A Word From the Heart by John Duckhorn

November & December 2020

A Christian has to live in two worlds that are in conflict. The conflict is an engagement between a world of hope without acknowledgement of God's presence, and a world of hope WITH the knowledge of God's presence. That first world, of course, is the world of work, trials, sin and false hopes and death. That is the world we know best but it confuses us the most. We do not always like this world and do not feel very comfortable in it. That world presses its ideas upon us and wants our support. If we do not support its desires, we face harsh criticism and censure.

Peter wrote his first letter, from Rome, to believers scattered over a wide area of Asia. It was to encourage his readers to endure suffering and persecution. Peter wrote during the reign of Nero who would foolishly burn the city and try to lay the blame on Christians. In giving themselves


entirely to God, Christians are to remain faithful in times of distress, knowing that God will vindicate them and that they will certainly enjoy the salvation that was brought to them at the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

First Peter 1:13 is a key verse in the epistle. "Therefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and rest your hope fully upon the grace of God that is to be fully brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ." This verse had three important thoughts to guide us in all that 2021 may bring.

1. CLEAR THINKING.

Men of the East wore long flowing robes. To be ready for work or action, they would pull it up from between their legs and tuck it on a belt around their waist. This made for more freedom of movement. One of the best Old Testament illustrations is found in Exodus 12:11. On the night before they would leave Egypt they were to celebrate the first Passover of this nation. They were to be ready to leave Egypt and not let anything hinder their movement. They were not called to linger in Egypt any longer, or to sit and worship or build a permanent place of worship. The NIV says, "Prepare your minds for action." As people redeemed by Christ, and brought into His eternal program, we are to be ready to use what God has taught us about our salvation and our future destiny. It is important for us to use God's Word to understand our present circumstances, and to do what honors Him. Too often our thinking becomes careless. Knowing that God's Word is alive and powerful, and that the Holy Spirit dwells in us, we will not be without His guidance. Another paraphrased version says that there is a need for "strenuous mental activity."

We ought not be content with an easy, superficial acceptance of faith. It isn't just that "I believe," but it's "I believe and I must live what I believe." The Christians during the time that Peter wrote were going through trials of faith and a campaign of slander during which ignorant and baseless charges were directed at them. The Roman government thought the followers of Christ had no useful role in



their rule. They were seen as servants of Rome, to help Rome maintain its position of power. Peter spends the first twelve verses reminding them of the wonder of their salvation and the unique position of those who belong to Jesus Christ, and of the unfailing hope laid up for us. He does not say that things will get better if we will just join them and vote right. Do we know how to use the whole Word of God to think things through? Or is our faith nothing but the silly notion that Christ is the key to health, wealth, and success? Or is it for a stronger self-esteem so that I might fulfill all of my personal desires?

2. STEADY LIVING.

The word "sober" in verse 13 does not mean not drinking, but means sound judgment; steady, and

well-balanced in all areas of life. It is easy to be carried away with new fads and worldly goals that demand our alignment. We become intoxicated with the latest fads in politics, education, moral and religious thinking. Peter is asking us to maintain the essential steadiness of a person who knows what they believe, and to walk without stumbling and falling for any ideas that are currently popular. Do we run from one thing to another for the answer? Have you noticed how many new books are constantly available and offer quick and easy answers to our problems? They are soon forgotten. All the pop religious, feel good books are forgotten and replaced by more of the same. This coming year be ready to take God's Word and do some real hard thinking.

3. REAL EXPECTATIONS.

Peter says "rest your hope" (1:13). This is a command; an imperative; an order. The two participles that precede the command are activities that hope.

The hope Peter speaks of is "fully upon the grace that is to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ." At the present time we enjoy a beginning of that grace. There seems to be little hope in this world during Covid-19 and numerous suggestions from political leaders as well as all of the scientists and doctors who are groping for answers. Many of the solutions seem to be guess work, but are sincere offers as answers. To rest our hope on the grace of God will allow us to keep our losses in focus. We must think beyond the present to God's promises for His children. Our salvation is meant to take us to be with God and not to live a life at ease. Don't worry about being "too heavenly minded that you are no earthly good."

The present state of things, the loss of jobs, income, concern for shelter, and healthcare has created a world of anger, false hopes and expectations that new people in power will bring new answers and hope. The world rushes forward to seek answers to its problems, with ignorance of God's free salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. Believers must hold fast to their faith and testimony and the Hope laid up for us in heaven.

30 BIBLE TRANSLATION PROJECTS SUSPENDED IN NIGERIA AMID PANDEMIC, TERRORISM

Nigerian Bible translators are seeking help after having to suspend translation projects in 30 languages due to the COVID-19 pandemic and ongoing terrorist violence throughout the country.



Wycliffe Associates, an

Orlando-based nonprofit that works with national Bible translators across the globe on over 700 translation projects, announced that the global pandemic, terrorism and economic collapse in Nigeria have "brought Bible translation to a halt in the most populous nation on the African continent."

The organization, which was founded in 1967 and partners with the local churches to direct and guard translation work in their communities, partners with an organization called Nigerian Bible Translation Trust. The trust works on several Old and New Testament translation projects in a country where there are over 200 million people and over 500 languages.

However, in 2020, translators have not been able to gather in central locations as they would normally to check each other's translation work.

"With the pandemic, the issues of terrorist attacks and thievery, and the amount of starvation that is going on in the country, makes people desperate. There is a fear that drives that," Wycliffe Associates Vice President of Translation Services Tabitha Price told The Christian Post.

"Travel is becoming more difficult. There is a lack of infrastructure already. And then to be concerned about the corruption and violence and terrorism that they are going to face when they try to travel, those challenges have really kept translators from being able to get together."

Price said that translators working on the same projects often do not live in the same village.



Entire Bible Translated Into 700 Languages; 5.7 Billion People Now Have Access To Scripture By MarieAnn Klett

The Bible has been translated in its entirety into more than 700 different languages, meaning that over 5.7 billion people now have both the

According to Wycliffe Bible Translations, the milestone was reached in recent weeks. The 700 total involves complete Bibles with all 66 books translated.

Old and New Testaments in their native tongue.

James Poole, executive director of Wycliffe Bible Translators, said the milestone "represents the tremendous work that Bible translators are doing across the world."

"Every time we hear of the Bible being translated into another language, we know that means that for the first time the people in that language group can fully access the complete picture of God's story," Poole said. "It's good to take a step

back and realize what this 700th Bible means: 5.7 billion people who speak 700 languages now have the Bible in the language that speaks to them best. That is a remarkable figure and continues to grow."

Wycliffe said it's "impossible" to know which one was the 700th because there were "several launches of physical Bibles" and "several being made available online and via apps, all at about the same time."

The group listed three recent Bible translations that could have been the 700th translation: The Huichol (Wixáritari) Bible was launched in Mexico, the Ellomwe Bible launched in Malawi; or the Igede Bible, which is used by a Nigerian ethnic group.

"It's amazing that there is so much Bible translation going on that we can't pinpoint the 700th Bible. We live in exciting times, when the vision that all people will be able to read or hear God's word in their language is becoming a reality," Poole said.

The American Bible Society also celebrated the news, pointing out that Bible translation has rapidly increased in the past few decades



due to "advances in translation technology" and an "unprecedented level of partnership among Bible translation agencies."

Over the last four years alone, the ABS has funded translations in 328 languages, most of them completed by local translators working the group's fellowship of United Bible Societies.

"We are grateful to God, our ministry partners, and the financial partners whose generosity makes this Kingdom work possible," ABS CEO Robert Briggs said.

Still, the group noted that the work is far from over, as more than half of the world's 7,000 languages do not have access to any form of Scripture, and 1.5 billion people still are unable to read the full Bible in their own language.

ABS said its goal is to translate Scripture into 100% of the world's living languages by 2033.

Modern technology has allowed the Bible — the bestselling book in the world — to reach millions in new and innovative ways. The number of languages with the full Bible has nearly doubled in the past 30 years, from 351 in 1990 to 700 in 2020, according to statistics.

In September, the first-ever complete Bible became available in American Sign Language, allowing the world's 70 million people who are deaf to access Scripture for free.

According to the State of the Bible 2020 report released earlier this year by the Barna Group and ABS, most Bible readers (65%) prefer a printed version. However, millennials are about as likely to read the Bible digitally (52%) as they are in print (48%). Americans who live in a household that owns a Bible (77% of the population) are as likely to use a Bible app as those without a Bible in the house (56% vs. 55%).

Judge Cites Scripture In Rebuke Of Mayor Bowser's Worship Restrictions By Anugrah Kumar

A federal judge quoted Hebrews 10:25 as he ruled against Mayor Muriel Bowser's restriction on outdoor church services of more than 100 people, allowing Capitol Hill Baptist Church in Washington, D.C., to resume in-person outdoor services.

"It is for the church, not the District or this court, to define for itself the meaning of 'not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together," Judge Trevor McFadden, a Trump appointee, wrote, quoting the New Testament's Epistle to the Hebrews, according to The Washington Times.

"Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching," reads the verse.

In late September, the church had filed a complaint in federal court, arguing that the city had violated the First and Fifth Amendments to the U.S. Constitution and the Religious Freedom Restoration Act. "For CHBC, a weekly in-person worship gathering of the entire congregation is a religious conviction for which there is no substitute," the church, led by 9Marks co-founder, Pastor Mark Dever, stated in its complaint. "The Church does not offer virtual worship services, it does not utilize a multi-site model, and it does not offer multiple Sunday morning worship services," added the church, represented by attorneys at the First Liberty Institute and WilmerHale, LLP.

Issuing a memorandum opinion in the case, the judge wrote: "The Court determines that the Church is likely to succeed in proving that the District's actions violate RFRA. The District's current restrictions substantially burden the Church's exercise of religion. More, the District has failed to offer evidence at this stage showing that it has a compelling interest in preventing the Church from meeting outdoors with appropriate precautions, or that this prohibition is the least-restrictive means to achieve its interest. The Court will therefore grant the Church's motion for injunctive relief." The judge also wrote: "The Church has consistently represented that it will take appropriate precautions such as holding services outdoors, providing for social distancing, and requiring masks. As explained, the District has not put forward sufficient evidence showing that prohibiting a gathering with these precautions is necessary to protect the public."



Ryan Tannehill Leads Titans To 4-0 Start, Always Tries To Reflect God's Light By Kevin Mercer

Tennessee Titans quarterback Ryan Tannehill may have been the best player on the field October 13, as he led his team to a dominant 42-16 victory over the previously undefeated Buffalo Bills.

It's an especially impressive feat considering the Titans have dealt with an outbreak of positive coronavirus tests within the team, which forced them out of action for two weeks and pushed the Bills game to a Tuesday night. Yet, they haven't missed



a beat thanks in part to the steady leadership of their 32-year-old quarterback.

Tannehill completed 21 of 28 passes against the Bills for 195 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions. He added another 42 yards on the ground, including his 10-yard score at the end of the second quarter to give his team a 21-10 lead.

He's now thrown nine touchdowns with only one interception so far in 2020, and his 110.8 passer rating ranks fifth among NFL QBs. And he's 11-3 as a starter since Week 7 of 2019 after the team's 2-4 start.

In his press conference after Tuesday's game, Tannehill told reporters how proud he was of his teammates for overcoming the potential distractions and preparing themselves for a game mentally and physically.

"What this team, what this organization has been through over the past couple weeks, to really fight through that, shake it all off, really limited practice, limited reps, and go out and put this kind of win together, I think it makes a statement," he said. "I'm happy. I'm happy that we were able to do that today."

Many NFL pundits, and certainly those within the Titans organization, believe the team is capable of another deep postseason run.

Last year, Tannehill's first in Tennessee, they upset the New England Patriots and the Baltimore Ravens on their way to the AFC Cham-

pionship Game before falling to the eventual Super Bowl champions, the Kansas City Chiefs. Tannehill came off the bench for Marcus Mariota in Week 6 to lead the team to a wildcard playoff spot.

The 2019 season was a year of improvements on the field for the Titans, but also a time of immense spiritual growth for many players off of it. Tannehill faced the personal tragedy of his father-in-law, John, unexpectedly passing away a week

after Tannehill's first start with his new team.

He said on the Sports Spectrum Podcast in February that, although John's death left lasting pain for him and his wife, Lauren, he believed God would work ultimate good through it all.

"Through that, we had to trust that His timing is perfect and His will is perfect," Tannehill said. "You may not agree with it. You may not like what happened, but someone is changing. There's going to be growth, and His Kingdom is going to be glorified through that."

He seeks to carry that faith with him in the locker room so that the lives he touches as a team leader would be directed toward God.

"I've always kind of viewed the locker room as my mission field," Tannehill said on the podcast. "Wherever God calls you, that's where God calls you to be a missionary for God and impact the lives around you. Everybody has their own way of doing that, and I think first and foremost you gotta live it out.

"Guys are watching, especially in a leadership position, guys are watching and listening to how you walk daily. What are you representing on the daily? Always try to be conscious of that and reflect God's light and shine into the paths of everyone around me."

For his on-the-field efforts in 2019, Tannehill won the NFL Comeback Player of the Year award and was named to his first Pro Bowl. He signed a four-year extension in March to return to the Titans.

Global Mercy will join the current flagship Africa Mercy, which was acquired in 1999 and refurbished for Mercy Ships missions.

According to the Lancet Global Surgery 2030 Report, about 16.9 million people die yearly due to lack of access to surgical care. Over 93% of the population of sub-Saharan Africa does not have access to safe and timely surgery.

As COVID-19 threatens the stability of already fragile health care systems globally, the need to provide basic lifesaving care is greater than ever, especially in low-to-middle-income countries. Global Mercy will deliver a safe and clean environment to various African nations, providing help and resources from some of the most well-trained physicians in the world.

Over the vessel's 50-year expected lifespan, it is estimated that more than 150,000 lives will be changed onboard through surgery alone.

A Teaching Hospital

In addition to the surgeries, Global Mercy will be outfitted with state-of-the-art training spaces, including a simulation lab with virtual and augmented reality, mannequins and other training tools and simulated postop care space, which allow trainers to simulate local conditions and limitations to teach best practices in low-resource environments to locals.

The 571-foot, 40,786 short-ton ship will have six operating rooms and house over 600 volunteers from around the globe representing many disciplines including surgeons, maritime crew, cooks, teachers, electricians, the host staff and more. The ship will also feature a 682-seat auditorium, student academy, gymnasium, pool, café, shop and library-all of which have been designed to accommodate up to 950 crew on board when docked in port.







32 oz. frozen Tater Tots (you won't use the whole bag) 1 pound pork sausage (or 5 Johnsonville brats, casing removed) 1/4 tsp. red pepper flakes 1 medium onion, finely diced 5 eggs 1 c. milk 1/2 c. half-and-half Scant 1/4 tsp. seasoned salt Scant 1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper 1 red and 1 yellow bell pepper, finely diced 2 c. grated cheddar cheese 1 c. grated pepper jack cheese Pinch salt **Black** pepper 3 chopped green onions

Line the Tater Tots in a greased 13 x 9 pan. Set aside. Cook sausage, onion and red pepper flakes in a pan until cooked. Drain grease. Sprinkle over taters. In a large bowl mix eggs, milk, half and half, seasoned salt, and cayenne. Stir in bell peppers, half of both cheeses and pinch of salt. Pour evenly over taters and sausage. Top with remaining cheeses, some black pepper and green onions. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Remove from fridge 45 minutes before baking time. Cover with foil and bake in preheated 350 oven 35 minutes. Uncover and bake an additional 30 minutes.

In a year marked with much racial tension, strife, and division, pundits began immediately questioning this Caucasian family's motivation for adopting children of color.

I've been disheartened and deeply discouraged by these questions as the families I've assisted for the past 17 years at Lifeline Children's Services have been motivated by love, the commands of the Bible to care for the orphan, the needs of vulnerable children, and the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.

James 1:27 states, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world."

I believe that the Lord commands His people to care for and visit the orphan, not because there is a desire to "civilize 'savage' children," but because family is an essential need for any and every child's flourishing.





THE SCHOLAR'S CORNER: Restoration Slip and Fall (Part 2)

THIS WAS THE BEGINNING OF MARK'S 'SLIP AND FALL'.

No details are given of Saul, Barnabas, and Mark's journey westwards through Cyprus until they reached Paphos on the western coast. Paphos was a major manufacturing center for the plethora of idols and images found everywhere in that pagan culture. As Saul preached it soon became apparent that the devil was active but in spite of this resistance Saul made an impression on Sergius Paulus who had recently arrived in Paphos as a representative of the Roman Government. In spite of the personal duplicity and specific resistance to Saul's message by the magician Elymas, also known as Bar-Jesus, who sought personal supernatural power, Sergius Paulus desired more of the Apostles' message and invited the three missionaries to his home for further discussion and explanation. All were enjoying the sweet reward of seeing others come to the Messiah.

Saul, however, was becoming increasing irritated by the manipulations of Elymas and had as much as he could take. In his response he vigorously declared: "The Lord's hand will fall unto you, and you will be blind, unable to see the sun for a time". Luke, as an observant physician, gives us the effect of this miraculous punishment on Sergius Paulus: ([Then the proconsul believed, when he saw what had happened, being astounded at the doctrine of the Lord". It is at this point that Saul's activity on Cyprus

came to an end. From this point onward Luke refers to the industrious missionary, not as Saul, but as Paul.

At dawn another sailing vessel slowly leaves the placid harbor of Paphos and picks up speed as it cuts through the effervescence and undulations of the Adriatic. Slowly the trio were being carried from Paphos to Attalia, a village at the mouth of the Cestus river. From here they began the journey towards the capital of Pamphylia, arriving at the malaria infested city of Perga before dark.

In Perga the threat of malaria was constantly in the air which probably was part of the reason Mark and his Cyprian associates earlier decided to change plans and return home. Mark, in addition to harboring negative feelings towards Saul probably had developed homesickness. Paul was naturally disappointed that his personal assistant, his 'golden boy', had let him down. However, Paul again demonstrated his magnanimity and when Mark came to say good-bye Paul offered no words of reproach or even voiced his disappointment. Paul and Barnabas now faced a dangerous journey across the Taurus mountains where, Paul recalled later, he was "in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils of the wilderness". This entire region was infested by brigands and robbers. The two fatigued missionaries struggled on towards their next designated stop and eventually reached Pisidian Antioch. This was the city from which they were eventually banished. Shortly thereafter a similar reception was experienced at Iconium where the governor ordered Paul to be beaten and driven out of the city.

The exciting outcome of this 'slip and fall' account of the young brother who had made a bad decision and had left Paul in the lurch at a critical moment that he was later fully restored by the forgiving and gracious Paul. After such an experience of disappointment and sorrow came a beautiful restoration of him who in his adolescent immaturity had made a bad decision but who was later described by the aged Apostle as useful and beneficial.

The lesson for all of us today is that the Christlike characteristic of forgiveness demonstrated in Paul is something we all should seek to develop personally.

Who could have believed that the young man who had made a 'slip and fall' decision would one day experience a gracious restoration and would be called by God to the highest honor and responsibility of authoring the inspired Oracle, 'The Gospel According to Mark'.

Willow Creek Pastor David Dummitt Says Church's Vision Follows Luke 15: Relentlessly Pursue The Lost

Pastor David Dummitt addressed Willow Creek Community Church's vision for the future by citing Luke 15, saying God's people must follow Jesus' vision for His church by relentlessly pursuing the lost.

"This church was founded on a conviction that lost people matter immensely to God," Dummitt said in a recent sermon titled "The Greatest Visionary."

"And we ought to have the heart of the Father that we will relentlessly pursue, we will do everything short of sin, we will go after people because they have an immense worth to God," added Dummitt, who became senior pastor of the church back in April. Dummitt's plan to increase church attendance started with getting more use out of Willow Creek's many large campus buildings. Dummitt used restaurants, sports and meeting venues at his former church as a way to draw non-Christians into faith, he said. Once they were comfortable with visiting the church building, people often became Christians, he said.

"Willow, you pioneered church buildings that took out stained glass windows and pews and other religious symbols because you wanted to make irreligious people feel more comfortable in the environment," he said.

The internet has also helped Willow Creek reach more people with the Gospel, Dummitt said. And while he's looking forward to one day resuming in-person meetings, the pastor noted that the most successful businesses today master communicating with people both in-person and online. Once, Sunday service was our culture's biggest public space; now, our biggest public space is the internet, he added. "In the past, we've spent millions of dollars to reach thousands of people. We now have the opportunity to spend thousands of dollars to reach millions of people," Dummitt said.

According to an update on Willow Creek's website, the church has decided to postpone in-person services until 2021. Dummitt did not say when exactly in-person services will resume next year.

To increase membership while doing onlineonly services, Willow Creek's church body has had to spread the Gospel and form close-knit communities to develop new Christians, said Dummitt. Church must be as much about sending people out as about sending people in, he said. This evangelistic work starts in small groups.

"I don't want us to be a church with small groups; I want us to be a church of small groups," he said.

New church plants will also bring in new members, Dummitt said.

David Jeremiah Urges Christians To Move Forward Despite 2020 Turmoil By Jeannie Law

Prominent pastor and Christian author David Jeremiah is encouraging believers to not get stuck in the turmoil of 2020 but believe that God's best for their life is ahead of them through his new book, Forward.

"You need to get up every day and realize that the very best thing God has for you is out in front," the pastor of Shadow Mountain Community Church in El Cajon, California, told The Christian Post.

He does not believe that the upcoming election, the pandemic or anything else should cause Christians to miss what God has for them or cause them to veer from their Godgiven purpose.

"This world needs Jesus no matter who's in the White House," said Jeremiah, also the host of the radio and TV program "Turning Point."

The pastor's latest book highlights how powerful the presence of God is, which helps everyone fulfill their God-given dreams despite the crises America is currently facing. "If we stand firm in God, we can move forward," the book states.

The following is an edited transcript of The Christian Post's interview with Jeremiah, where the New York Times bestselling author offers advice on reducing the many distractions, pressing into God's presence, and overcoming depression and reveals what he will do after the upcoming election.

Christian Post: You`ve written over 50 books in your writing career. What important mes-

sage are you sharing in Forward that is different from the topics you`ve discussed in the past?

Jeremiah: This book is about getting unstuck. You know, so many people have gone through CO-VID-19, they've been in shelter, their whole lives have been turned upside down. Sometimes when that happens, it's hard for us to regain momentum and get started again and God never intended for us to get blown off course

by this. We have to go through this, but you know, when you go through something you come out on the other side, you don't stay there. I talked to a lot of people who are frightened, they don't know what to do and so they're just hunkering down and in my estimation, it's time for us to start going forward again. We can't stay in limbo the rest of our lives; it's time to move forward and that's what this book is about.

CP: Your book is calling people to dream bigger and have a bright vision for the future but 2020 has been pretty dim. What advice do you have for Christians to march on forward following this year?

Jeremiah: I use an illustration in the book that when you get in your car and you sit down in the driver's seat, you have this great big windshield in front of you to see the future. And you have this little tiny rear-



view mirror to see the past. Yeah. I think what's happening now to some people is still they're living their life in the rearview

mirror. They're thinking about how bad 2020 has been. What about 2021? What about the future? If we stay stuck in the problems of 2020 we will never be ready to move forward into the opportunities of 2021.

That's why you have to have this dream about what you believe God wants you to do, what

He's put in your heart to do. You have to believe that dream and you have to cultivate it. I tell people, "Put it in Technicolor so that you see it clearly" because if you don't see that dream, if you don't understand what God wants you to do, you will never be able to do it and you will never be able to get anybody to go along with you to do it either. You have to have this dream fully formed in your mind.

I use the illustration in that chapter of David's dream for building the temple because the Ark of the Covenant was in a tent, and he was living in a cedar paneled house. And he felt like it was right for them to build this beautiful temple. He didn't get to do it himself because God said he was a man of blood and of war. But he enabled his son Solomon to do it and so the result of that is Solomon's temple. The Christian Courier


