The Independence Day message rings true at CEF®, helping equip parents to raise God-fearing, responsible children

It's not only important that children learn that their liberty and rights are blessings from God, but the success of our nation and other nations depends on the same truth,' says CEF Vice President of Administration Fred Prv.

July 4 is known as Independence Day because it celebrates the birth of the United States of America as an independent nation, free from unjust rule and unhealthy dependency.

For Child Evangelism Fellowship® (CEF®), this day serves as a reminder to teach kids about the importance of America's history of freedom and an opportunity to provide parents with the tools to raise God-fearing, responsible children.

Benjamin Franklin once said, "Only a virtuous people are capable of freedom. As nations become more corrupt and vicious, they have more need of masters."

"It's not only important that children learn that their liberty and rights are blessings from God, but the success of our nation and other nations depends on the same truth," said CEF Vice President of Administration Fred Pry.

"CEF teaches parents how to impart personal responsibility. And our many ministries and resources provide fun, age-appropriate Biblical lessons and activities for children to learn about their God-given freedoms in Christ," Pry says.

An Independence Day article on the CEF website explains that parents' goal is to raise their children to become independent adults and offers tips on how to get there.

In short, children must learn how to take responsibility.

Often in today's culture, "discipline" has become synonymous with harsh punishment. However, discipline is a means of growing self-control and responsibility in children to help them become self-disciplined, independent adults. Good discipline is hard work. There's the temptation to avoid holding kids accountable and just letting them do their own thing. Yet the hard work of discipline is worth it, as it helps produce responsible, independent adults.

Three ways to help develop a godly, disciplined child:

First, teach children to study the Bible to learn about God and what Hehas to say and defer to His authority. God, the Creator of all things, is the one who has established right and wrong. It's important for kids to understand God's position of authority over their lives and that God has established other positions of authority they should respect.

Second, using God's word as a guide, set expectations. Talk to children about those expectations and consequences for disobedience. Teaching kids to understand consequences will help produce responsible, independent adults.

Third, be consistent. If children know that their parents will follow through because they consistently have in the past, it will help lead to immediate obedience based on trust, not fear. This can also help reduce frustration and hold anger in check for both the parents and children. When children are allowed to continue their bad behavior, it reinforces that behavior.

"This July 4, CEF encourages parents and loved ones to take the next step in discipling their children toward the true independence God desires — an independence and freedom rooted in obedience to Him, which begins with honoring and obeying their parents," says Pry.



"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations..." Matthew 28:19a

The border area between some countries in Asia can be dangerous crisis areas to people on both sides of the border. These are places where bad actors often prey upon vulnerable people. Crimes of human trafficking, slavery, and abuse create trauma for many already fleeing danger in their home country.

On our last trip to southeast Asia, we were introduced to a group of young people who had been scammed by traffickers who promised that they would receive good jobs and a place to live if they joined the company. After agreeing to join, the traffickers confiscated their passports and compelled them to work in a 'call center' that would contact people to persuade them to buy a product

they didn't want, or divulge personal information so that the bosses could hack into bank accounts or sell the credit card information to make money. If they didn't produce results on these calls, they wouldn't get food. When the government raided the call center, these young people were rounded up. They were placed in a local ministry that serves refugees and vulnerable people, but the young people were stuck and had to wait for many weeks or months to receive new passports to be able to return to their home country.

Nancy and I trained trauma healing facilitators to begin healing groups with these young people, but they didn't speak the same language, so an interpreter would be needed. How could that work? Would they be able to help?

We learned again that God always has the answer and is never late! While we were training a few weeks earlier in the home country of these stuck young people, we used the version of Healing the Wounds of Trauma material in their language.

Nancy had kept two copies of the translated materials. Imagine the surprise and joy we felt to be able to give these materials to the facilitators that would be used to care for this group of young people, helping them learn about how Jesus can heal their heart wounds and how He can change their lives for eternity.

Thank you for your prayers for us and prayers for the ministry of Trauma Healing! Please continue to pray for our good health, safety in travel, stamina, and success in the training. Pray that lives will be changed, leaders equipped to help others with their trauma, and Jesus Christ will be made known through our presence and ministry in these places.



White House Action Ensures Churches 'Can No Longer Be Intimidated' by **IRS for Endorsing Candidates**

Pastors may now endorse candidates from the pulpit without fear of losing their tax-exempt status, thanks to a Trump administration court settlement that conservatives hail as a victory that will "no longer allow the IRS to bully us," while liberals denounce it as a "Christian Nationalist" plot that "threatens our democracy."

The Trump administration agreed Monday not to prosecute churches that formally endorse or condemn a candidate during elections. The

National Religious Broadcasters (NRB), Intercessors for America, and two Texas churches sued the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) last August, arguing a 1954 tax code provision known as the Johnson Amendment



violates the First Amendment and has been used to persecute conservative churches.

In a consent decree filed on July 7 in the U.S. District Court of Eastern Texas in Tyler, the Trump administration noted that,

for many churches, "the exercise of their religious beliefs includes teaching or instructing their congregations regarding all aspects of life, including guidance concerning the impact of faith on the choices inherent in electoral politics." Therefore, it will no longer threaten churches that endorse candidates with losing their 501(c)(3) status. The ruling still applies to other nonprofits. A consent decree usually cannot be appealed, except for fraud.

"This is a victory. Pastors need to understand that we can no longer be intimidated. We can no longer allow the IRS to bully us into telling us what we can say and cannot say," Rep. Mark Harris (R-N.C.) told "Washington Watch".

Good Morning From Wet Allis

Too soon for this terrible joke? Probably. This morning I wanted to reach out and give you all a quick update and continue asking for prayers for a number of members who will be recovering from this flooding for awhile. As you are well aware, on Saturday night/Sunday morning we received historic amounts of rain. The water table and drainage system could not handle the amounts as quickly as they came so everything backed up into low lying neighborhoods. The church basement was flooded and under 2-3 inches of water when we checked on Sunday morning. Our priority the 24 hours



or so has been the homes of our members, and I have personally seen a number of our Journey of Faith family coming along side people who need all sorts of help now that the initial flooding has receded. This has been a huge encouragement and is an amazing way to demonstrate Christ's love to your neighbors. I can tell you from firsthand experience that every extra set of hands has been a blessing. As for our building, Tim Huston has done a ton of work and has providentially found maybe the last carpet cleaner in Milwaukee. He has done an initial pass over the carpet and purchased the supplies to help dry it out. We will need to go over it a couple more times at least, and there is a lot more cleaning to do. Fortunately the ABC taskforce did a ton of decluttering earlier this year, but there is still some stuff that needs to be thrown out from the basement. Beyond this we will need to bleach and mop everything on the basement floor and make

sure its as dry as we can make it. This morning I would like to close with a few charges:

First, if you have been flooded and are in the early stages of recovering- DO NOT STOP. Ask for help. Your church family wants to come alongside you. We know the feelings of being overwhelmed and defeated, but we also know that God is at work even in this. God will not leave or forsake us. Know that no matter how lonely and isolating this feels, you are not alone.

Second, if you were blessed to not be flooded or have already navigated

the waters, I have a pastoral charge for you:

- Help your neighbors. Move trash. Mop floors. Bring fans. Make meals. Pray for and with them. Anything to make this heavy burden lighter for them.
- Come help out at church. If you have fans that are not being used, if you have bleach and disinfectants, if you have time-come use all of that to try to make the basement usable again as quickly as possible.

In my experience with Journey of Faith, these times of challenge are when we really excel as a church in our love for our neighbors. I am super excited to watch and hear stories of your love and care for those "near ones."

Whose Responsibility is it?

A DYING NATION

The U.S. fertility rate reached a historic low last year, with a growing share of women between 25 and 44 having never given birth. Recent data suggests that nearly half of young adults, including those in their 20s and 30s, are either childless or do not expect to have children according to the Pew Research Center. A majority (56%) of childless couples younger than 50 say that they never want to have children. A new Harris Poll study of 2,000 Americans reveals a trend where 43% now prefer pets over children, with many Gen Z and Millennials citing pets as easier to care for and less financially burdensome. There are more households with a pet (70%) than with children under 18 years old (40%). Not only are couples choosing not to have children, but we are killing our children at an alarming rate before they are born.

As saints of God, we know that children are the foundation of any nation. They are our greatest asset, inherently valuable, deserving of love, care, and protection. There is no future for a nation which kills its offspring, because the next generation is our future. Right now, we are living in a nation that is dying. We have a birthrate that is below replacement level of 2.1 children per couple. American couples have an average of 1.6

children. The low birth rate problem is attracting worldwide attention.

America has become a deadly nation for children in the womb. Most Christians may not be aware that, besides abortion, we are killing tiny embryos (preborn children) through birth control and IVF. When we take into account all methods of child aversion, America may be killing more babies than are born. An average of 10,000 babies are born daily, but the daily death tolls for American offspring through abortion, birth control, and IVF may be more than 25,000.

Here is a list of estimated daily death tolls for Abortion - 2,800 (Chemical - 1,760, Surgical - 1,040) Birth Control - from 17,800 to 31,800, IVF - 4,100 (estimate), with explanation as follows.

Abortion - Abortion is the 3rd leading cause of death in the U.S.

Researchers estimate there were 1,026,700 abortions in 2023.

Birth Control - the death toll of tiny human embryos from birth control far exceeds the number of babies being aborted through surgery or chemical abortions, according to Pharmacists for Life. Women using birth control experience breakthrough ovulation fairly frequently, depending on the method.

While it is impossible to know the exact number of embryos conceived during breakthrough ovulation, which die because they are prevented from implanting, estimates from 2009, range from 6.5 million to 11.6 million per year.

In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) is also causing more deaths than abortion. For each couple who tries to bring to birth a live baby, there are at least 7 or more embryos created, the majority of which are either discarded (allowed to die) or put in frozen storage. CDC estimates show that somewhere between 1.5 million and 1.8 million embryos created through IVF were never born.



I Loved Dr. John MacArthur

But did not like his Calvinism! I have his study Bible. But it frustrated me that he used the Term Palestine instead of the words, "Israel God's Promise Land to the Jews!"

I want to share something that's been on my heart about a theological issue many of us face. I have tremendous respect for Dr. John MacArthur's Classical Dispensational Premillenni-

al Pretribulational Rapture Futurist Eschatology. His understanding of Bible prophecy and the end times is excellent and biblically sound.

However, I struggle with his Calvinist theology, and here's why this matters for all of us who love God's Word.

DEFENDING CLASSICAL DISPENSATIONALISM

Classical dispensationalism interprets Scripture literally, historically, and grammatically. This approach takes prophetic texts at face value rather than spiritualizing them, which is why it maintains:

ISRAEL AND THE CHURCH ARE DISTINCT. GOD HAS SEPARATE PROGRAMS FOR EACH.

Unconditional covenants with Israel remain valid including the Abrahamic, Davidic, and New Covenant.

The Tribulation period is literal, representing Daniel's 70th week from Daniel 9:24-27.

The Millennial Kingdom will be earthly and literal as described in Revelation 20:1-6.

Pretribulational Rapture Support includes the doctrine of imminency, meaning Christ could return at any moment as promised in 1 Thessalonians 4:16-17. The Church's absence from tribulation judgments is evident in Revelation chapters 4-19. There's a clear distinction between the Rapture and Second Coming as two separate events, and we have God's promise of deliverance found in Revelation 3:10 and 1 Thessalonians 5:9.

BIBLICAL DISTINCTIONS CLASSICAL DISPENSATIONALISM MAINTAINS

Israel represents God's earthly people with earthly promises, while the Church represents heavenly people with a heavenly calling. God's program with Israel was interrupted, not replaced, as Romans 11:25-26 clearly teaches.

Regarding covenants, the unconditional covenants with Israel remain unfulfilled and await future completion. The Church participates in New Covenant blessings but doesn't replace Israel's role in God's plan.

THE PROBLEM WITH CALVINIST INFLUENCE

My concern is that Calvinism tends toward Replacement Theology because Reformed Covenant Theology sees one overarching covenant of grace. This leads to spiritualizing God's promises to Israel, making the church become "spiritual Israel," which contradicts dispensational distinctions. Predestination undermines the genuine nature of God's offers to both Jews and Gentiles.

WHY THIS MATTERS

Calvinist influence compromises the literal interpretation that makes dispensationalism work. It can lead to supersessionism, where the church replaces Israel. This theological drift has historical connections to antisemitism when the church sees itself as having replaced Israel in God's plan.

THE PALESTINE ISSUE

My concern about MacArthur's use of "Palestine" in his Study Bible is historically valid. "Palestine" comes from "Philistia," named after Israel's enemies. Roman Emperor Hadrian renamed the land "Palestine" after the Bar Kokhba revolt in 135 AD specifically to insult the Jews. The term deliberately obscures Israel's biblical connection to the land and undermines the biblical narrative of God's covenant with Israel.

We must also remember that there are still hostages being held, and Israel continues to face threats to its existence. Using biblical terminology honors both God's promises and acknowledges the reality of Israel's current struggles.

Biblical alternatives would be "The Promised Land," "The Land of Israel," "Canaan" in historical contexts, or "Eretz Israel," which is Hebrew for "Land of Israel."

MY POSITION

I hold consistent Classical Dispensationalism that maintains the Israel-Church distinction, supports Israel's ongoing covenant relationship with God, rejects Calvinist theology as inconsistent with dispensational principles, uses biblical terminology that honors God's promises to Israel, and defends literal interpretation of prophetic Scripture.

This represents theological consistency that many dispensationalists share. We can appreciate MacArthur's eschatological framework while rejecting Reformed theology that undermines dispensational distinctives.

God's Word is clear about His promises to Israel and His plan for the Church. We must be careful not to let systematic theology override the plain teaching of Scripture. Israel remains God's chosen people, and the Church has its own distinct calling and destiny.

What are your thoughts on maintaining these important biblical distinctions?





WHOSE RESPONSIBILITY FROM PAGE 6

Before 1930 ALL church denominations taught that all forms of birth control are wrong. They viewed it as a sin against both the natural order and God's purpose for marriage, which they understood as primarily for procreation. This view was widely held across various Christian denominations for centuries. The Bible tells us in Genesis 1:27, "Be fruitful and multiply."

In Milwaukee, in addition to Planned Parenthood and Affiliated, a new abortion site opened on June 10th to destroy more families. Furthermore, on July 2nd, the Wisconsin Supreme Court nullified the 1849 law that was designed to protect unborn babies. A Marquette University Law School poll found that 58% of Wisconsinites believe that it is okay for a mother to kill her own child while it is in the womb, for most or any reason. As the floodgates have opened, Milwaukee has become a hub for women to come from around the state and other states to legally terminate their children.

Abortion is just one part of the anti-family agenda which is destroying this nation. The LGBTQ movement is another childless movement which has plagued our nation. This ideology has greatly taken over our learning institutions, and left our young people confused, devastated and even suicidal. Our society in America is becoming an anti-God and anti-family society. Most institutions of society (education, government, and media) celebrate and promote abortion, homosexuality, and transgenderism. Our nation is confusing and indoctrinating the children who did survive abortion, inciting them to sin against our Lord Jesus Christ.

CAUSE OF THE PROBLEM

The root of the problem is that we have lost our first love for God (Revelation 2:4). We love ourselves and the things of this world more than we love God and His Kingdom. And because of this we are destroying our families for the cares and desires of this world (Mark 4:19). In our society we see unborn babies as subhuman, and children as a burden, rather than what what the Word of God calls them - a blessing (Psalm 127:3-5). Many in the church today put more value on education and worldly individual success than on getting married and raising a godly family. A major issue is that the church is not ministering outside the church building in the public square. There is too much apathy in the church regarding the two major sins - abortion and homosexuality. All sins are evil, but we believe that child sacrifice and sodomy are some of the most grievous sins to our holy God. Some pastors and churches even promote these sins as acceptable to God. The church has become a silent bystander as our society deteriorates.

WHAT IS THE SOLUTION?

We won't find the answers in the politicians nor the White House. Only the church and gospel of Jesus Christ can eliminate and reverse this trend. Jesus did not stay in the Temple. He went from village to village preaching the gospel of the Kingdom. Jesus said, "Go out in the world and make disciples." When the disciples received the Holy Spirit, they did not stay in the upper room. They went out into the public square to preach the gospel to the lost, and 3,000 souls were saved that day. (Acts 2:1-41).

Hebrews 11:33,34 tells of the heroes of the faith, "who through faith subdued kingdoms, wrought righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became valiant in battle, turned to flight the armies of the aliens." Following Jesus is an active, not passive faith.

We have great examples of active faith in men like George Mueller, Charles Spurgeon, General William Booth, D.L. Moody and Billy Sunday. These men fed and housed orphans, and preached to drunks and prostitutes in the open square. Charles Spurgeon and Billy Sunday were masters of open-air preaching, reaching people who might never have gone to church.

In the parable of the talents (Matthew 25:14-30) Jesus teaches that God holds us accountable for the gifts and talents He has given us. He expects us to bring forth fruit. The servant who buried his talent in the ground, doing nothing, was reprimanded and punished. We are stewards of the world's most valuable asset which a human soul can possess: the gospel of Jesus Christ, which can save souls. God will hold individuals and churches accountable for what they do and do not do. Jesus has already won the war on the cross, but we who believe in Him are to occupy until He comes (Luke 19:11-27).

We can no longer, as saints of God, continue to stay inside the 4 walls of our church buildings while our families, our neighbors, and our nation are being destroyed, because of our inaction. We must minister in the public

square, in our schools, in the legislature and every institution to turn people away from their sins, that they might receive the precious salvation that God offers to all men. God wishes that no man perish (2 Peter 3:9).

WHOSE RESPONSIBILITY IS IT?

The great issue of our day is abortion. In Milwaukee, on a given day, there are 10 - 20 babies killed through abortion. We have shared the astronomical national daily death toll, which is incurring God's wrath. God has been so patient and merciful. Only the church with the gospel of Jesus Christ can eliminate and reverse this trend. Legislation cannot change hearts, only the Holy Spirit and the Word of God can. It is the church's responsibility to help save the lives of the unborn and souls of the parents from the wrath of God to come (Jude 23).

Tarry One Hour is an Evangelical recruiting ministry, seeking other Evangelical Christians to come and join us in ministering to the lost in the public square: at abortion sites, at LGBTQ public gatherings, at the Wisconsin state capitol, with legislators, at high schools and colleges, and Christian outreaches. Our mission is the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20), to make disciples for the Kingdom of Jesus Christ. Our goal is to do our part to turn a godless nation into a God-fearing nation for His glory.

Tarry One Hour encourages individuals, churches and organizations to give just one hour a week to minister outside the abortion facilities. Who could be more in need of the gospel than a mother and father who are destroying their own families? We have the satisfaction of "speaking the truth in love", offering help, and sometimes the extreme joy of seeing a mother or couple choose life for their baby. If we are not out there ministering, the baby doesn't have a chance and the parents may not hear the gospel. It is the church's responsibility to "Open your mouth for the speechless, In the cause of all who are appointed to die." (Proverbs 31:8)

We also have a preventive ministry outside the high schools, giving the students the gospel, abstinence literature, and a 12-week fetal model. We urge our brothers and sisters to join us in these mission fields. Please call us at (262) 672-3685 to get involved. 1/4 c. oil

1 1/2 tsp. vanilla

1/4 tsp. almond extract

1 c. flour

1/2 c. sugar

2 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt

1 c. fresh or frozen blueberries (do not thaw frozen berries)

In a small bowl mix first 5 ingredients. In a medium bowl mix flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Combine bowls and stir only until mixed, do not overmix. Gently stir in blueberries. Place batter in paper muffin cups or greased muffin tin.


Bake $350\,^\circ$ 20-25 minutes or until toothpick inserted near center comes out clean. Makes 12.



We look forward to the continued growth of our school as Dr. Bowen Purpura builds upon her father's work.



The Behavior of Sin to Win




The Jack Roper Story Bio by Jack Rope

My twin sister Anna & I were raised at the Milwaukee County Orphanage. Home. Our mother Lucille, from Zagreb who then came to America. She became pregnant while dating and had twins. She had a nervous breakdown after having her twins born out of wedlock. She bearing 2 children was against the moral code in society in those days. Then the twins were placed to stay at the Milwaukee orphanage for children. When my twin and I were 4 years old, a farm family in Rubicon, Wisconsin took us into their farm. The farm had pigs and cows and chickens, a mean bull and little kittens which was all new to the twins Meows were everywhere especially in the farm barn. Over time, drought took its toll on the crops. The foster family with its kids decided to move into Milwaukee. The foster father started work at Delco and the kids walked to school about a 2 mile distance. School was a bore for Jack. He almost flunked 6th grade and he flunked 7th grade at Walker Junior high school. After Anna graduated from high school she got married. Jack while still in high school got involved in amateur acting which was separate from school. The film producer knew my twin. Jack took the lead film role in 2 films. The first one, For He Shall Conquer, won in an international contest out of Washington, D.C. The producer won a Golden Eaglet trophy. He now lives in Australia. The 2nd film won a Honorable Mention in a different film contest

While in the Navy as a hospital corpsman, I would sew up wound injuries, pediatrics, taking xrays, emergency needs and driving ambulance. .After my tour of military duty I came back home in Milwaukee and applied for Registered Nurse training at Milwaukee Lutheran hospital 3 year program I was accepted for the RN school program. In my last year of RN school, a New Age gentleman came to our school and offered the nursing students the opportunity to apply mind control insights in order to improve our cognitive studies. Two of us then went through the Silva Mind Control course. The course did not improve my smarts. What it did was triggered a curiosity in the psychic and esoteric field. Some of my "psychic" friends and I formed The Wisconson Society for Psychical Reearch. I went to the First Yoga and Esoterice Science lectures in Switzerland and was initiated into Hinduism by Swami Bua and I received my mantra from this guru. The Lord of Heaven knew of my wanderings into a counterfeit religion and later I learned my lesson. The Director of the esoteric conference, Dr. Douglas Baker, asked me to work with him as an assistant. I never gave him an answer. The esoteric arts are related to the "occult".


