; in Paul it found the man it needed."

The other Apostles are described as unlettered men. Stalker says of Paul, "he enjoyed the fullest scholastic advantages of the period. In the rabbinical school he learned how to arrange and state and defend his ideas. We have the results of all this in his epistles, which contain the best explanation of christianity possessed by the world." Stalker goes

on to describe Paul as God's chosen one to help break down prejudices and bring in the universal character of christianity, in this manner "beyond Palestine lay the great world of Greece and Rome - the world of vast populations, of power and culture, of pleasure and business. It needed a man of unlimited versatility, of education, of immense human sympathy and breadth, to go out there with the gospel message - a man who could not only be a Jew to the Jews, but a Greek to the Greeks, a Roman to the Romans, a Barbarian to the Barbarians - a man who could encounter not only Rabbis in their synagogues, but proud magistrates in their courts and philosophers in the haunts of learning. ——No man of this size belonged to the original apostolic circle; but christianity needed such a person, and he was found in Paul."

The description of Paul given by F. F. Bruce, Conybeare and Howson, numerous commentaries and encyclopedias exceed Stalker's praises of this unique man. But how does Paul describe himself? Is it possible that Paul did not see it as we do? Many people have filled special



places and have been placed by God for a special work and yet have not been aware of their unique accomplishments.

Paul describes himself as "one born out of due time." As a mother might give birth before her time, Paul felt he was one who was more like a miscarriage. He didn't feel that it was about time he was used because he was the one to take the lead. In other words, Paul was not an outstanding person with an attitude. He felt unworthy to be identified with the crude Galileans who had spent 3 years in the school of Christ. What I find amazing is that instead of being motivated by his sinful background and God's mercy to him. Paul never forgot that he was one who persecuted the church of God. This description of himself appears

in Ephesians, 1 Timothy and Acts.

We can learn some important lessons from Paul's own description of himself. No matter what qualifications we have we do not deserve to be used by God. His work will go on nicely without any of us. It is possible to respect those who some might deem inferior in talents and background. Paul attributed his service directly to God's grace. Even when he said "I labored more abundantly than they all" the implication was not that he was more successful than the others, but only that he pushed on to regions beyond. We must learn also, that it isn't necessary for all sinful memories to fade away before we can serve the Lord. The memory of his past ways did not become an excuse for spiritual indolence, but instead became a great motivational force in serving God. It is His love that constrains us, not our potential. Too many unique capable people have failed just as many journeymen have. Proverbs 27:2 says: "Let another man praise you, and not your own mouth; a stranger, and not your own lips."

your holiday celebration. If you are looking to these things for joy, you may be left with a feeling of disillusionment.

The magi looked in the right place when they looked to God. The trip to Jerusalem was not a total loss. While there they discovered where they should have looked in the first place: the Bible. The scribes in Jerusalem said that, according to the prophet Micah, the Messiah was to be born in Bethlehem. With this new information, they looked again at the star and followed it to Bethlehem until it stood over the house where the child Jesus lived.

III. WHAT DO YOU GIVE?

Your level of joy at Christmas is directly related to what you give. The magi came to Jesus' house bearing gifts. The gifts they gave were entirely appropriate. They gave gold, gift for a king. By giving it they acknowledged that Jesus was and is the King. They gave frankincense, a gift for a priest. This was incense the priests used in Temple. By giving it they acknowledged that Jesus was a priest - the One who would bring us to God. They gave myrrh, gift for the dead. This was a fragrant ointment used to anoint a body before burial. By

giving it they acknowledged that Jesus had come to die for the sins of the world.

We ought to give appropriate gifts this Christmas as well. Don't get me wrong, I'm not talking about material gifts. I am talking about more important things. We ought to give the gift of our love and kindness to our friends and family. We ought to give the gift of our help to those who are hurting. We ought to give the gift of forgiveness to those who have hurt us. Giving these kinds of gifts will result in a joyous and meaningful Christmas.

CONCLUSION

What are you giving for Christmas this year? Why not consider giving yourself? Give your time to your family. Give your compassion to the hurting. Give your forgiveness to the isolated. And give your heart to Jesus? I promise you, when you look for the right thing, look in the right places, and give the right gift, you will have joy at Christmas.

Billy Graham's Grandson Reveals What Caused Him to 'Fall in Love' With the Bible



Will Graham, grandson of the late Billy Graham, has shared how he "fell in love" with the Bible while studying at Liberty Univer-

sity and reflected on how his time at the college influenced his ministry career.

Graham, who serves as the executive director of the Billy Graham Training Center at The Cove and vice president of the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association, said his time at the private college in Lynchburg, Virginia, was "very instrumental" in shaping who he is today.

"When I got there, I knew a lot about the people because I was so rooted in church, and I had a mom and dad who read me the Bible," he said. "But when I came to Liberty, I actually fell in love with the Bible. I just de-

veloped this love for the Bible and I soaked it up."

The 43-year-old Graham, whose father is famed evangelist Franklin Graham, said that even today, he draws upon the tools and techniques he learned at Liberty when crafting his sermons.

"I had one professor who taught me how to organize my Bible study so I could learn how to teach myself God's Word," he recalled. "His name was Paul Fink. Paul has now passed away, but he was very influential in my life and shaping how I studied the Bible and how I make my sermons today."

Chinese Pastor of Demolished Church Refuses to Bow to Authorities: 'Of Course We're Scared, But We Have Jesus'

A pastor whose church was demolished by Chinese authorities — who then sent him a bill for related costs — has expressed his unwavering faith in God despite such persecution.

The Guardian reports that in September, authorities demolished Zion Church in Beijing, one of the biggest unofficial congregations in the country. Pastor Jin Mingri, who had preached there every Sunday for decades, was then sent a bill for 1.2m yuan (£133,000) for the related costs.

Jin told the outlet that the demolition of the church was part of Chinese president Xi Jinping's larger crackdown on religion in the country.

"Before, as long as you didn't meddle in politics the government left you alone," he said. "But now if you don't push the Communist party line, if you don't display your love for the party, you are a target."

He added, "Of course we're scared, we're in China, but we have Jesus."

According to reports, the 1,500-member congregation was shut down after it refused to install surveillance cameras in its sanctu-



ary or register as an official Three-Self Patriotic Movement (TSPM) church.

"The church decided this was not appropriate," Jin previously told Reuters. "... Our services are a sacred time."

Following the church's refusal, state security officials and police started to harass churchgoers, even contacting their workplaces and asking them to promise not to go to church.

"On Sunday, the Beijing Chaoyang district civil affairs bureau said that by organizing events without registering, the church was breaking rules forbidding mass gatherings and were now 'legally banned' and its 'illegal promotional material' had been confiscated," reported the news agency.

Persecution watchdog China Aid reports that Zion "has decided it will not be swayed by the ban and instead hold services outdoors."

A movement of conservative Christian women with a passion for biblical values and the advance of the Gospel is raising its voice against the "nasty woman" ideology of the Women's March.




Thousands of women gathered on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial, many clad in blue T-shirts that read "Awake Arise Advance," to worship the Lord and declare what they stand for in an event called Deborah's Voice. Speakers included Gigi Graham, the eldest child of the late evangelist Billy Graham, and Genelle Guzman-McMillan, the last survivor to be pulled out from the rubble of the Twin Towers following the 9/11 attacks, among others.

"If I could encapsulate it in one phrase I would said it is 'piercing the darkness," said Kim Hale, music director for Deborah's Voice, to The Christian Post on the steps of the historic monument, when asked about the significance of their presence in the nation's capital.

"I feel like bringing the presence of God to this place right here, and you look around here and you see all the monuments ... and we felt the presence of God here. We felt it; it was so powerful. We had many people come up and say that the impact was hard, but in a good way."

Americans' access to digital books may be growing, but they still enjoy reading a physical copy of the Bible.

A new Barna survey shows that 89 percent of Bible users in the United States read a physical version – a percentage that has remained steady the past eight years.

Reading the Bible on the Internet (57 percent) and on a smartphone (55 percent) remains popular, but a Barna report said Americans' usage of a physical version is noteworthy.

NEARLY 200,000 STUDENTS EXPECTED TO "STAND FOR CHRIST" ON ATHLETIC FIELDS ACROSS THE COUNTRY STARTING OCTOBER 10TH!

For many, sports has become more of a platform than a way to glorify God. But nearly 200,000 students, coaches, parents and community members gather on hundreds of athletic fields nationwide on October 10 for the FCA's 15th annual Fields of Faith to bring glory to Jesus Christ rather than attention to themselves.

These athletes will stand for their faith at upwards of 500 student-led and student-driven gatherings across the country and around the world. The central focus is to encourage their peers to pray, read their Bible and commit their lives to Christ.

HILLSONG TO FORM ITS OWN DENOMINATION

Millions of people around the world know Hillsong through its many campuses, television network, and three recording labels. Now, Hillsong Church will also form its own denomination, ending its connection to a denomination with which it has been affiliated since its founding.

Originally founded as Hills Christian Life Centre in 1983 by Brian and Bobbie Houston, Hillsong now has over 120 campuses in over 20 nations. According to a letter released by Houston, this global reach necessitated that they leave the Australian Christian Churches, a branch of the Assemblies of God, to form their own denomination.

Houston said the split from the ACC had nothing to do with any "grief or dispute" between the two parties. He reiterated his love for the ACC and respect for its current leader, Pastor Wayne Alcorn.

UK HIGH COURT BACKS THE BAKERS: IT'S CALLED FAITH, NOT DISCRIMINATION

The supreme court just handed Christian bakers a major religious freedom victory. No, not our Supreme Court.

Britain's highest court unanimously ruled in favor of a Christian bakery that declined to create a cake that expressed support for samesex marriage.

In 2014, a customer asked the owners of Asher's Bakery in Belfast, Northern Ireland to create a cake that read "Support Gay Marriage" and which depicted Bert and Ernie from Sesame Street, who have become gay icons.

The owners, Daniel and Amy McArthur are Christians. They declined to create the cake because it expressed a message that contradicted fundamental tenets of their faith.

Throughout the whole ordeal and the trial that followed, the owners insisted that the issue for them was the message, not the customer. As Daniel McArthur told reporters outside of the court, ""We didn't say no because of the customer; we'd served him before, we'd serve

him again . . . It was because of the message. But some people want the law to make us support something with which we disagree."

It's worth noting for a moment the parallels between this story and that of both Barronelle Stutzman and Jack Phillips. Like Stutzman,

the person who charged the McArthurs with discrimination was an established customer whom they had previously served without incident.

Like Phillips, the McArthurs were willing to serve the complainant anything that they would serve anyone else. And as in both cases, it didn't matter—at least not initially.

EDGAR SANDOVAL BEGINS TENURE AS PRESIDENT OF WORLD VISION U.S.

Edgar Sandoval has officially taken the helm as the President and Chief Executive Officer of World Vision United States. Sandoval, 54, has served as the organization's Chief Operating

Officer for the past three years.

In his new role, he will be charged with building on World Vision's 68-year legacy of bearing witness to the good news of the kingdom of God by partnering with children, families, and their communities to tackle poverty and injustice.

NETFLIX TO ADAPT C.S. LEWIS' THE CHRONICLES OF NARNIA INTO SERIES

Netflix recently announced that they have signed a deal permitting them to develop a new television series based on the wildly popular book series turned motion picture franchise, C.S. Lewis' The Chronicles of Narnia.

"It is wonderful to know that folks from all over are looking forward to seeing more of Narnia and that the advances in production and distribution technology have made it possible for us to make Narnian adventures come to life all over the world," Douglas Gresham, Lewis' stepson said in a press release. "Netflix seems to be the very best medium with which to achieve this aim, and I am looking forward to working with them towards this goal."

GOSNELL THE MOVIE: THE MURDER CASE THAT PUT ABORTION ON TRIAL

A new film is telling the details of a horror so unspeakable, it shocked federal investigators. It's a story that needs to be told.

Sometimes, a movie is not about entertainment. Sometimes, it's about something much more important. A film can expose grave evils, and even inspire us to fight those evils. I think "Gosnell: Trial of America's Biggest Serial Killer," is just such a film.

Directed by Nick Searcy, the movie dramatizes the horrific, real-life account of Dr. Kermit Gosnell, the west Philadelphia abortionist whose clinic was described in a 2011 Grand Jury report as a "house of horrors." During a drug raid there, authorities discovered unsanitary conditions, remnants of 45 aborted fetuses in bags inside freezers, rows of jars containing fetal feet, and untrained staff administering medications, which resulted in the death of at least one patient.

The 281-page report described how Gosnell and his staff regularly delivered full-term babies whom they then killed by "snipping" their spinal cords with scissors. Hundreds of infants were dispatched in this way. Despite numerous complaints to the state health department about the clinic conditions, Gosnell's filthy abortion mill went without an inspection for sixteen years.

In 2013, Gosnell was found guilty of multiple counts of first-degree murder, involuntary manslaughter, and felony late-term abortions. All together, he faces three consecutive life sentences.



Richard DeVos, Christian Billionaire and Orlando Magic Owner, Dies at 92; Hailed for Vision, Values



Christian billionaire Richard DeVos passed away at the age of 92, leaving behind a legacy of entrepreneurship as well as values.

DeVos died at his home in Ada, Michigan, following complications from an infection. Rick DeVos, his grandson, posted a series of updates on Twitter last week.

"Early this morning our family's patriarch, Richard DeVos Sr. went home to join his dear wife Helen with Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. These next days will be full of great joy and sadness as our family celebrates a life truly well lived and mourns the coming days without him," Rick DeVos wrote.

"We celebrate Grandma & Grandpa's incredible legacy of creation & generosity as a generational chapter closes. The next generation has already taken up their standard, and another follows close behind. It is an unbelievable honor to carry the name Richard Marvin DeVos III," he added in the statement.

DeVos was born in Grand Rapids, Michigan, on March 4, 1926. Among his many notable business achievements, he co-founded direct selling company Amway in 1959, and in 1991 he bought the NBA Orlando Magic franchise.

Devos and his late wife, Helen, donated to Christian churches and ministries through the Richard and Helen DeVos Foundation. The foundation has been a major contributor to evangelical organizations including Focus on the Family and Family Research Council.

Devos, who is father-in-law of U.S. Education Secretary Betsy DeVos, was appointed by former President Ronald Reagan to the Presidential Commission on AIDS.

"A core component of the HHS mission is our dedication to serve all Americans from conception to natural death," the plan says.


The strategic plan is part of what seems like moves by the HHS to support pro-life policies.

InterVarsity Launches '2030 Calling' to Plant Christian Fellowships at 2,500 US Colleges



InterVarsity Christian Fellowship has launched a "2030 Calling" — an initiative to bring Christian fellowships to all major college campuses in the United States in the next 12 years.

The inter-denominational, evangelical Christian campus ministry announced its new initiative on Monday to bring Christian ministries to all 2,500 U.S. college campuses that have over 1,000 students by the year 2030.

According to the ministry, about 53 percent of those 2,500 schools do not have a known campus ministry presence.

"Our deep conviction is that every student at every university and every faculty member at every university deserves an opportunity to hear the Gospel in a compelling, passionate and personal way from somebody that they know," Greg Jao, Intervarsity director of external relations and senior assistant to InterVarsity President Tom Lin, told The Christian Post. "The best way to do that is to make sure that there is a campus fellowship at every one of those places."

Jao explained that the 2030 Calling is strategic because "today's college students represent the leaders in our churches, government, businesses and nonprofits of tomorrow."

"Reaching today's college students and introducing them to the Gospel and helping them to follow Jesus not only changes their lives but changes the trajectory of our country over decades," he said.

In a statement, Lin explained that the 2030 Calling signals a "new shift" in how the organization approaches campus ministry. He also stressed that the goal isn't necessarily to bring InterVarsity to every campus but to ensure there is some form of fellowship present at all of the campuses.

"This is not about planting InterVarsity's flag on every campus; it's about declaring God's glory on every campus," Lin stressed. "We believe the Lord can use us, in partnership with others, to bring a powerful movement of the Spirit among a new generation of students and faculty. We truly are longing for revival on campus. And we believe that, in the next 12 years, that's exactly what God will do through the 2030 Calling."

Actor Mark Wahlberg Shares That He Begins His Day with 30 Minutes of Prayer

Mark Wahlberg recently shared his daily routine in a story on his Instagram account.

Wahlberg, Hollywood's highest paid actor in 2017, undertook his intense daily routine to prepare for his role in the upcoming film Mile 22. However, prayer has been central in his life for several years.

"The first thing I do when I start my day is, I get down on my hands and knees and give thanks to God. Whenever I go outside of my house, the first thing I do is stop at the church. The kids will be mad with me. 'Daddy! It takes too long!' I'm saying: 'It's only 10 minutes and this is something I really need to do.' Because I do. If I can start my day out by saying my prayers and getting myself focused, then I know I'm doing the right thing. That 10 minutes helps me in every way throughout the day."

Wahlberg has also expressed regret over some of the roles he played earlier in his career, especially one in an Oscar-nominated film in which he portrayed a porn star. He told Cardinal Blase Cupich at an event in Chicago that, "I just always hope that God is a movie fan and also forgiving because I've made some poor choices in my past." Wahlberg said he does not pray so he can have success but focuses his prayer time on his wife, his four children, and his character. "For me to sit down and ask for material things is ridiculous. It's a much bigger picture than that. I want to serve God and to be a good human being and to make up for the mistakes I made and the pain I put people

through. That's what I'm praying for, and I recommend it to anybody."

When asked about how he accomplishes all that he does, he told Men's Health, "If you're doing the right things, then there's enough time in the day to get it all done."

Hyatt Hotels to Millions of Conservatives: You're Not Welcome at Our Hotels

Best-Selling Author Brigitte Gabriel and ACT for America Founder Says First Amendment Wasn't Created to Protect Just Leftist Speech, But ALL Speech


CHINA WANTS TO REWRITE THE BIBLE

The GoFundMe effort explains that the scholarship program will help those abused at the hands of churches and clergy.





Study Finds Prolife Pregnancy Centers Saved Communities \$161 Million Last Year

The Charlotte Lozier Institute, the research group affiliated with the pro-life advocacy organization Susan B. Anthony List, released an 80-page report on Wednesday detailing that pro-life pregnancy centers across the nation provided free services to 2 million people and saved communities \$161 million in costs in 2017.

The "A Half Century of Hope, A Legacy of Life and Love" study was conducted by researchers Moira Gaul and Mai W. Bean from the institute to celebrate 50 years of life-saving services.

The study states, "A half century ago, as legal abortion was gaining ground in the United States, a campaign was afoot to offer hope to women considering abortion. The first free-standing pregnancy center in North America opened its doors in 1968 in Toronto, Canada, under the name of Birthright."

The report goes on to say, "Louise Summerhill, the founder of Birthright, traveled to the U.S. to share about their non-judgmental, confidential, and free pregnancy outreach model, 'rooted in love for both' mom and baby."

Soon thousands of pregnancy resource centers would open their doors.

The report analyses last years impact of 2,600 of the estimated 2,750 centers in the U.S. and looked at the scope of medical and social services they offered. The report also features testimonies of clients dating as far back as 35 years.

The centers involved in the study were asked to complete one of two online surveys which were "distributed by their national network, parent organization, and/or pregnancy center state coalition or regional leader."

Based on the results of the survey and statistical analysis the researchers were able to conclude that in 2017, approximately 2 million people in the U.S. were able to receive free services which saved communities an estimated \$161 million.



Services "including pregnancy tests, options consultation, sexual risk avoidance education, parenting and prenatal education, ultrasound and medical services, community referrals, and material support" were offered to women, youth, and men.

The study also found that 400,100 free ultrasounds were administered, registered nurses and medical sonographers contributed 400,100 hours of free services last year and 679,600 free pregnancy tests were given out last year.

Approximately 67,400 people volunteered at pregnancy centers and 7,500 medical professionals offered their time and skills to conduct services for free.

The centers also reported having seen around 24,000 clients for after-abortion support including counseling and referrals when appropriate. Finally, the centers saw over one million students attend community-based sexual risk avoidance education presentations.

The report retorts, "Pregnancy centers have grown into a global movement and remain 'a testimony to love in action."

Atlanta Reaches \$1.2M Settlement With Ex-Fire Chief Fired Over Christian Views on Sex, Marriage

The city of Atlanta has reached a settlement with Kelvin Cochran, its former fire chief, who was fired after he distributed a book at work in which he detailed his views on sexual morality.

Atlanta's Fox News affiliate has reported that the city agrees to pay Cochran \$1.2 million in the settlement. In 2013, the former fire chief penned a book about his faith that he gave to approximately a dozen others whom he said had either asked for a copy or who shared his views.

Yet because his book took an unfavorable stance toward homosexuality, among other things, he was ousted in January 2015. Then-mayor Kasim Reed said that Cochran had violated city policy by promoting the book while on the job. The book, a 162-page men's devotional titled Who Told You That You Were Naked?, briefly mentions the biblical perspective on sexual ethics and morality.

Reed initially said Cochran would have to undergo "sensitivity training" and in November 2014 was put on a 30-day suspension without pay but was ultimately fired.

Cochran then filed a federal lawsuit and was represented by Christian legal group Alliance Defending Freedom. Together they contended that the city had violated his free speech and due-process rights and that his reputation had been marred such that he could no longer find employment as a firefighter.

"Given my history and work throughout my career and with the city of Atlanta, I was shocked that writing a book and encouraging Christian men to be the husbands and fathers and men that God had called us to be, would jeopardize my 34-year career," Cochran said.

The Atlanta City Council voted 11-3 on the specific amount of damages and attorneys' fees it owes Cochran following negotiations with attorneys at Alliance Defending Freedom.

"The government can't force its employees to get its permission before they engage in free speech. It also can't fire them for exercising that First Amendment freedom, causing them to lose both their freedom and their live-



lihoods," ADF Senior Counsel Kevin Theriot, who represented Cochran in court last year, said in a statement.

In December 2017, the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Georgia ruled that Atlanta's rules restricting non-work speech, such as Cochran's book, were too wide and had enabled the city to discriminate against viewpoints with which they disagreed and, therefore, did "not pass constitutional muster."

"This policy would prevent an employee from writing and selling a book on golf or badminton on his own time and, without prior approval, would subject him to firing. It is unclear to the court how such an outside employment would ever affect the city's ability to function, and the city provides no evidence to justify it. ...The potential for stifled speech far outweighs any unsupported assertion of harm," the text of the ruling read.

In 2012, Cochran was named "Fire Chief of the Year" by Fire Chief
