


PASTORS AND CHRISTIAN WORKERS' APPRECIATION BREAKFAST

A Word From The Heart

The church in Thessalonica was a young church established by Paul during the early part of his second missionary trip (Acts, chapter 17). The gospel message was welcomed by both Jew and Gentile but was opposed by others. Paul had to flee for his life from there and make his escape during the night to Berea. From there Paul had to be safely sent to Athens and then on to Corinth. During Paul's stay in Corinth he wrote this letter to this newly founded church. The prominent theme is the second coming of Jesus. This young group of Christians was being confused by false teaching and misunderstood this important Doctrine as well as their need to stay in close fellowship to one another. There were unruly believers who began to mooch off fellow believers. They turned out to be "busy bodies" gathering tidbits of gossip and were of no help to the local church fellowship.



In chapter 5:12-14, Paul gives some insights to the congregation by urging them to recognize those who were serving them in a Christlike manner. It was easy to be fooled by gifted, yet unqualified men. It is not the active or spectacular person who is necessarily qualified. Humble service and care for others is easy to overlook in our self-obsessed society. Not only did the church leadership have a responsibility to care for others but the Christians were to live in peace with one another. That would mean learning how to live with and encourage other believers who had need of understanding in their growth and difficulties.

Each believer was to look out for ways to help others in their fellowship. In Chapter 5:13-14 Paul mentions three types of individuals that needed some looking after: "Now we exhort you brethren, warn those that are unruly, comfort the fainthearted, uphold the weak, be patient toward all."

Notice that each one is treated according to their own personal need of understanding.

1. *The unruly; the idle is to be warned.* This is the person who is always out of step and needs to be urged to walk in step and stay in rank, the one who always has a gripe about another believer or the church elders. I wonder how many pastors today are under pressure to join the protests that are happening all over America; to show that

they are concerned so they won't be criticized by the world around us, or to please those who demand it. It takes a lot of discernment to understand the role of the church in such violent times.

Warning someone can cause resentment on their part. It is never a pleasant task. We need to appeal directly to their conscience, reminding them of what they are in danger of forgetting. The Word of God gives the needed insight to keep the church from losing focus on the message of the gospel.

2. Encourage the fainthearted; comfort; console. The word is used in John 11:19-31. It is to comfort the bereaved; to console them.

Has a loved one just died? Are they downcast or disheartened? The current Covid 19 virus has not

allowed proper funerals to be held or church gatherings. We are to comfort them by helping them continue the battle. Some are discouraged on account of troubles and trials. Loss of jobs or businesses that once held promise that are now lost, perhaps forever. They need to be cheered up and stimulated. If you warn or belittle the fainthearted you will quench the Spirit in them. These people must be comforted and encouraged. We ought not to expect people to react exactly as we do during trials.

3. The last ones are the weak; those without strength. Not just a lack of physical strength, but rather the morally or spiritually weak. Those who are in need of sympathetic assistance. To uphold is the idea of supporting another "by keeping one's self over against the weak and uphold them." To put your arms around the weak and uphold them. The need for someone to raise them up. We might be called by the Lord to give our time and energy to another person who seems to always 'need someone' to lean on. True shepherding is far more than managing programs and overseeing a smooth-running machine. It is taking time for people. Time that may actually cause us to pay attention to what the Holy Spirit is doing among us.

I do believe that we can best use our spiritual energy these days by being aware of the needs of the local church and helping Christian workers to continue strong in their work for Christ without losing heart or support.



Surge in Requests for Gospel Literature Surprises Christian Workers in Persecution-Heavy India

An influx of requests from listeners in Odisha, India, is leaving workers at The Tide® (www.thetide.org) global radio ministry feeling surprised—and emboldened.

The Tide ministry sends gospel-centered, life-transforming literature to people in India and neighboring countries who want to learn more about Jesus. In the first half of 2020, workers received a surge of requests for literature about biblical Christianity from the state of Odisha—a phenomenon.



In the first few months of 2020, The Tide ministry sent out more than 1,700 literature packets to believers in the process of discipleship and listeners wanting to know more about Jesus. These packets include gospel tracts, discipleship booklets, and scripture portions. All of these resources give unbelievers an opportunity to learn about Jesus Christ and how they can live for him. For the persecuted Christian, these resources mean sustained hope and a stronger faith to fight against the fear and temptations surrounding life in a hostile country.



Ranked tenth on the Open Doors World Watch List for persecuted Christians, India is one of the most hostile countries in the world for those who profess Christ.

"Religious affiliation is included in the identity of Indian citizens," Shenk said. "New believers in Odisha not only have to go through the red tape of applying to the local magistrate to change their registered religion, but also risk persecution from family and community in this state, which some view as the Hindu homeland of India. It's

heartbreaking to imagine that the simple ritual of baptism to celebrate a life-giving relationship with Christ can actually be a lifethreatening act for those who choose to convert."

In Odisha, the first state in India to pass anti-conversion laws, choosing to follow Christ means harassment, threats, and sometimes even death. Despite this danger, the people of Odisha are listening to The Tide ministry's radio programs and reaching out to the ministry like never before.

After learning about Jesus from The Tide ministry's radio program, listener Dillip wrote, "I have come to know that Jesus Christ is the Savior of the world. Pray for me and please send me some of your literature."

For nearly 75 years, The Tide ministry has recorded and broadcasted Gospel programming in nine countries on three continents in 27 heart languages spoken by millions of people in multiple regions of Albania, Bhutan, India, Kosovo, Nepal, Nigeria, Pakistan, Thailand and Zimbabwe. Planned Parenthood of Greater New York announced the removal of Margaret Sanger's name on its clinics, causing many pro-life organizations to recognize the ironic link between this action and the continued practice of abortion.

Sanger, founder of the organization that would eventually be known as Planned Parenthood, is widely known to have championed the science of eugenics. Her research and influence focused on limiting the reproduction of those considered mentally and physically defective.

American Family Association (AFA, www.afa. net) Executive Vice President Ed Vitagliano says the realization is not a simple case of

Herman Cain Dies At 74 After Battling COVID-19: 'He Has Gone to Be With The Lord'

Herman Cain has died at 74 after being hospitalized with the coronavirus.

Cain's death was announced on his website by editor Dan Calabrese who said the conservative businessman and 2012 Republican presidential candidate had "gone to be with the Lord."

"Herman Cain — our boss, our friend, like a father to so many of us — has passed away," Calabrese said in the blog post. "We all prayed so hard every day. We knew the time would come when the Lord would call him home, but we really liked having him here with us, and we held out hope he'd have a full recovery."

Survivors include his wife, Gloria Etchison, and his two children, Melanie and Vincent, Calabrese said.

Cain, who was co-chair of Black Voices for Trump and survivor of stage 4 colon cancer, announced his COVID-19 infection on July 2, just over a week after attending a rally for President Donald Trump in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

According to a statement posted to his social media accounts at the time, he did not require a respirator and was "awake and alert" when he checked in to the hospital.

Cain's social media accounts occasionally provided updates on his condition. A message on July 5 said he was "making progress" and

that "more encouraging news" was expected to come soon. On July 10, another tweet said Cain himself described his status as "cruise control," because "the progress is slow but his breathing is getting stronger every day. Make no mistake: He is improving!"

"This is a tough virus, but we serve a tougher God. Herman wants to get back in action soon, so please continue praying," another tweet said.

Before moving into Republican politics and eventually becoming a presidential candidate, Cain had been a business executive and board chairman of a branch of Kansas City's Federal Reserve Bank. Last year, Trump briefly considered picking Cain as his nominee to join the Federal Reserve Board.

Throughout his career, Cain was open about his Christian faith and how it defined his life.

"Faith has been a big part of my life, all of my life. I joined the Baptist Church at the age of 10. It's the same church my parents joined in the mid-1940s," he said, according to Deseret News.

"Our parents took us to church," he said. "They were involved in the church. We got involved in the church. As I got older, my faith grew. ... You have to develop your own level of faith as you get older. It has always been a big part of my life."

Cain said his faith "was really tested in 2006 when I was diagnosed with stage-four cancer, but my faith helped me get through that experience. It has always been a big part of our lives and it always will. It shapes my values."

Several high-profile figures mourned Cain's death on social media.

"Herman Cain embodied the American Dream and represented the very best of the American spirit," tweeted White House Press Secretary Kayleigh McEnany. "Our hearts grieve for his loved ones, and they will remain in our prayers at this time. We will never forget his legacy of grace, patriotism, and faith."

Fox News correspondent Sara Carter tweeted, "I'm going to really miss him. Praying for his family in their time of sorrow. He was a great American."

Packer's Death at 93 Underscores His Pivotal Role in Defending the Authority of Holy Scripture over the Last Half-Century

A stalwart defender of the Christian doctrine of biblical inerrancy has gone home to glory, leaving a legacy that for decades has drawn praise and admiration from biblical Christians, including apologists and theologians.

J. I. Packer's death in July at the age of 93 closed a chapter in modern church history initiated by The Chicago Statement on Biblical Inerrancy (1978), which Packer co-authored with R. C. Sproul and SES President Emeritus Norm Geisler, both of whom predeceased Packer. After 42 years, the ICBI statement continues to etch a bright dividing line between orthodoxy rooted in the revealed Word of God and liberal relativism causing churches that embrace it to languish.

SES is one of the seminaries in North America still advocating for, and defending, biblical inerrancy. Dr. Richard Land, Southern Evangelical Seminary's president and a Christian Post editor, praises Packer's incalculable influence on the evangelical world, especially for defenders of biblical inerrancy.

"Dr. Packer's influence on evangelical Christianity over the last half-century cannot be over-estimated. His educational background from Corpus Christi College, Oxford, and his Ph.D. from the same university gave the evangelical world and the Chicago Statement a level of impact beyond the United States that it would have been difficult to achieve with just Dr. Geisler and Dr. Sproul. Their influence was immense in the United States, but Dr. Packer gave The Chicago Statement instant entrée and credibility into the larger English-speaking evangelical world. Personally, I can still remember what a God-send Packer's first well-known book. 'Knowing God,' was to me as I eagerly read

it as a first-year doctoral student at Oxford in 1973 when it first came out.

"It was always clear that Dr. Packer had drunk deeply from the rich well of Puritan theology, having done his doctoral thesis on Richard Baxter," Land continued. "Packer's personal devotional life reminds one of Baxter and continues to give both spiritual depth and powerful credibility to his biblical witness.

Land emphasizes that SES is deeply committed to carrying on the doctrine of inerrancy so fervently and articulately stated by Packer, Geisler and Sproul.

"His influence will live on wherever Holy Scripture is honored as God's Holy Word. With Dr. Packer having gone home to glory, the last of the 'big three' of the modern inerrancy movement is now gone. It is up to us to carry on the unceasing struggle to defend the absolute veracity of God's Word," Land said.

"Packer's numerous books and papers will continue to influence, shape and disciple future generations of Christian leaders. His books and the Chicago Statement will continue to exercise tremendous influence on Christianity as long as we live in an increasingly postmodern, morally relativistic world that questions the very concept of "Truth'," Land explained.

During a gathering of evangelical leaders in Chicago in 1978, The Chicago Statement of Biblical Inerrancy was created and signed by nearly 300 notable evangelical scholars. It was the first-of-its-kind statement on the authority of Scripture. Its closing paragraph expresses why the doctrine of inerrancy was important to defend in in 1978 and is even more critical in 2020.

"We are conscious too that great and grave confusion results from ceasing to maintain the total truth of the Bible whose authority one professes to acknowledge. The result of taking this step is that the Bible that God gave loses its authority, and what has authority instead is a Bible reduced in content according to the demands of one's critical reasoning and in principle reducible still further once one has started. This means that at bottom independent reason now has authority, as opposed to Scriptural teaching. If this is not seen and if for the time being basic evangelical doctrines are still held, persons denying the full truth of Scripture may claim an evangelical identity while methodologically they have moved away from the evangelical principle of knowledge to an unstable subjectivism, and will find it hard not to move further.

"We affirm that what Scripture says, God says. May He be glorified. Amen and Amen."

'Suited up for the battle': Mike Huckabee praises newly created group for conservative Christian legislators

Former Arkansas Gov. Mike Huckabee has expressed his support for a new organization for Christian elected officials seeking to advance socially conservative values through public policy.

The National Association of Christian Lawmakers, which was founded by Arkansas state Sen. Jason Rapert, held its charter meeting Aug. 4-5 at Destin, Florida, with legislators representing 23 states in attendance.

As part of the inaugural event, Huckabee was in attendance and received the NACL's American Patriot Award for Christian honor and courage.

"The primary difference is that it is actually comprised of elected officials in a legislative capacity. So this isn't just a group of activists, they certainly probably see themselves in that role, but they've been elected," said Huckabee.

"These are folks who have suited up for the battle, they've gone out into the arena, and have come off that field, blood on their jerseys and grass stains all over their face. So they better understand that this is not a philosophical engagement, it's a tactical engagement."

"[NACL is] a great opportunity to bring Christian legislators from around the country together for the purpose not only of camaraderie, fellowship, and encouragement, but also to develop policy ideas that would help their own constituencies better represent issues like religious liberty, sanctity of life, things that truly matter to believers," he explained.

As an adviser, Huckabee plans to be a "sounding board" for other members, and to "encourage them and to maybe even help them think through certain issues, and even tactics."

"Some of us have been around a while; a lot of the legislators are new, maybe in their first or second term. And others of us have been through many legislative battles in our lives and might have some insights. And we'll be available to be helpful to them as we can and as they desire," he added.

Huckabee hopes that the new group will advance ideas like the sanctity of life and religious liberty, through "thoughtful legislation" that he described as "court-proof." Former Congressman Bob McEwen of Ohio, who received the NACL's George Washington Lifetime Christian Leadership Award, gave the keynote speech on the first evening.

"This is the nation that maintains hope and opportunity for the rest of the world," said McEwen, declaring that "truth overcomes error."

There was also a prayer service held on the second day led by NACL advisers Pastor Happy Caldwell of Arkansas and Andrew Wommack of Wommack Ministries.

In an interview with CP on Monday, Rapert said he believed the meeting was a "smashing success" and was "very encouraged" by the proceedings, noting that their in-person attendees included elected officials from as far away states as Alaska and Arizona.

Rapert compared the NACL to the National Conference of State Legislatures, a nonpartisan organization that encourages cooperation and dialogue among state lawmakers.

"Much like the NCSL, but all from a biblical worldview," he explained. "I am proud of what we're doing. I am very proud that we have men and women from across the country that have come together intentionally to take a stand for God and country."







FCA Resources Equip Coach To Go Extra Mile for Volleyball Players **Despite COVID-19**

'It Isn't about Winning and Losing. It's about Glorifying Christ`



An FCA athlete-turned-coach and Huddle Leader is training her players to give 100% for others on and off the volleyball court, even during COVID-19 shutdowns.

Having grown up in a Christian home in Idaho, Lindsay Grant knew Jesus from a young age and came to understand what a personal relationship with Him meant by the time she hit high school. As a volleyball player in college, she attended an event hosted by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA, www. fca.org), and her relationship with Jesus exploded with growth.

"In college, I got invited to an FCA event and absolutely loved everything about it and what FCA stood for," Grant said. "Attending Huddles regularly and eventually becoming a leader helped me know Christ and find my identity in Him, not just as a Christian, but as a Christian athlete-and now a coach."

As a successful high school varsity volleyball coach, Grant has led her team to district titles three times and even to a fourth-place state trophy. For several years, she also has co-led FCA's middle school Huddle, opening up the chance to share about Christ and her faith. In time, several of the girls in her Huddle have become her players, paving the way for long-term impact.

"I believe God uses me as a high school coach to glorify and honor Him by having a positive impact on the girls I get to coach," Grant said. "It isn't about winning and losing. It's about glorifying Christ with the gift, abilities and knowledge He gives us."

FCA has provided Coach Grant with resources to help stabilize her athletes during the uncertain times brought on by COVID-19 and social unrest. These resources have included the FCA Coach's Bible, a leather, compact-sized Bible featuring 365 devotions written specifically for coaches and featuring Scripture references to encourage and equip them to spend regular time with God.

Grant also uses videos, devotionals, and icebreakers available on FCAResources.com, all of which help Huddle leaders as they plan FCA meetings.

Huddles give Grant opportunities to pass on life lessons to her players-including the importance of humbly relying on God, especially when things are beyond their control.

"Humility and the fact I am nothing without God," Grant said when asked what God is teaching her right now. "I must rely on and trust Him with my life. He is teaching me this through parenting and coaching. I am learning to give Him control of things I can't control."

Earlier this year, FCA introduced FCA Virtual, an online and social media initiative to rally coaches, athletes, and staff around the incredible stories of what God is doing through virtual FCA ministry. FCA Virtual is a space to gather ideas about how to engage teams and Huddles in online spiritual growth and to look for ways to serve and connect in this time of limited social interaction. FCA hopes coaches and athletes will be encouraged by what God is doing around the world through the virtual avenue. FCA Virtual will also help coaches, athletes, and teams to keep up with evolving ministry and training events in the field, as they unify leaders around a common rallying cry during a time of increased isolation. Eagles QB Finds Peace in Christ amid Pandemic-Induced Uncertainty On and Off Field

Carson Wentz: 'Living for the Lord First, **Others Second**

Faced with the uncertainty brought on by social distancing and a delayed season, Philadelphia Eagles quarterback Carson Wentz is finding his identity rooted in Christ by living for the Lord first and others second.

Like many athletes living with quarantine restrictions, Wentz is tempted to worry about the unknowns of preseason training camps and what the 2020 NFL season may look like during the coronavirus pandemic, according to an article posted by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA, fca.org).

Compounding the pressures shared by athletes across the sports world, Wentz lives in the shadow of his on-the-field successes, including leading the Eagles to the NFC East title last season and putting up a career-high 4,039 passing yards in 2019.

Wentz says he keeps both feet on the ground by learning to view himself primarily as a Christian and then a quarterback, and not the other way around.

"My identity is a follower of Christ," Wentz said. "I'm not an athlete who follows Jesus. I'm a follower of Christ who is an athlete.'

Finding his identity in Christ has aligned the priorities of this all-pro quarterback from North Dakota to reflect service to God first, to his wife and daughter second, to his teammates third and to his foundation - Audience of One (AO1) - fourth. Just as Wentz maintains his daily workout regimen, Wentz says that he maintains his focus on the Lord by reading his Bible daily.



"If I'm not grounded and rooted in the Word, it's so easy for my identity to be consumed with my sport, because that's what the world is telling you," Wentz said. "That's still something that you have to combat every day."

I'm about to turn 62 and has the world ever changed in my lifetime! I can imagine the same would have been said by someone turning 62 in my birth year of 1958. And what will kids who are coming into this world now say to whoever is listening when they turn 62 in 2082?

Every generation has unique dynamics and circumstances at play. 1 Chronicles 12 tells about the sons of Issachar who understood the times in which they lived. They spoke with relevance to their generation as to what was the best course of action the nation of Israel should take. Whether or not their hearers had open hearts to hear wisdom and were willing to respond in faith toward the Lord was an individual matter. The same is true of us today.

The days we are living in today present a great opportunity to speak what is in the heart and mind of God. The spiritual gifts of wisdom, knowledge and prophecy are most relevant to a hungry and needy people. And so, we are challenged to press into the heart of God in these times and seek to build the kingdom of God. Or, perhaps we settle for a more carnal fare of defending or defaming politicians. We can waste the opportunity of our words with venom about wearing or not wearing face masks. We can choose to eviscerate someone else's social media post with our own opposing view. No matter how eloquent we may think we are, it is worth considering the results. Often what results is hurt and anger. What if our opportunity to speak words of love and acceptance are consequently eliminated? And are not these not much more in line with our heavenly Father's agenda?

This is not to say that there is never a time of disagreement or confrontation. But the heart of the one offering an opposing view can also be an affirming word to the hearer.

Proverbs 25:11-12 "Timely advice is lovely, like golden apples in a silver basket. To one who listens, valid criticism is like a gold earring or other gold jewelry. (NLT)

Allow me to share a personal example of a man who won my heart with, as the King James would put it, his "aptly spoken words."

Spending more time in the hallway at a desk than in the classroom with my fellow 5th graders at MPS Browning Elementary School, Mr. Fricke approached my teacher to ask, "what's up with this kid in the hallway all the time?" Overhearing my teacher giving a litany of my bad behavior and attitude, Mr. Fricke said to him "Well, give him to me next semester. Maybe I can do something with him." My mind raced as to what this reassignment could mean!

I was a child of divorced parents. In the early 60's, it seemed like everyone else had a dad in the home. I don't know if "At Risk Kids" was an expression then. Attention Deficit Disorder was not in the mainstream literature either. Had it been, I probably would have been connected to a Ritalin I-V next to my desk!

My first day in Mr. Fricke's class was pleasant enough. The second day however was when I knew I was in trouble. Standing next to his desk he firmly asked, "Matson, where's your homework?" I replied, "Well. ... ". "Well? Well Water! We are not talking about water; we are talking about your homework! Where's your homework?" this new teacher asked with insistence. Forming the "w" sound with my lips but knowing I dare not utter that word again, I blurted out, "I was



going to do my homework ..." Again Mr. Fricke interrupted me "Well, that's good! You were going to do your homework, wonderful. And then what?"

"Who is this weirdo?" I thought. Starting the sentence over I was allowed to add one additional word before he erupted once again. "I was going to do my homework but..."

"But? But? Cigarette Butt. I hope you don't smoke. Smoke Butt... My mama used to make the best split pea soup and she would add a smoked pork butt and oooh it would taste so good! But we are not talking about my mama's soup, are we? We are talking about your homework! Now take a seat and bring me your homework tomorrow."

With many other encounters with this man of tough love, I discovered through his timely words and choice affirmations that I was not a dumb kid, as I had grown to believe. I would learn the power of love in that second semester of 5th grade as if being hit by a freight train. And to seal the deal, just because he cared so much for me, he had the principal assign him to teach my 6th grade class the next year.

So accustomed to hearing words of rejection and irritation, it was astonishing to have in my life a man who sought to reverse the negative trajectory of my life with words leading me to feeling a great sense of value and worth. He spoke aptly to me as a person he cared about. He didn't excuse my behavior, but looked beyond my problems to locate ME. He connected in a way that changed my life.

Speaking words of life to the people God puts on your heart needn't be weird or off-putting but instead can be laser focused for the purposes of God's glory.

Are you going to squander the opportunity to speak to those you are trying to reach for Christ with words to denounce or defend the President? Are you willing to miss a person's heart with your soap box of wearing or not wearing a mask? Is your stance on the issues of race, sexuality and injustices causing your words to become null and void because you've neglected to truly validate and value the person you are engaged with? Maybe we can't win everyone like we hope but let us be "winsome to win some" as D.L. Moody once said. An aptly spoken word with the right spirit can change the most resistant of hearts!

As America Spirals into Chaos, Faith Leaders Summon Christians to 'The Return'

Pastor Jessip: 'Our Lord Always Has Remedy for a World in Chaos'

Jessip says now is the time for Christ-followers to answer this call, just as Moses did.

"Moses prized the presence of God in his life, as have many Christians who have experienced this call — this divine urge to commune

> with the Lord," Jessip said. "The Lord is asking you to 'come up,' to meet him on the mount and let him fill you anew with his presence."

"The Return" is for all believers who love the Lord from all denominations and backgrounds. Leaders already

on board with "The Return" include Jonathan Cahn and Kevin Jessip (co-chairs), Mike Lindell, Michele Bachmann, Pat Boone, Dr. James Dobson, Mark Gonzales, Robert Morris, Marcus Lamb, John Kilpatrick, Pierre Bynum, Gen. William Boykin, Carter Conlon, Bishop Harry Jackson, Alveda King, Anne Graham Lotz, Pat and Gordon Robertson, Kevin and Sam Sorbo, Stephen E. Strang, E. W. 

ROASTED AUTUMN VEGETABLES

1 whole garlic bulb, peeled 1/2 c. butter, melted 1 tsp. dried thyme 1/2 tsp. salt 1/4 tsp. pepper 4 medium sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into wedges 1 pound fresh brussel sprouts, halved 1 large sweet onion, cut into 1/2 inch wedges

Separate garlic bulb into cloves. Mince 2 cloves; place in small bowl. Add butter, thyme, salt, and pepper. In a large bowl, combine the sweet potatoes, brussel sprouts, onions, and remaining garlic cloves. Drizzle with butter mixture; toss to coat. Transfer to greased 13x9 pan. Cover and bake 350 for 30 minutes. Uncover; bake 40-45 minutes longer or until vegetables are tender. Stir before serving. Yield: 10 servings.

THE SCHOLAR'S CORNER: Restoration Slip and Fall (Part 1)

Saul, on a blustery Spring evening, eager to be about the Lord's business and still tingling with the excitement of his Damascus Road experience, arrived in Jerusalem and was given an open door to Mary's home by the house maid Rhoda. With the door open the maid was confronted with Saul and Barnabas in dusty travel garments. Mary's residence was also the meeting place of the small group of Messianic believers, all of whom were focused on the return of the Messiah and His promise to restore the Kingdom to Israel. This was a promise which had been made by the prophets and also by the Master Himself before His ascension. Night and day, they continued to muse upon the hope that their native land would soon be returned to the nation of Israel to whom God have given it. Such an exhilarating and an exciting thought! As it happened, John, better known by his surname Mark, the son of Mary was present when Saul and Barnabas arrived. Mark had always looked up to his uncle Barnabas and admired his rhetorical skills, so he felt a twinge of disappointment when Saul was invited to address the group because there was none of the fluent delivery of Barnabas or the throaty voice of Peter.

Mark had apparently developed some interest in the missionary enterprise and already had a fascinating casement vision of communicating the promise of the Messiah to the Gentile nations. As a voung believer in the cause of the Messiah there was perhaps an adolescent flavor

of travel and adventure to his thinking at this time. After the meeting ended and the believers had departed to their respective lodgings, Mark retired to his room to pray and to contemplate a possible role for himself in the planned missionary journey of his uncle Barnabas and Saul, his new and highly erudite and somewhat mystical companion. Mary, as a devoted mother, must have worried and had a lot of anxiety regarding the safety of her son Mark but gradually her fears were assuaged by the reassurance of her brother Barnabas, whom she trusted implicitly, that he personally would care for her son and his nephew.

Next morning the party set out with a excited Mark looking forward with anticipation to the journey and the thought of being able to explain the message of the master to those who had never heard. Little did he know that as he began his life's journey that at the end of his career, he would be inspired to write a life of Jesus of Nazareth! The first scheduled stop of the caravan was the city of Antioch. There a lengthy discussion and a pastoral conference was held among the believers. The apogee of the conference was a message from God saying, "Set me apart Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them". The call and commission of Barnabas and Saul had been officially given and approved in Antioch! Plans were then formulated for the trio to embark for Cyprus, the Island of Roses, the home of Barnabas. A small vessel with sails partly unfurled and fluttering in the March wind awaited them in the harbor of Seleucia, the Antiochian seaport, at the mouth of the Orontes river. Mark must have had thoughts of his mother's love for her homeland - Cyprus The Beautiful- and her memories of the enchanted days of her childhood spent there, as he stood with his face in the breeze as the coast receded. In a few hours of pleasant sailing on the blue waters of the Mediterranean, the voyage from Seleucia took them to Salamis on the eastern coast of Cyprus.

The soon to be missionaries, however, soon learned to their surprise that missionary activity was already being carried out in Seleucia by refugees from the recent Judean persecution. Saul therefore suggested that they continue their move westward to other parts of the island.

It appears that Barnabas was not in total agreement with this plan and for Mark to see that the opinion of his revered uncle carried less weight than the words of this strange over-bearing man Saul, was hard for him to accept. This resulted in some degree of antipathy towards Saul who had obviously taken over the leadership of the expedition.

This was the beginning of Mark's 'slip and fall'.

Ohio Evangelical Leaders Ask State Health Department to Declare Pornography A Public Health Crisis by Karen Faulkner

Seventy-four evangelical leaders in Ohio submitted a resolution recently, asking the state Board of Public Health to declare pornography a public health crisis, CBN News reports. The document was submitted even as 'House Resolution 180,' which declares pornography to be a "public health hazard that leads to a spectrum of individual and



societal harms," is being considered by the Ohio General Assembly.

Explaining the need for such a resolution, Pastor Mark Meyer of Gracepoint Sanctuary, Lexington, said in a statement that the legal system does nothing to address the crushing impact of pornography on women and children.

"This resolution by the faith community urges enforcement of obscenity laws and increased regulation of pornography on the Internet at both the state and federal levels in order to protect citizens and minors from such exposure," Meyer said.

In a statement, resolution signatory Rev. El Akuchie of Godsfield House of Prayer in Mansfield added that pornography is also

connected to the plague of human trafficking. "Due to its affiliation to human trafficking, we would like the board to consider making this declaration," Mansfield said. "Our hope is this resolution will encourage education, prevention, research, and policy changes at the state level to confront pornography's proliferation on the internet and in society."

In regard to pornography as a health issue that is within the Board's remit, the resolution notes that the Ohio department of health and local health departments are tasked with collecting gathering statistics on births, divorces, diseases, and suicides which are "observed to be adversely impacted by the addiction to pornography," CBN News reports.



Incarceration, COVID-19 No Match for Redemption Stories of Youth For Christ's Juvenile Justice Ministry

YFC Director: 'Faithful Pursuit is . . . Biggest Key to This Ministry'

Equipped with Christian love and practical tools for assisting juvenile offenders inside and outside detention facilities, the Juvenile Justice Ministry arm of Badgerland Youth For Christ is cutting through jail time and coronavirus restrictions to reach teens with the message of Christ's redemption.

In order to build relationships with teenagers, Youth For Christ — a 65-year-old ministry started by Billy Graham — has developed multiple strategies that include weekly Zoom calls, Life Skills classes and Bible Studies in their Juvenile Justice Ministry (JJM) and Fresh Start Aftercare mentoring program.

YFC joined the redemption story of one teen, Cassandra, while she was still inside. Tim Hilgers, a YFC jail minister at Fond du Lac juvenile facility, plugged a student named Cassandra into YFC's Life Skills classes and Bible Studies within the walls of the jail to pursue her with the gospel. After her release, YFC staffers continued to pour into her life through the Fresh Start Aftercare mentoring program.

"Tim was relentless in his pursuit of initiating contact with her," said Jerry Wallendal, Ministry Director of Badgerland YFC, JJM and Fresh Start Aftercare. "Soon Cassandra was coming to small and large group activities. Tim also set her up with a team of mentors. Those volunteers had to drive about 30 miles to meet with their new mentee. Now that's pursuing."

When the coronavirus hit, JJM kept pursuing Cassandra, this time through YFC's weekly Youth Zoom call, on which Mark, another volunteer, shared the Gospel with Cassandra.

The call gave Cassandra a lot to think about. A few weeks later, Cassandra made the trip from Ripon to Fond du Lac to join a Badgerland YFC outing to Gillies Frozen Custard, a local favorite.

"We didn't give up on connecting with Cassandra," Wallendal said. "She arrived a little late, so she remained with Mark and me after all the other kids had left. I asked her if she understood what Mark had talked about when he presented the Gospel, and she said yes. I asked her what she thought of it, and she expressed a desire to begin her Christian walk. She had even spoken to her boyfriend about it. So right there, at a picnic table at Gilles, Cassandra asked Jesus to be her Lord and Savior."

The YFC team then discovered that long before JJM began pursuing

Cassandra, God had been pursuing her for years.

UVENILE USTICE USTICE INISTRY "It turns out that Cassandra's dad had been a Christian but died when she was younger," Wallendal said. "It was at that time that Cassandra walked away from God "in anger. But through the efforts of loving staff and volunteers, her love for God was restored and she is now a born

again Christian.

"She still has and now reads her father's Bible, which has many Scriptures highlighted and which help her make a more personal connection."

Wallendal says persistence is critical to ministry toward lost youth in the justice system.

"I would like to encourage everyone that faithful pursuit is one of the biggest keys to this ministry," Wallendal said.

Nationally, Youth For Christ is telling inspiring stories like these through #YFCBeTheStory, an initiative to help spread the word across the nation about how YFC chapters are making a difference in their communities.

Youth For Christ has been a pillar of missional ministry since 1944, when the Rev. Billy Graham served as YFC's first full-time staff member. Since then, Youth For Christ has continued to be both a rural and urban ministry on mission, and always about the message of Jesus. YFC reaches young people everywhere, working together with the local church and other like-minded partners to raise up lifelong followers of Jesus who lead by their godliness in lifestyle, devotion to the Word of God and prayer, passion for sharing the love of Christ, and commitment to social involvement. CHURCH-PLANTING MINISTRY EXPANDS IN MOZAMBIQUE

In spite of the pandemic, groups have been able to meet in home cells and pastors have been able to go out to villages. In one home church 35 new believers were baptized. Twelve believed the message of a pastor visiting an outlying small village, and a church plant was started at the village the same day.

REVIVAL IN IRAN AS THOUSANDS OF MUSLIMS TURN TO CHRIST

Thousands of Iranian Muslims have left Islam and have put their faith in Jesus Christ since the COVID-19 pandemic hit Iran in March, CBN News reports. Mike Ansari, who runs Mohabat TV, a popular Christian satellite channel in Iran told CBN News: "We are registering around 3,000 personal decisions by Iranian Muslims to leave Islam for Christianity during this revival. " As the numbers of new Christians continue to rise, a backlash from the Islamic regime is expected and many Christians have reportedly been arrested and

imprisoned since March. Nevertheless, CBN News reports, while Iran remains an extremely dangerous place for Christians, the number of new believer is reportedly rising faster here than anywhere else in the world.

CHINA THREATENS TO FORCIBLY TAKE CHILDREN FROM CHRISTIAN FAMILIES TO REEDUCATION CAMPS

The International Christian Concern (ICC) non-governmental organization has received a new report that Chinese authorities threatened to send children from a church in Chengdu to reeducation camps, Christian Today reports. ICC has previously reported that Chinese authorities had removed children from Christian families on the grounds that they were "trapped by an evil religion." In regard to what assistance might be provided to Chinese believers, Lisa Oiang of Early Rain Covenant Church, said: "The biggest help is to report the persecution. Report it fairly ... What the Chinese Communist Party (CPC) is most afraid of is being exposed. They are afraid of transparency." However Oiang explained: "We don't want the government or the public to pressure CPC because under such circumstances CPC will definitely intensify religious persecution. The worse China-US relations get, the more CPC persecutes Christians."



CHRISTIAN ATHLETE KATIE SPOTS TO RUN 130 MILES NONSTOP TO BRING CLEAN WATER TO TANZANIA

Katie Spots, a Christian endurance athlete, ran 130 miles to raise money for Lifewater International on Sept 5. According to the World Health Organization, some 2.2 billion people (40% of the world's

> population) do not have access to safe drinking water. Spots became known in 2010 when she rowed across the Atlantic. She later became a Christian and now runs to raise money and share the gospel.

LUIS PALAU IDENTIFIES KEY TO **BRINGING WAYWARD CHILDREN BACK TO CHRIST**

International evangelist Luis Palau has encouraged Christian parents to instill biblical principles in their children from the earlier years, citing the Word of God as the 'key' to bringing wayward kids back to Christ. Their son Andrew states: "in the face of 27 years of my rebellion against God and the ways of the

family, dad and mom ... prayed for me faithfully and then they lived the life. Their testimony was sound and strong. Not perfect, but that testimony was so powerful to me as a young man."

BEIRUT BLASTS: HOW WE CAN PRAY FOR LEBANON?




