










DaySpring Baptist Church Builds in Waukesha

If you have traveled along I-94 in the Waukesha area, you will have noticed a new church that was just constructed, Daysping Baptist Church. DaySpring Baptist Church was founded in May of 2009 by Daniel and Aimee Reehoff along with their two sons, Bryce and Cole.



The first services were held at the Comfort Suites hotel in Pewaukee. They soon grew out of the hotel facilities and began renting the Center for Excellence School in Waukesha. In the spring of 2016 DaySpring purchased 36 acres of land on Silvernail Road in the town of Delafield and in the summer of 2017 broke ground for the brand new 33,000 square foot facility, First services were held in July of 2018.

The building was built with thousands of hours of volunteer labor, not only from the church itself but also from many churches all around the



Midwest. The church service times are: Lifegroups at 10 o'clock on Sunday, followed by morning worship service at 11 AM. A Bible study and prayer meeting is also held at 6 PM on Sundays. Friday night there is a RU Recovery Program to those that struggle with addicting habits. A Preschool and Daycare were opened in the fall of 2018 as well as a Christian School for K through 12 grades.








A Word From the Heart

Former Planned Parenthood Manager Joins Pro-Life Organization

On the heels of the largest 40 Days for Life fall campaign, which saw people gather in over 400 cities around the world to pray to end abortion, the pro-life organization today announced it will welcome former Planned Parenthood clinic manager Sue Thayer as Director of Outreach.


"Sue has been an active participant in 40 Days for Life and our effort to end abortion," said Shawn Carney, CEO and president of 40 Days for Life. "Her passion and dedication led to the same clinic she once managed being shut down. It was the first of 20 abortion facilities in Iowa to close just three months after Sue led her initial 40 Days for Life Campaign."

Thayer worked as the manager of the Storm Lake, Iowa Planned Parenthood for more than 17 years. When she started with the company, she felt it was an opportunity to help women, but as the tactics of Planned Parenthood were revealed, including the regular practice of webcam abortions, which are done without a qualified medical professional present, she quickly grew concerned. As Thayer reached out to pro-life organizations, she realized there was a better way to assist women in need. Since leaving Planned Parenthood, Thayer has been a dedicated 40 Days for Life volunteer, leading a campaign out-

side the same Planned Parenthood clinic she managed.

As Director of Outreach for 40 Days for Life, Thayer will assist former abortion facility workers interested in leaving the abortion industry and aid campaign leaders in organizing and leading a local 40 Days for Life campaign.

"I am honored to be officially joining 40 Days for Life. As a former Planned Parenthood employee, I know exactly what these workers are experienc-



ing when they walk away from working at an abortion facility," said Thayer. "In my new role, I will be right there to help them through the transition. I am also really looking forward to working with local campaign leaders, providing them with encouragement and support as they continue to save lives and be a force for change."

Inspiring Missionary Radio Program Passes Milestone

FEBC Today` reaches 400 stations, millions of listeners with news of how international broadcast ministry continues to take gospel to unreached communities around the world



Missionary radio broadcaster FEBC (Far East Broadcasting Company, www.febc. org) has reached another media milestone as a 400th

North American Christian station adds the inspiring FEBC Today (www.febctoday.org) show to its lineup.

Featuring FEBC USA President and CEO Ed Cannon, the two-minute daily update reports to audiences in the United States and Canada how the broadcast ministry is reaching people with the gospel everywhere, from remote to major metropolitan areas of the world.

Approaching its 75th year of broadcasting, FEBC reaches a potential listening audience of 4 billion people worldwide through its network

of 149 overseas stations and transmitters, with a focus on those with little or no access to the gospel. Almost 900 hours of programming are offered daily, in 113 languages and dialects. Last year, the ministry received more than 2.5 million letters, texts and emails from listeners and 5 million online responses.

Launched in 2016, FEBC Today has encouraged domestic listeners in their faith as they hear how radio and other cutting-edge communications technologies are helping extend God's kingdom, and moved them to pray for and support FEBC and other Christian broadcasters in their world evangelizationefforts. Among the FEBC Today users is the Bott Radio Network, with 100 stations in 15 states reaching more than 50 million people.

"It's been so encouraging to see how people who appreciate the value of Christian radio in their own lives have recognized its importance and impact in helping share the good news with those who have yet to hear it," said Cannon, who brings first-hand reports from his international travels leading the ministry.

DEMOCRAT RESIGNS AFTER POSTING, 'I STAND FOR THE FLAG, I KNEEL AT THE CROSS'



The former executive director of the Allegheny County Democratic Party in Pennsylvania says he was forced out because of an old Facebook post that showed a picture of him and his wife with the words, "I stand for the flag, I kneel at the cross."

But he says he has no regrets.

"I'm not ashamed of my patriotism, not one bit. I fought for this country. I think I have a right to have a voice and be patriotic," the former executive director, Mark Salvas, told KDKA-TV in Pittsburgh.

Salvas is a veteran of the Gulf War.

"I was asked by the chair of the Allegheny County Democratic Party to resign my position due to the controversy that was taking place on social media, and I did," Salvas told KDKA. "It's never easy when people you have never met accuse you of things and call you names, and you've never met them."

PARENTS PULL KIDS FROM THE BOY SCOUTS, CHOOSE FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATION INSTEAD

More and more Christian parents are pulling their kids from the Boy Scouts of America in exchange for a faith-based organization, CBN News reports.

According to the outlet, many Christian parents who do not agree with the new secular policies of BSA are pulling their kids out of the century-old scouting organization and opting for Trail Life USA, a faith-based alternative.

Since the BSA policy change in 2015 that allowed gay adults to lead boy scout troops and the 2017 decision to allow girls and transgender boys to join troops, many Christian parents

have moved away from the organization that once emphasized the importance of a nuclear family.

According to World, Trail Life, which was founded in 2014, has

seen significant growth since these decisions were made. The outlet reports that the organization now has over 27,000 members and around 800 troops across all 50 states.

Trail Life USA has its moral compass pointing toward Christ. "People know boys and girls are





90,000 Young People Gather to Hear the Gospel, Kickstart "A New Jesus Movement"



Some 90,000 people came together this week at the Texas Motor Speedway to praise Jesus and hear the word of Christ.

A Minneapolis-based ministry called PULSE hosted an event called "Together 2018" last year in an effort to set hearts on fire for Christ and the Bible.

According to CBN News, PULSE partnered with over 1,000 churches across the country in order to coordinate the event. "Together 2018" featured major Christian artists like Jesus Culture, Bethel Music, Lecrae, Hillsong, and Jonathan Taylor and invite speakers including Robert Morris, Francis Chan, Todd White and Ravi Zacharias among others to share the Good News.

Charisma News reports that while there were 90,000 people present at the event, an additional 13,000 people from 89 different countries watched the event live online.

Nick Hall, the founder of PLUSE, said that this event is the beginning of "a new Jesus movement."

"Similar to today, 1970s America experienced a culturally tense time. Young Christians responded with Expo '72, a Jesus Movement gathering in Dallas to equip, pray, and worship. 46 years later, tens of thousands of Christians gathered at the Texas Motor Speedway for Together 2018. A generation was trained to move closer to one another as we move closer to Jesus and the world He loves," a statement released by PLUSE read.

Preacher Todd White found the event to be a wakeup call to young people. White wrote on Instagram, "A GENERATION IS RISING UP! I'm so encouraged by what is happening at Together 2018 in Dallas! We must live as an example of a life that is a flame for Jesus! Igniting fires no matter where we go! Setting the captives free! We are Revival!!!!!!"

Christian author Ravi Zacharias, who was invited to speak at the event, called it a "joy" to be a part of. Zacharias took to Instagram to say, "It was really encouraging to see how engaged the audience was during the message, particularly the young who had come from far and wide."

He continued, "Young people today want to think and they want to know with certainty why it is that the gospel is true and why it is relevant. That's what I tried to focus on in my message, ultimately pointing them to the cross of Jesus Christ which is truly the intersection of history and the crossroads of life itself."

The event appears to have been a success, but for PLUSE, this is just the beginning.

A statement posted to Facebook by the organization noted, "This was a national gathering of believers with a commissioning to bring back the gospel to their cities and homes. Together 2018 wasn't the end of an amazing campaign - it was just the beginning."

ADF to Supreme Court: WWI memorial cross deserves to stand

Alliance Defending Freedom filed a friend-of-the-court brief with the U.S. Supreme Court on behalf of retired Major General Patrick Brady, a Medal of Honor recipient and one of the most decorated soldiers in American history, plus seven veterans groups representing thousands of living veterans. The brief supports the American Legion's efforts to protect a World War I memorial in Bladensburg, Maryland, which the American Humanist Association wishes to either uproot or destroy merely because the memorial is in the shape of a cross.

"Bladensburg's 'Peace Cross' honors veterans who gave everything to serve their country, but one group's displeasure over the monument's shape can't diminish their sacrifice or dismantle their memory," said ADF Senior Counsel and Vice President of U.S. Litigation David Cortman. "The Supreme Court was right to take up this case so that it has the opportunity to affirm that the offended feelings of someone driving by does not amount to a constitutional crisis. A passive monument like the Bladensburg Cross, which celebrates our veterans and acknowledges our nation's religious heritage, simply does not amount to an establishment of religion."

Originally funded by private dollars and placed on private land, the memorial became a historical site in a busy, public intersection. Because it's shaped like a cross, the American Humanist Association sued to remove it, and the Fourth Circuit found the memorial to be unconstitutional, suggesting the cross should be removed or that its arms should be chopped off. But the American Legion asked the Supreme Court to take the case and overturn that lower court decision. The Supreme Court agreed. A friend-of-the-court brief authored by ADF and K&L Gates asks the Court to ensure that "existing memorials are undisturbed and protected as public monuments to venerate the honor, valor, and sacrifice of those who have died in service to this country." The brief further argues that "Irlemoving the Bladensburg



Memorial would not further Respondents' religious liberty. It would only show disrespect for the brave service members the cross was meant to honor."

A key legal issue presented is the question of what legal test should determine when the government is establishing religion. ADF's brief argues that the Court should overrule current, ahistorical, incoherent tests "and replace it with a liberty-based principle that is guided by our nation's history. The test should protect individuals from the government forcing them to participate in or directly finance religious exercise, and from being subjected to the creation of a government establishment of religion. But the test should not result in the complete banishment of any religious language or symbolism—including language or symbolism that someone might associate with religion—from the public square."

FACEBOOK APOLOGIZES AFTER BAN-NING FRANKLIN GRAHAM FOR 'HATE SPEECH'

Evangelist Franklin Graham was banned from Facebook over a post he wrote two years ago and now Facebook is apologizing.

The evangelist took to Facebook to disclose to his followers that he had been banned from Facebook for 24 hours after Facebook determined that a 2016 post about the North Carolina House

Bill 2 – the bathroom bill – violated community standards.

The post read, "Bruce Springsteen, a long-time gay rights activist, has cancelled his North Carolina concert. He says the NC law #HB2 to prevent men from being able to use women's restrooms and locker rooms is going 'backwards instead of forwards.' Well, to be honest, we need to go back! Back to God. Back to respecting and honoring His commands. Back to common sense."

Graham later received an apology from the social media platform. "It looks like we made a mistake and removed something you posted on Facebook that didn't go against our Community standards. We want to apologize and let you know that we've restored your content and removed any blocks on your account related to this incorrect action."

Graham wrote on Sunday, "I thank Facebook for their apology and I accept it.



Samaritan Ministries a Winner in Four-Year Religious Freedom Legal Battle Regarding Abortifacients

Samaritan`s More Than 80,000 Households Do Not Share in Medical Needs for Unbiblical Practices But Instead Affirm Life

Last month, six Christian organizations won a religious freedom case after a four-year legal battle to defend operating their ministries according to their deeply held Biblical beliefs.

One of the groups was Samaritan Ministries International (samaritanministries.org), one of the leading health care sharing ministries in America.

On Dec. 11, a federal district court issued an order that "permanently prevents the federal government from enforcing the Affordable Care Act's abortion-pill mandate against six Christian organizations," reported Alliance Defending Freedom, which represented the group. The order also declares that the mandate violates the organizations' rights protected by the federal Religious Freedom Restoration Act.

"For our 25 years in existence, Samaritan Ministries has respected the sanctity of life and has never asked our members to share in the medical expense of an abortifacient that would end the life of a preborn baby," said Anthony Hopp, Samaritan's vice president of external relations. "Millions of Americans can't control where their health care dollars go and don't have a say if they are indirectly funding ungodly practices like abortion. But Samaritan members can know they will not be asked to send any of their monthly shares to help pay for anything that dishonors God."

According to the ADF, the previous administration's mandate forced most employers, regardless of their religious or moral convictions,



to provide abortion-inducing drugs through their health plans under threat of heavy penalties. The current administration's Department of Justice abandoned this flawed mandate.

"Religious organizations have the freedom to peacefully operate according to their beliefs without the threat of punishment by the government. (This) order fully affirms that freedom and provides permanent protection from the mandate," said ADF Senior Counsel Gregory S. Baylor in a statement. "These faith-based organizations no longer have to fear being forced to pay fines for simply abiding by the Christian beliefs that they teach and espouse."

Samaritan was joined for this case by the Association of Christian Schools International, Taylor University, Indiana Wesleyan University, Asbury Theological Seminary and ADF in the specific objection to sharing in expenses or providing coverage for abortifacients.

American Family Association Goes Head to Head with Netflix Over '13 Reasons Why'

AFA Works to Reach 200,000 Signatures on Petition Urging Netflix to Pull Damaging Teen Series That Focuses on Suicide, Sexual Assault and Drugs

TUPELO, Miss.—For many months, the American Family Association (AFA, www.afa.net) has been educating parents and families about the tragic story of Anna Bright, the 14-year-old daughter of Joseph and Patrice Bright who committed suicide after binge-watching Netflix's damaging teen series, "13 Reasons Why."



content is only exacerbated with story lines that include sodomy, homosexuality, drug use, extreme profanity and a plot for mass school violence.

Wildmon noted that just two days before Anna's sad death, another young girl had already done the unthinkable—copied what she had seen in the Netflix series and took her own life. He said he was devastated when he received a second heartbreaking letter from a grieving mother whose daughter became a victim after being influenced by this show.

AFA has also been committed to urging Netflix

to pull the show from the streaming service—before another young life is lost or negatively influenced. AFA has gathered tens of thousands of petition signatures to Netflix CEO Reed Hastings, and is working hard to reach 200,000 signatures so Netflix leadership will take notice. More than 140,000 have already signed the petition.

Now, AFA is calling on concerned families to help spread the word about this series in a different way.

"We know '13 Reasons Why' is a dark and demonic primer for impressionable young people, inviting them to enter a realm of perversion, hatred and violence," Wildmon said. "I have written a letter to Reed Hastings, urging him to meet with me personally so I can share my concerns and families' concerns. I know of at least four suicides that have been linked to the storyline of '13 Reasons Why.' We need families to help us warn as many parents as possible by letting them know about '13 Reasons Why' so we're asking our friends and supporters to take our message and send it to everyone in their address book, especially those who have teenagers in their home."

Season 1 focused on the graphic suicide of Hannah Baker, who slits her wrists in a bathtub full of water. Her decision to end her life is explained through a collection of cassette tapes that she leaves behind blaming the people responsible for her death. Season 2 picks up months after Hannah's suicide, and sadly, the filth and gratuitous

Besides the grave suicide implications, a Fox News affiliate in Washington, D.C., reported last week that a sexual assault incident at a Maryland high school bore similarities to a violent rape scene from "13 Reasons Why." Five students at that Maryland school were charged with rape or attempted rape as of Nov. 1.

AFA suggests the following message that those concerned about this Netflix show can send to their contacts:

"I wanted to let you know about a petition that I signed to Netflix CEO Reed Hastings. Through the American Family Association (AFA), I learned of a show called '13 Reasons Why' that is airing on Netflix right now. 

Stephen Colbert Shares the Moment He Decided to Follow Christ, Says, "My Life Has Never Been the Same"

"The Late Show" host Stephen Colbert shared the moment he turned away from atheism and back to Christianity with America Media recently.

According to CBN News, Colbert was brought up Catholic, but at some point, he turned away from religion, believing that the God he was raised to believe in was not real.

That mindset would be flipped on its head, however, by a gift from a kind stranger one cold day in Chicago.



Colbert told the interviewer, Fr. James Martin, a Jesuit priest, that he cracked open the frozen pocket bible to the glossary and turned to the first verse on dealing with anxiety.

"It was Matthew, chapter 5, it was the Sermon, 'And so I say to you, do not worry, for who among you by worrying can change a single hair



on his head or add a cubit to the span of his life?' And I was absolutely, immediately lightened," Colbert recalled. "For the first time, I understood the real meaning of the phrase, 'It spoke to me.' Like it read off the page, the words of Christ read off the page," he continued.

Colbert said he stood on the street corner on that cold Chicago day until he read Jesus' entire Sermon on the Mount.

"My life has never been the same," Colbert stated.

Earlier in the interview, Fr. Martin asked the CBS host how he envisioned God to look.

Colbert said, "It's Christ, it's Jesus."

He continued, "It's not the old man with a beard, it's not the Old Testament God. If you're really looking for literal imagery, what I think of when I think of God, I think of Jesus, and then that image dissolves, because I then try to subsume that single image into the Trinity."



ABC Anchor Dan Abrams Launches Sermon Streaming Service

ABC News' chief legal correspondent Dan Abrams is launching a new streaming service which will live stream Christian sermons.



According to a report from an online outlet called The Hill, Ambo TV will be launching in November and its goal is to broadcast "Christian sermons with an in-studio discussion."

According to a statement from Abram's new company Mediaite, Ambo TV, which also means Pul-

pit TV, is expected to feature continuous and simultaneous sermons on Saturdays and Sundays, along with added commentary throughout the day.

CBN News reports that Ambo TV has already secured partnerships with Victory Church in Tulsa and the multi-site Fresh Light Church, in Montana who will be streaming their sermons on Ambo TV.

"The network will be hosted out of the newly built Abrams Media studios in Herald Square in New York City, and viewers will be able to engage with other viewers in a live-chat feature through the programs," the company's statement reads.

Yale Divinity School graduate Brooke Girley is set to lead the streaming network which she described as an "inspirational network for younger Christians" that is "long overdue."

"Ambo TV will allow viewers to watch compelling sermons, in real time, from pastors of my generation and discuss them with other viewers from around the world," she said. "This is the type of network many of us have been waiting for, and I'm thrilled to be a part of creating it."

Abrams' long-term goal is for Ambo TV to expand broadcast past the weekend and to have sermons play throughout the week.

Cross miraculously left standing amid rubble of town destroyed by Calif.'s wildfire: 'God is with us'

A large wooden cross that was left untouched by the California wildfires is serving as a reminder of God's faithfulness to a town almost entirely destroyed by the inferno.

On Facebook, Our Savior Lutheran Church Pastor Brandon Merrick posted a photo of the cross two days after flames devastated the town of Paradise along with the 54-year-old church building and the parsonage where his wife and two children lived.

"This picture is not just a heartbreaking reminder of what can happen to the things and people of this world, this is our one true hope in the midst of tragedy



that cannot be destroyed by anything," he captioned the photo.

"God is with us. God is holding you right now as you read this note and He wants nothing more than for you to see Him through the cross where He draws us to the only place His mercy and forgiveness are found. In this picture I understand how in the cross we see both the ultimate consequence of our sin in death and the new life we have with Jesus."

The pastor reminded his grieving congregation that "the hard work of the people of Our Savior Lutheran over the last 54 years, some who are still with us, was not lost in the fire because the cross still stands."

World's First Christian Airline Is Set to Launch, Will Provide Churches, Missionaries with Easier Travel

A Texas-based aviation ministry announced last week that they are working to become the first Christian airline in the world.

According to CBN News, the ministry called Judah 1 shared last week that the Federal Aviation Administration had accepted their application to become its own airline as opposed to a private operator.

Currently, Judah $\,1\,$ is providing their service to Christians traveling domestically and internationally for mission trips and religious tours, CBN News reports.

"We serve missions minded Christian people of all denominations traveling to the mission fields of the world. Our planes have delivered hundreds of missionaries and transported thousands of pounds of cargo. It is very rewarding to know how many Judah 1 and our partners have helped. This includes the thousands who have been seen in medical clinics and the thousands who have accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior. It is our passion to help you reach the estimated two and a half billion people who do not know Jesus and it only takes YOUR HANDS, GOD'S LOVE, OUR WINGS," the ministry's website details.

Judah 1 is working to become an airline to make the traveling experience for missionaries easier. In a video outlining the ministry's

growth plan, the ministry's founder and CEO Everett Aaron noted that this move will eliminate the hecticness of security checks and lost baggage at traditional airports.

Aaron wrote in the announcement on the website that this move will also allow the ministry to help even more people. He wrote, "This means Judah 1 (upon receiving its DOT and 121 Certification) will have the freedom to transport as many different churches and mission organizations as we can." He added. "And we do so with that other kind of faith as well," he added.

"And just as generations of Americans have carried those who have taken to the skies in the defense of freedom borne upon their prayers, I want to assure all of you, who will be called to this enterprise, that you can be confident. You can be confident that you will go with the prayers of millions of Americans who will claim on your behalf, as generations have claimed before, those ancient words, that if you 'rise on the wings of the dawn, if you settle on the far side of the sea,' even if you go up to the heavens, 'even there His hand will guide you, His right hand will hold you fast.' And He will hold fast this great nation in the great beyond," he concluded.

ALMOST 42 MILLION ABORTIONS PER-FORMED IN 2018; MORE DEATHS THAN FROM CANCER, AIDS, TRAFFIC ACCI-**DENTS**

There were approximately 41.95 million abortions carried out around the world in 2018, an organization that tracks death statistics reported.

Christian Daily Reporter was one of a number of websites to note the statistics on Worldometers on December 31, which issues live tallies on global births and deaths, based on statistics published by the World Health Organization.

The website, which is now displaying the statistics for 2019, said that 8.2 million people died from cancer in 2018, while there were 1.7 million victims of HIV/AIDS.

Overall, the deaths by abortion outnumbered those from cancer, malaria, HIV/AIDS, smoking, alcohol, and traffic accidents put together.



Legendary Songwriter Don Moen Reveals Heartbreaking Story Behind 'God Will Make a Way'



"God Will Make a Way" is one of the most well-known worship songs of all time, inspiring millions around the world with its hopeful lyrics.

But according to legendary Christian singer-songwriter and worship leader Don Moen, the song was born out of extreme tragedy.

"I got a call from my mother-in-law late one night, and she told me that my wife's sister and her husband,

Craig and Susan Phelps, had been involved in a tragic car accident while taking their kids on a ski trip," he recounted to The Christian Post. "All four of their children were thrown out of the vehicle, and the oldest, a 9-year-old boy, was killed instantly. The other three were seriously injured."

"It was life-altering; I didn't know what to say to them," he continued. "Craig was a Bible teacher at his church, and they were both full of faith. As I sat on the plane, wondering what I should say to them, I began to read in the book of Isaiah, and chapter 43, verse 19 stood out to me: 'I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.' Instantly, the Lord gave me a song to sing to them."

Privately, Moen performed the song for his grieving in-laws, which includes the poignant lyrics, "Oh, God will make a way/Where there seems to be no way/He works in ways we cannot see/He will make a way for me."

"It was a song written in desperation, but it brought a word of hope to them," he told CP. "When everything around you seems lost, God is working in ways you cannot see."

"God Will Make a Way" would become the award-winning hallmark song of Moen's career, sung by millions around the world. He shares the inspiration behind the song in his debut book, God Will Make A Way: Discovering His Hope in Your Story.

"I've never written a book before and I thought, 'If I'm going to write one, I'm going to write about something that was a life-changing experience," he said.

In his book, Moen uses personal stories and Scripture to remind readers that God does not forget His children and remains faithful—even when all hope seems lost.

"So often, people look at their lives and everything is going fine," he said. "Then you lose your job, go through a divorce, lose a family, or receive a devastating health diagnosis. These things can rock your world and you think, 'How am I going to find hope in my story?' All they can see is hopelessness."

"I want people to know that God is with them in spite of loss and hopelessness. If you look close enough, you can see the hand of God in your life."

God Will Make a Way features a foreword from world champion boxer Manny Pacquiao, whom Moen referred to as a "friend" and a "personal hero."

"I met Manny in the '90s, and we've since become good friends," he said. "I don't ever want to take advantage of my friendships with people, but because he believes in the message — that God will make a way for him — he wanted to write the foreword to the book. When he was just a little boy and had nothing, God made a way for him. The song resonates with Manny and with Filipinos all over the world. It's become sort of a theme song."

The award-winning songwriter, who has sold over five million records during his career, told CP that his music is birthed out of his deep love for Christ and desire to speak to the human experience.

"If you analyze my songs, you'll see that a lot of them are prayers," he said. "Life situations motivate me. I'm not the kind of songwriter that sits down in the morning and writes a song; I want to write songs that go beyond the intellect and emotion and really reach deep and touch people in their spirit. That's what will change a life.

"I want readers to know that God isn't finished with them. He is going to do something new and make a road in the wilderness."

MAN'S PERSONAL BIBLE UNTOUCHED BY FIRE THAT DESTROYED HOME

A Texas man's personal Bible survived a fire that destroyed his home, and he is calling it an example of God's faithfulness.

Charles House of Tyler, Texas, was living in a tiny home when it caught fire Friday morning. Firefighters were called around 4:30 a.m., according to KLTV.

"I looked up and my whole bedroom was on fire," House said. "All I could do was just jump up and run out the house."

He was saving for a larger place and had converted a storage building into the tiny home. House said he nearly passed out trying to escape.

But one thing was left: his Bible. As he walked through the rubble, KLTV reported, House

spotted an unscathed book surrounded by charred items. "He said His Word would not perish, and the Bible did not burn," House said. "It was scorched but it did not burn."

House added, "You can take it away, but you can never stop His word. I'm a witness to that right now. Seeing that Bible, in the middle of that fire ... it didn't burn that Bible."

FROM THE DESK OF FRANKLIN GRA-HAM: HOW YOU CAN PRAY THIS NEW YEAR

Dear Friend,

For many people 2019 will begin with excitement and a great sense of hope-and I pray that this is true for you now. But for many families in California, the year will start out in ruins and ashes. Less than two months ago, the state's deadliest wildfire destroyed the town of Paradise, killed more than 80

people, and left tens of thousands homeless.

Two days after the fires started, we deployed chaplains with the Billy Graham Rapid Response Team to California to comfort and pray with survivors and

first responders. So far, we've encouraged and prayed with thousands of people affected by the disaster, and we plan to be there for months. The stories we are hearing are



heartbreaking-but we are seeing God move in amazing ways.

Three weeks from now, I'll be in Bangkok, the capital of Thailand. Out of every 100 people who live in the city, 94 are Buddhist, four

are Muslim, and less than two are Christians. Churches there have invited me to come preach the Gospel, and we count on your prayers.

Old Dominion University star Quarterback Blake LaRussa broke the news that he would be graduating from the four-year university early to pursue a life in ministry.

Chicago Bears Kicker Cody Parkey Misses Game Winning Field Goal, Praises God Anyway

Athletes often point to the sky after scoring as a way to thank God. Chicago's Cody Parkey, though, pointed heavenward Sunday after missing what would have been a game-winning kick against Philadelphia in the opening round of the NFL playoffs.

Parkey – who had made three field goals earlier in the game – then joined other Christian athletes midfield for a post-game prayer.

Plenty of sports fans noticed.

"Parkey's reaction is a great reminder that there are many more important things than football," Jason Romano of Sports Spectrum wrote on the organization's website. After the miss, he slumped over in dejection. Teammates consoled him, and he then pointed to the sky.



"I feel terrible. I let the team down. It's on me," Parkey said. "... "Sun's going to shine tomorrow. Life's going to go on. Unfortunately, it's going to sting for a while."

Football fans on social media also noticed Parkey pointing heavenward.

Focus on the Family: Wait No More Celebrates 10 Years of Inspiring Families to Prepare Hearts, Homes for Kids in Foster Care

Last month, Focus on the Family marked the 10th anniversary of its first-ever Wait No More event, which encourages prospective foster and adoptive families through education, inspiration and personal testimonies.

Recently, 319 people attended Wait No More at New Life Church in Colorado Springs, Colorado – where the first event was held 10 years ago – to hear about the needs of waiting kids in Colorado foster care.

According to Focus on the Family, 6,752 children and youth are in Colorado's foster care system, with nearly 290 children and teens still waiting for a family. The ministry noted that the state has more than

3,800 churches, and "God has given Christians clear commands to care for orphans."

"These kids are dealing with feelings of rejection, fear and mistrust, and we want to shine the light of God's love to them through recruiting nurturing foster care and adoption homes," said Dr. Sharen Ford, the program director of advocacy for children at Focus on the Family, in a press release.

As a result of the event at New Life Church, 105 families reportedly initiated the process of foster care, adoption from foster care, or support for families that take on these responsibilities.

3 c. old fashioned oats

1 1/2 c. flour

1 c. brown sugar

3/4 tsp. salt

1/2 tsp. baking soda

1 c. butter, melted

1 1/4 c. strawberry preserves*

Preheat oven to 400°. Grease a 13 x 9 baking pan. In a large bowl, combine oats, flour, brown sugar, salt and baking soda. Add butter and stir until mixed. Reserve 1 cup of mixture; press remaining onto bottom of pan. Spread preserves evenly over base to within 1/2 inch of edge of pan. Sprinkle with reserved mixture. Bake 20-25 minutes or until golden brown. Cool completely; cut into bars.





Notorious 'career criminal' now preaches Jesus to prisoners: 'Abundant life can be found in the jailhouse'

A former drug addict-turned-pastor who was arrested 35 times and sentenced to prison five times for eight felony convictions has opened up about the series of events that led him to Christ and why his mission is to tell others that abundant life is possible, even in prison.

The first time Scott Highberger got arrested he was just 12 years old. Growing up in Michigan City, Indiana, he was surrounded by dysfunction and substance abuse from a young age — and it wasn't long before he began to adopt the habits surrounding him.

"I was a really angry kid who learned how to solve my problems through violence and fighting, and I ended up in a juvenile detention center at 12 years old," he told The Christian Post. "Around that time, I started drinking, and that started a domino effect of committing crimes and abusing drugs and alcohol."

Unable to stay out of trouble, Highberger dropped out of school in the ninth grade. By the time he was 17, he'd been arrested so many times that authorities placed him in an adult prison instead of trying him as a child. From there, he became trapped in a constant cycle of drinking, drugs, and prison stints, culminating in a 12-year sentence for selling drugs.

"I lived a very haphazard life with no real target or purpose," he said.

While living in a halfway house following his release from prison, Highberger began dating a woman who eventually gave birth to their son. One time, the couple went to a movie theater to watch "The Exorcism of Emily Rose," a film about a demon-possessed girl. Shortly into the film, Highberger said he experienced the "fear of God" for the first time in his life.

"I didn't know anything about God, but I knew it was God and it was just really crazy," he said. "I ended up going out in the parking lot, breaking down, crying my eyes out. I went home and got the Yellow Pages and started looking around for a church."

But God had different plans for Highberger's life: The very next day, he was arrested on a warrant he didn't even know about and found himself in prison yet again. This time, Highberger spent two weeks studying the Bible and eventually gave his life to Christ during a church service conducted in prison.

"I thought everything would change once I got out," he said. "I thought, 'I'm born again, things are going to be different. I'm going to marry my girlfriend, and we're going to have this incredible life together."

After returning home, however, Highberger's girlfriend told him she was leaving him and taking their son with her. Devastated, Highberger returned to his former lifestyle, looking to drugs and alcohol for comfort. He ultimately attempted to kill himself, ending up with 40 stitches in his arm.

But the lowest point of his life, Highberger said, was the night his ex-girlfriend allowed him to take care of their son by himself.

"I had begged her to let me take him for a night, and she finally let me," he recalled. "He was about 1-and-a-half years old. I got drunk and ended up driving to the ghetto to a crack house. I locked him in the car and got drugs, got back in the car, and drove home, smoking crack the whole way home with him in the backseat."

"She found out about it, and was understandably livid," he continued. "She told me I could never see my son again."

With multiple charges pending against him and nowhere to turn, Highberger once again attempted to kill himself by taking over 100 sleeping pills. When that proved unsuccessful, he fled the state and wound up homeless, traveling from Florida to Arizona.

"I would sleep in dumpsters and on the street and just beg for change to buy the next drug," he said. "I'd hit rock bottom. I was just so tired of my life."

Eventually, he returned to Indiana where he was once again arrested. But this time, things looked different.

"Jeremiah 29:13 says, 'If you seek me with your whole heart, you'll find me," he said. "At my lowest, I sought God — and I found Him in prison, and He just began to radically change my life."

Highberger developed an overwhelming thirst for the Bible, and after his release from prison would bike through sleet and snow to attend church services, volunteering wherever he could. Determined to save others from the life that nearly destroyed him, Highberger approached church leaders about starting a prison ministry.

What started as a one-week service for inmates led to four services a week — and today, Highberger, along with his wife Danielle, ministers to thousands of prisoners, leading them to freedom in Jesus Christ.

"Looking back, I see that all those years were God setting me up for a comeback, to become desperate for Him," he said. "To the outside world, prison is a place for punishment. For me, prison was a place to be alone with God, to begin a recovery process, to be away from negative influences, and to be stripped of everything. I found freedom in prison, and I want others to, as well."

Highberger shares his powerful story in his book, Behind the Wire: A Prisoner's Journey to the Pulpit. In it, he details practical, biblical steps individuals can take to find true freedom.


"I've handed out thousands of books to prisoners, and I've received so many letters from people sharing how it's changed their lives," he shared.

"Freedom isn't just about a physical location; it's a spiritual condition," he explained. "There's an invisible prison that holds many in its grip, and the only way out of that is through Jesus."

Today, Highberger serves as the outreach and prison pastor at Road to Life Church in Michigan City. Now reconnected with his son, the pastor says his message is simple: New life is possible through Christ — even for a career criminal.

"What I really preach from the rooftops is that Jesus leaves the 99 for that one," he said. "He left those 99 for me and he grabbed ahold of my life in prison. There is hope for that drug addict, the alcoholic, the career criminal, the one that is so far gone that you think they can never be redeemed."

"Abundant life," he added, "can be found right there in the jailhouse."
