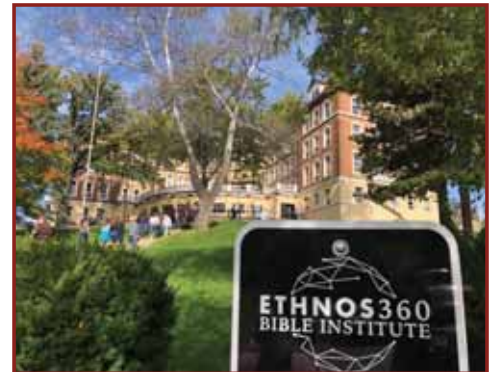

Ethnos360 Bible Institute To Hold February Open House

There is a hidden gem perched on a hill just east of downtown Waukesha - Ethnos360 Bible Institute. You may know the main campus building; wrapped about with windows and pillars and trim, it bears an aura of mystery and antiquity. It is the final remaining hotel from a golden age - the Springs Era - when Waukesha was a national destination for Americans seeking rest and rejuvenation. Mary Todd Lincoln herself sought out Waukesha's tranquil healing springs after her husband's assassination.

The real legacy of this place, however, transcends even its undeniably rich history. Resthaven served noble purposes throughout - welcoming weary travelers, mending wounded veterans, sequestering tuberculosis sufferers - but when medicine rendered TB sanatoriums obsolete, it fell abandoned and forgotten, remaining vacant for years.

In 1963, Ethnos360 (then New Tribes Mission) took on this reclamation project, acquiring the hotel-turned-hospital in an unrecognizable state of disrepair. Years



of neglect, after decades of treating the injured and sick, had left a mere shell of the palatial resort that dazzled in 1909. However, New Tribes Mission leaders saw a treasure trove of kingdom potential. They began restoration in earnest, and welcomed Waukesha's first students only months later.

In the six decades since, Ethnos360 Bible Institute (EBI) has fulfilled their vision, faithfully equipping students for life and missions through discipleship and in-depth, chronological Bible teaching. In a world where a love of Scripture and Biblical knowledge are declining precipitously, EBI is steadfastly pushing back the darkness, discipling and training young people in God's Word before commissioning them on to their next steps - sending them into missions training, their local churches, or whatever path the Lord leads them on.

COVID-NIV?

We all know way more about COVID-19 than we want to and none of it is good. But what about perhaps a precursor, a variant or a strain that hit the Church in the late 1970's taking us all by surprise ... COVID-NIV? Did the New International Version and others like it water down the Bible? Bob, where are you going with this? Since Covid was sprung on the planet, the world has been hit with fallout from censorship on every front, the re-writing of history, watering down our language and vocabulary, open borders, wars and rumors of wars in untold places just to name a few. Well, haven't many of the same things shown up in the churches. Were we prepared when Covid hit? No. Has the church been the proverbial frog in the hot water slowly cooking? How can we get back to basics and return to our roots? How can the true church get together, get "on the same page," start reading out of the same hymnal so to speak and prepare for tuff times ahead?

When talking to someone about what version to buy, John Fisco would sometimes say that the best Bible for a person is the one he actually reads everyday. I received my NIV Study Bible from my parents for Christmas in 1985. I got saved in 1987 and until a few years ago, have read that Bible predominantly ever since. Looking at the copyright, mine is the fourth date starting with 1973. There have been several updates since my version and frankly, I don't like the gender neutral changes and the other edits in the last few revisions. Where are the publishers



going with this? Long out of print, my version is now hard to come by. Is there an agenda to direct the reader, the buyer whether online or in print to the modern version? When will the Woke Alert go off?

Fast forward to today. Now three years into taking our Sunday morning Clark House church online for the guys, we've been bouncing back and forth between different preachers. We watch a lot of Baptist preachers and most of them use the King James Version Bible. We also watch old sermons given back in the 50's and 60's and the Scripture quoted by Billy Graham and other famous preachers is in the KJV. We received a nice donation of hymnals from Southside Baptist Church recently and like to follow along from time to time with the old hymns which of course were written in the KJV type of english. I contend that the old hymns were my main take-away from the mainline churches I attended prior to finally landing in Bible-teaching churches after I got saved.

So what about the person who says, "Well, I just don't like the King James Bible. I can't

understand it." Really? What about all the study materials, helps and search engines? Think about that. The late Howard C. Estep teaches prophecy from the KJV. He treats his Bible with reverence and even talks about not setting other books on his KJV. Brother Roy Bell, whom we like a lot prays often, "Thank you O God for your perfect gift, your perfect Word written down in your perfect book, the King James Bible." Who can argue with that? If you're going to say, "Well, that is just one opinion about one version," are you prepared to find a shortcoming of the KJV Bible? What's wrong with accepting the 1611 KJV Bible as word-perfect and having that as a gift from God that we can totally 100% trust and rely on in unity? I'm all in!

Believers are born again of the Spirit of God. Through the Holy Spirit, He illuminates His Word for us and applies the Word to our lives. He is the one who gives understanding of the Word anyway. Just like the role of the church is to equip the saints and strengthen the body, the Word is written for

A Word from the Heart

"Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God." Mark 10:14

This is an urgent call to action. And, for some of us, it's a call to fun and hamming it up for the kingdom. Children are under attack, and we need to fight for them wisely.

There have been lots of surprises in the past seven years. The polarization of our political system, the weaponizing of government agencies, COVID, and agenda-driven decisions have been sobering. Yet, all of these were somehow to be expected. The raw, shameless sexualization of our children is a shock.

I'm talking about drag shows and gender indoctrination, manipulation, and encouragement toward deciding your own gender. Schools are stocking their libraries with explicit materials and agenda-driven messages.

Not only is this cultural tragedy public, but your employer might get mad at you for speaking against it. We have an entire political party moving in lockstep supporting it. Then, "Walt World" transformed into "Woke World" and became the cherry on top.

In missions, there is the 10-40 window. So, what about the 4-29 window? I never hear people praying about that one. Those are the ages at which most people come to Christ, about 97%. Those between 4-14 are the largest group, and the ongoing destruction of their innocence and trust is satanic.

Jesus said, "It is not the will of my Father in heaven that one of these little ones should perish" (Matt 18:14). I'm sure we need more laws to protect kids, but what we need are more child evangelists. We need people to go outside and influence lost kids in their neighborhoods.

Kids who are church-ed or have believing parents will get some protection and all sorts of input. That's not the case for children in unbelieving families. They get the drag shows. They hear the lies about gender and the redefining of reality. And who knows what they witness at home. Their parents are lost, too. I asked my daughter, who lives south of Atlanta, if her son had made friends at his new school. She said his 12-year-old acquaintances sit around during recess and watch porn on their phones. Childhood is being stolen.

So, here's the idea: first, get yourself in shape. Except for the need for naps and arthritis, 70 is the new 50! You need a mission, and it's the Great Commission that will stir the blood and get you moving. Anyone younger should apply this, too. And if you can, do this with someone. Jesus always sent His men out in twos.

Get yourself in the Word and pray like a trooper! Read, or better yet, memorize the first three chapters of Ephesians.

You'd probably rather drink a glass of raw eggs like Rocky did than memorize, but the Word of God is better for you, and your mission is more important.

If you can, walk around your neighborhood and pray for the kids and families. Do this during times the kids are out so they can see you. Do it on Saturdays when families can see you. Pray that the Lord will arrange contact with them and be friendly and helpful (Miss, can I help you lift that out of the car?).

We used to play football in the alley on the South Side when I was growing up. Imagine if two of you younger guys (50 is the new 30) knew some of the kids, went out and played football with them, and organized an "Alley Bowl" with a grill party afterward. Women, you could do something similar with the girls.

If you pray and are active, lots of things are possible, especially if you get to know the parents and they trust you. Of course, you could become a scout leader, Big Brother or church teacher, but if the Lord works with you, He will open natural doors near home.

Many of you baby boomers were crazy people when you were young. Out of love for Christ and moderated by the Spirit, let the crazy out again. So much of the teaching I hear at VBSs is dry. Don't even tell them you're going to teach them. Do something fun with your local kids, and break into a story when you're sitting around. Tell them something Jesus did or a story out of the OT. "You remember last week when we were playing soccer and I stepped in that 'stuff.'" Nobody wanted to be around me. So, this leper comes up to Jesus. Nobody liked lepers, and people stayed away, but not Jesus." Make it fun, humorous, honest to the text, and tell them how much Jesus loves them.

Doesn't this sound more fun than just writing a letter to your Congressman? It's the Great Commission. It's loving your neighbor. It's doing our part so the little children can come to Jesus.

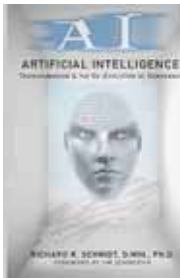

What Pastors and Churches Can Legally Do During Election Season

The 2024 election is less than one year away. With campaign season underway, religious leaders and people of faith often ask, "What are my rights when it comes to addressing political issues?"

There are many misconceptions about what rights and freedoms pastors and houses of worship have on political matters. Opponents of religious freedom often manipulate information to make you believe that politics and the pulpit may never converge, making faith-based organizations, churches, synagogues and everyday religious Americans fear legal ramifications if they mention or participate in politics.

But the truth is, that fear isn't based on the law. It's a scare tactic by those who want to silence and suppress people of faith, and keep them from voicing their opinions and voting their values.

Here are some critical facts that you need to know.

4 THINGS CHURCHES AND PASTORS ARE LEGALLY ALLOWED TO DO DURING ELECTIONS

The number of things pastors can do during election season far outweigh the number of things they can't do — in both quantity and importance.

1. It's okay to speak about political issues in the Church

It is a misconception that pastors cannot address political issues — even "hot button" issues like religious liberty, abortion and same-sex marriage — from the pulpit. Any person or entity that attempts to silence a pastor for addressing these issues is violating that pastor's constitutional rights under the First Amendment. Pastors have every right under the First Amendment to talk about any of those issues, and there's never been any case in American history that said pastors can't do that.

Historically in America and in many places around the world, government and religion have never been mutually exclusive concepts; rather, they coexist. America's Founders saw religion as a necessary component to a healthy, moral society — not a taboo topic to bar completely from the political realm; neither was political talk to be barred from churches. Sermons on politics, government and controversial issues were common at our nation's founding, and popular among pastors and churches on varying sides of the political spectrum.

2. Religious leaders can educate their congregation about politics

Religious leaders are tasked with equipping their congregants in works of service, and that includes representing their faith and morality in the voting booth. Pastors are fully protected when it comes to issues like educating members of their church about the political process, handing out non-partisan voter guides and flyers so members can read about each candidate's positions, and even providing the opportunity for members to register to vote.

3. Inviting political candidates to speak at church is allowed

Contrary to popular belief, pastors and churches can invite political candidates to address their congregation from the pulpit, as long as all the candidates in a race are included in the invitation. What if only one candidate accepts the invitation and shows up? No problem!

4. Pastors can participate in politics in their individual capacity

Serving in ministry does not disqualify pastors or other religious leaders from their individual rights as U.S. citizens. Pastors can participate in political campaigns, hold office within political campaigns, and even endorse a candidate in their individual capacity as a private citizen.

WHAT RELIGIOUS LEADERS CANNOT DO DURING ELECTIONS

According to IRS regulations, there are only two things that pastors and churches, when classified as a 501(c)(3) organization, cannot do:

A church entity may not endorse one candidate over another

This does not mean that a pastor — in his individual capacity as an American citizen — may not endorse one candidate over another. A 501(c)(3) church or organization may not, however, as an organization endorse one candidate over another or be publicly against one candidate over the other.

1. A church may not give its money to one candidate over another

This doesn't mean that pastors or church members, in their individual capacities as American citizens, cannot donate to the political campaign of their choice. They can even be the Campaign Chair for a candidate if they want. But an official 501(c)(3) organization may not donate church funds or resources to one political candidate over another.

2. Our responsibility as people of faith to be good citizens

Americans — including people of faith — have a responsibility to be good citizens, active and engaged in our political process. We recognize that religious freedom is indeed one of the greatest blessings bestowed to our country and the first freedom from which all other liberties flow. At the same time, however, we cannot ignore how important other civil rights — such as the right to vote — are to the flourishing and the betterment of our country.

In Romans 13:1, Scripture commands us to be obedient and respectful of authorities and the governmental institutions around us:

"Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God."

In the American system of government, the government is "of the people, by the people, and for the people." So, showing respect for authority in the United States includes us being an active part of the process and voting. In other words, we can show love for both God and country by consciously participating in our republican form of government. Part of the bargain of living in liberty is a duty to vote and making our voices heard in the public square.

This election season, we encourage every religious American to vote according to their conscience and their values. Every person of faith should know this: protecting religious freedom and all our God-given liberties isn't just a battle that we're fighting in the courtroom. It's a fight that we can also win if we show up at the ballot box.

PUMPKIN BREAD

This bread is best made with Chinese Five Spices. Find it in the oriental section of your grocery store.

3 1/2 c. flour
2 tsp. baking soda
1 1/2 tsp. salt
1 tsp. Chinese Five Spices or cinnamon
1 tsp. nutmeg

3 c. sugar
4 eggs
1 can (15 oz.) pumpkin
1 c. oil
2/3 c. water
1 c. chopped walnuts

Topping:
2 T. melted butter
2 T. sugar
1/2 tsp. Chinese Five or cinnamon

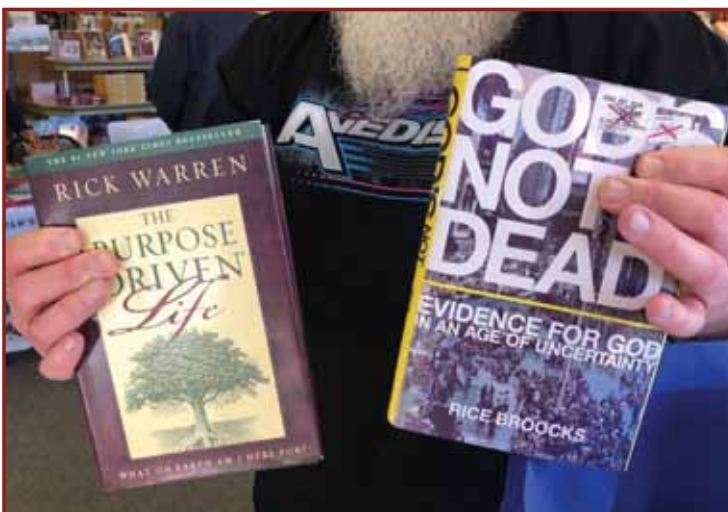
Preheat oven to 350°. Combine dry ingredients together; mix well; set aside.

Combine sugar, eggs, pumpkin, oil and water; mix well. Add walnuts. Add to dry ingredients and stir only until incorporated.

Bake in 2 greased bread pans (9x5) for 45-60 minutes, or until tests done with toothpick. Leave in pan 10 minutes; remove.

For topping, brush tops of bread with butter. Combine sugar and Chinese Five and sprinkle over butter. Continue cooling on wire racks..

The Path Forward Defending Life

This past week's election results have been discouraging for the pro-life movement. The hard-fought victory in the Dobbs Supreme Court decision gave Americans the opportunity to defend the unborn at the ballot box. Yet, instead of protecting the most vulnerable among us, the 2022 and 2023 elections proved why the fundamental right to life should never be left to a vote.

Over the past few days, GOP pundits have claimed that deceptive advertising and high spending are the reasons Republicans and the life issue have failed miserably, and to some extent, they are correct. Unfortunately, these things are not going to change. Democrats are going to make "a woman's right to choose" the cornerstone of their 2024 election strategy, and major donors like George Soros and Jeff Bezos will continue to fund pro-abortion candidates and ballot initiatives far from their home states.

Still, the pro-life movement cannot be disheartened — and certainly cannot back down. We aren't fighting for a hypothetical or an ideal. We are fighting for people's lives.

The year and a half since Dobbs has taught us that many more people — and perhaps different people — than we realized want to keep abortion legal. It's not only "women in crisis pregnancies;" it's wealthy, educated men and women; it's the men and women we're sitting next to at church on Sunday; it's our neighbors and our friends.

Americans have grown numb to the reality of abortion. But if the pro-life movement is going to succeed in defending life, the path forward begins with presenting an undeniable truth — an unborn child is a person, and an abortion kills her. Protecting the unborn starts with lovingly having this conversation with our friends, coworkers, children, parents, and neighbors.

We should be prepared for these discussions to be difficult. As last week's election demonstrated, hundreds of thousands of people are willing to say they are "pro-choice." A large percentage of those people don't even shy away from labeling themselves as "pro-abortion." But very few people identify as "pro-killing an unborn child." It seems most people don't want abortion, but they have bought into the lie that someday, they or a loved one will need an abortion.

We cannot allow this fear to prevail. Paying for a mother's child to be killed doesn't solve any problem. We need to shake people out of the



illusion that Democratic euphemisms like "women's rights," "reproductive freedom," and "choice" mean anything other than the right to kill an innocent human being, and we need to drive away the fear that abortion is a solution. After all, we aren't for limiting a woman's future, rights, freedom, or choice. We are for protecting a defenseless person from a horrific death and helping her mother flourish.

While we work to remind our friends and family what abortion actually does, we must also remind our "pro-life" legislators what it means to be worthy of that title. Legislation that focuses on protecting life after a gestational age without a plan to move forward from that point is not pro-life; it is pro-compromise. And as Nellie Gray, founder of the March for Life, said, "On this basic subject of life ... there is no compromise. You're either for or against it. I was just rereading the Scriptures the other day seeing that is exactly where Christ was. ... There is no neutrality and there is no in between. You can't have a little bit of abortion. You can't be a little bit pregnant. You must understand that life must be protected in total."

Certainly, this does not mean that the pro-life movement must totally abandon an incremental approach to completely protecting the unborn. In some states, the incremental approach is saving lives. But the goal of every piece of pro-life legislation — especially at the federal level — must be protecting every unborn child from the moment of conception and working for the day when Americans are no longer voting on whether an innocent unborn child can be killed.

Legislation that seeks to find "common ground" with Democrats should be abandoned, since their version of "common ground" has killed millions of innocent babies. Instead, pro-lifers should champion legislation that points to the fact that the unborn child is a

person, and we care about that person and her mother. Pro-life politicians must highlight how dangerous the abortion drug is for women and demand that existing federal laws protecting unborn babies and their mothers from this drug are enforced. Similarly, pro-life candidates must call for investigations where there is evidence that unborn children's lives were destroyed through the gruesome, illegal practice of partial-birth abortion. Highlighting these cases forces

Democrats to contend with what abortion actually does.

Pro-life presidential candidates must commit to signing any democratically passed legislation that protects unborn children, appointing pro-life judges and members of the administration, and ensuring that American taxpayer dollars are not used to fund abortion. And all of this must be done alongside a commitment to working towards a country where every single person — including

Churches Breaking New Ground: Filled with Broken Families, Lives

The other day I read an article that opened with these words: "Churches must work to restore healthy marriages and fatherhood to combat a growing decline in Christianity, according to a survey released by a faith-based group." The article went on to detail how the decline in resident fatherhood and the collapse of marriage are likely explanations for the increase in religious non-affiliation throughout the United States.

While this is certainly bad news, it also reflects some good news: "Overall, the survey found that 80% of church attendees grew up in a home where their mother and father stayed married, a trend that remained true regardless of age." Although this number is in decline, it is still much higher than the national average and shows the impact the power of the Gospel of Jesus has on the family. The point of the article was to encourage churches to take the strengthening of marriage and family more seriously because it has a profound effect on the next generation. It was a good reminder and challenge.

But as I read it, I felt an ache in my soul for a very different reason: Christianity has become more about being generational than the breaking of new ground. While the national average for kids having parents who stay married is only one in two, in the church it's four in five. The insiders stay insiders, while the outsiders remain far from the healing power of God, generation after generation.

The first churches were made up exclusively of those born and bred in the shadow of the Old Testament Law: Jews. This created a common culture of values that kept the community pure and the survey results looking good. But then the Gospel began moving out to those who had a long history of pagan practice and dirty laundry: the Gentiles. The survey results took a beating.

Yet the heart of God from the beginning has been for broken people with broken backgrounds to experience the power of His redemption and restoration. While the leaders of Jesus' day pressured Him to stay within the limits of His Jewish culture, He kept pushing the edges to engage those outside the circle: "It is not those who are well who need a physician, but those who are sick. I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance" (Luke 5:31-32).

In Paul's first letter to the church in Thessalonica, he reminded them they had "turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God ..." (1 Thessalonians 1:9). When he took the Gospel to the city of Ephesus, many who engaged in sorcery and pagan worship left their ways to follow Jesus (Acts 19: 19, 23-27). The survey question, "How



many of you came from families that practiced sorcery and idolatry?" Would have had embarrassing results. Yet Heaven was smiling as new ground was being broken.

But the city of Corinth tops them all: "Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the Kingdom of God? Do not be deceived; neither the sexually immoral, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals, nor thieves, nor the greedy, nor those habitually drunk, nor verbal abusers, nor swindlers, will inherit the Kingdom of God. Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God" (1 Corinthians 6:9-11). That must have been quite a congregation! New ground was being broken.

God's intent for the Church has always been that it be a place where lost people get found and the broken get put back together — a place filled with "weres" who are learning to build new lives through the power of the Holy Spirit.

It's time for surveys to tell us that churches are breaking new ground and being filled with those from broken families, broken relationships, and broken lives. But they should also tell us churches are doing all they can to break the downward cycle of family dysfunction and restore health to marriage and fatherhood. Only then can people step into the life God has for them, and only then can they be part of God's heart for breaking new ground through the power of the Gospel.

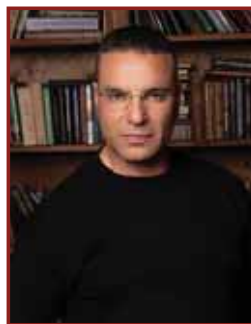

Disappearing Motherhood: Who's to Blame?

AND GOD BLESSED THEM, AND GOD SAID UNTO THEM, BE FRUITFUL, AND MULTIPLY, AND REPLENISH THE EARTH, AND SUBDUCE IT: AND HAVE DOMINION OVER THE FISH OF THE SEA, AND OVER THE FOWL OF THE AIR, AND OVER EVERY LIVING THING THAT MOVETH UPON THE EARTH. [GENESIS 1:28]

A British tabloid carried a grim headline Monday announcing "America's fertility crash," over an article detailing the precipitous drop in the U.S. birth rate during the last 15 years. The decline was greatest in Utah, whose birth rate fell by more than a third despite the Beehive State's reputation for large families.

Ignoring such a dire long-term trend that harms the health and happiness of the American people, our media have spent most of 2023 promoting entertainment aimed at single young women, starting with Barbie. That blockbuster movie featured an unmarried woman without children, with merely a cameo appearance by one pregnant character who is portrayed as an outcast.

The Barbie phenomenon is joined by the female pop star Taylor Swift, whose record-setting concert tour caused an unprecedented meltdown at Ticketmaster. Now the film version has broken the box office record for a concert movie, drawing mostly young women to theaters where they dance on chairs and sing off-key rather than merely watching.

Taylor Swift, herself childless and nearly 34 years old, was asked when she turned 30 whether she wants to have children. She curtly replied, "I don't really think men are asked that question when they turn 30, so I'm not going to answer that now."

LO, CHILDREN ARE AN HERITAGE OF THE LORD: AND THE FRUIT OF THE WOMB IS HIS REWARD. AS ARROWS ARE IN THE HAND OF A MIGHTY MAN; SO ARE CHILDREN OF THE YOUTH. HAPPY IS THE MAN THAT HATH HIS QUIVER FULL OF THEM: THEY SHALL NOT BE ASHAMED, BUT THEY SHALL SPEAK WITH THE ENEMIES IN THE GATE. [PSALMS 127:3-5]

A man's fertility, of course, doesn't begin falling at age 30. But every young woman should be warned how much more difficult it becomes to have children as she moves through her 30s.

Taylor Swift won't need children to support her financially in her old age, due to her fortune. But the future of our country and the "Swifties," as her followers are called, is less rosy in our increasingly childless society.

The percentage of women under 45 having children has fallen to barely half today. Childless young adults will eventually become an elderly population dependent on public support, but Social Security works only if there are enough young workers to fund the system on a continuing basis.

For the most part, Swifties have not been attending these concerts on dates with young men. An estimated 90% of these concert fans are women, an imbalance so severe that it has caused havoc with the availability of restrooms at performance venues.

Our nation already has a record number of women and men who are single in the 18-29 age group: 34% of women and 63% of men. Many of them have given up on seeking a relationship.

This isolation is not healthy for our society, or for young women. Single women are obese at a rate of 7-12% more than married women, and Taylor Swift had to remove a reference to "fat" in one of her music videos last year to appease her fans.

Meanwhile, the number of men who have no close friendships has increased five-fold in the last 30 years, to 15%. The hordes of young men and women who are unmarried today are having difficulty finding partners

who share their political views, while Democrat politicians play gender-gap politics for their benefit.

Married women typically vote Republican as married men do. But single women vote overwhelmingly for the Democratic candidates, in part because Democrats spend billions of dollars advertising to them.

The percentage of 18- to 34-year-olds who are married today is less than half of what it was a generation ago. In liberal Seattle, it is predicted that soon the number of older teenagers and adults who have never been married will surpass the number of married residents there.

Educated women are deciding not to have children at all. About 25% of women nearing the end of their childbearing age who hold at least a master's degree are childless.

The decline in the birth rate is something that President Trump and the Republican Congress addressed over Democrat opposition back in 2017, by instituting a \$2,000 annual tax credit for each child under age 17. But this child tax credit has fallen in real value due to inflation, and a boost in it during Covid was not extended beyond 2021.

This child tax credit is paltry compared with the benefits that every newborn American contributes to our country over a lifetime. In addition to military service and other sacrifices, the average American will pay \$500,000 in taxes over his life, so the child tax credit should be far higher than \$2,000.

Other countries have changed their policies to encourage more childbearing. Communist China replaced its one-child policy with a two-child policy in 2016, and then ended its two-child policy in 2021 in favor of promoting having three children.

Poland's conservative-leaning government was just ousted from power in part because it allowed Poland's birth rate to decline to its lowest level since World War II. Our minuscule, inflation-depleted child tax credit should likewise become an election issue as our birth rate plummets.

Texas Rangers, only MLB team that doesn't hold 'Pride Night,' wins World Series

On Wednesday night, MLB's Texas Rangers defeated the Arizona Diamondbacks 5 to 0 in Game 5 of the World Series, becoming champions for the first time in franchise history. Not initially considered likely to be a 2023 World Series winning team, the Rangers are perhaps best known among conservatives as being the only MLB team to refuse to host a "Pride Night" game in celebration of sodomy and the LGBT agenda.

"Apparently, there's no pride in Texas," a liberal contributor to Fan Nation, which is owned by Sports Illustrated, said in June of this year after the franchise refused to go along with the league's "Pride Night" efforts.

Once owned by former president George W. Bush from 1988 until 1994, the team has steadfastly resisted pressure from LGBT groups and hostile media outlets to host a "Pride" game. It did, however, invite homosexual athletes to its stadium in 2003, a move that prompted massive backlash at the time. It has also released public statements in recent years in promotion of the LGBT agenda, while also contributing money to LGBT-oriented sports initiatives.

"Our commitment is to make everyone feel welcome and included in Rangers baseball," the team said in a statement earlier this year. "That means in our ballpark, at every game, and in all we do – for both our fans and our employees. We deliver on that promise across our many programs to have a positive impact across our entire community."

In 2022, the Rangers were a platinum sponsor of the "Gay Softball World Series" in Dallas. Approximately 900 rainbow-clad players from the tournament attended a game at the team's Globe Life Field.

"This is another example of how the Rangers strive to make everyone feel welcome and included in all we do," spokesman John Blake said at the time.

On October 21, 2021 – so-called "Spirit Day" – the Rangers' social media account tweeted support for "inclusion." The day was created by a Canadian teenager in 2010 to bring attention to "bullying" of "LGBTQ+ youth."



In 2021, the team released a statement informing The Athletic that members of the Rangers' front office volunteered at the pro-LGBT Resource Center in Dallas "to help with preparations for their Teen Halloween Party."

Fox News also reported that Rangers COO Neil Leibman told The Dallas Morning News in 2020 that the Center helped him adopt changes that made the organization "more inclusive in hiring practices."

Earlier this year, MLB commissioner Rob Manfred reportedly directed teams to not wear rainbow-themed jerseys during any "Pride" games, which are held at the discretion of team owners. The league's 29 other teams have all hosted "Pride" games, with the Chicago Cubs being the first in 2001.

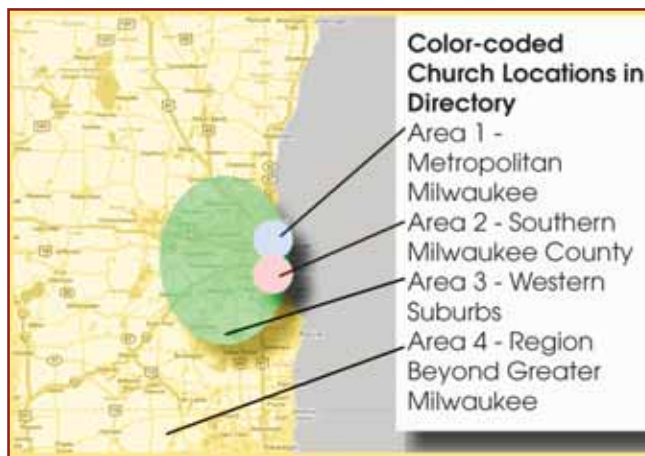
