



Reflections After Ten Weeks and Three Days on the Road

As many of you know Bob Sr. headed off to heaven on February 5, 2026. In late December, us kids were needed to help our Mom with Dad, for Dad had grown very weak. Not to fear, Dad had planned ahead for this moment. Smile...Dad married Mom when they were young, 23 and 20 respectively. Also, very key, at a Men's Retreat outside Houston, TX, Dad knelt down next to his bed and said, "Bob, I want what you have." That Saturday afternoon in 1989, Dad trusted Christ and His shed blood on the Cross as payment for Dad's sins and Dad got saved!

Now in his old age, Dad had in place the Ultimate long term care policy...FAMILY. For the last two months of his life, we kept Dad at home and employed many of the tools offered free of charge by Medicare and Crescent Hospice in Charleston, SC. Bobby, Evann, Melissa,

Jason and sometimes grandkids took their advice, "You can do this." So, with a "One day at a time" mentality, we used their home care tools and equipment to the fullest. Recapping from our little hospice team to all of you: tape-up diapers that closed around Dad were are an absolute game-changer, the hospital bed was huge, the sturdy plastic chair in his walk-in shower helped big-time with hygiene, Mom's idea for a modern wheel chair with arms that folded back was a dream, we went nowhere without a gait strap, we used a back brace for the primary lifter with handles for our dementia patient to grab instead of the grab bars that Dad was used to grabbing, the hooyer lift was used a few times when just one of us had to lift Dad, comfort med for the last day and a half. Bonus, Dad was an US Army veteran, so add 16 hours per week of in-home hands on that freed us up to take a breather.

National Religious Broadcasters Association Welcomes Thousands of Christian Communicators to 2026 Convention in Nashville, Tenn.

The National Religious Broadcasters (NRB) association welcomed more than 5,700 Christian media professionals—including 272 international attendees representing 43 countries outside the United States—to the NRB 2026 International Christian Media Convention, held February 17–20 in Nashville, Tenn. The leading global convention and trade show for Christian communicators featured 56,000 sq. feet of exhibits with more than 240 exhibitors.



Virginia Prodan was interviewed by Bob Conklin of the Christian Courier Newspaper at this year's NRB. Virginia's story is detailed in her new book, *Saving My Assassin*.

Speaking to the room full of Christian broadcasters and media professionals at the Opening Session of NRB 2026, Troy A. Miller, NRB President & CEO, said:

“A new era of Christian media starts now, and it starts right here. ... NRB is actively working for the people in this room, clearing the way for you to do the ministry God has called you to, ... not merely to create content, but to call the church to obedient, public, visible faith. Faith that bears fruit. Faith that is in it to win the game. And the end goal of the game is eternity with God.

...Our calling is to speak with clarity where the culture is confused, and to bear witness where institutions demand silence. The question is whether we will steward this moment.”

NRB 2026 officially opened Tuesday, Feb. 17, as Christian communicators from around the world gathered for a full day of connection, collaboration, and vision-casting. The Intercollegiate (iNRB) Challenges launched the next generation of media leaders, while members convened for the annual NRB Membership Meeting. Attendees participated in specialized gatherings and networking moments such as the Industry Reception and TV Showcase.

The Opening Session began with virtual remarks from President Donald J. Trump, who addressed attendees and underscored the vital role of Christian media.

“I want to thank all of you as Christian broadcasters, influencers, and communications professionals,” President Trump said in the exclusive video to NRB attendees. “You really are great professionals. Your voice lifts up and inspires countless people around the world. America was founded on faith and religious liberties, and under this Administration we are once again defending your rights and restoring our historic identity as One Nation Under God.”

The evening also included spirit-filled, moving worship led by Michael W. Smith, Nicole C. Mullen, and Lipscomb University Choir and a stirring message from H.B. Charles Jr.—setting a tone of unity and expectancy for the week ahead.

The NRB Board of Directors also voted on new resolutions for 2026, helping chart the association's course for the year to come. Read all 2026 resolutions here.

That afternoon, the World by Media Forum & Reception highlighted how Christian media and ministry are advancing the Gospel across borders. Attendees heard firsthand accounts of the transformative work taking place internationally, including insights from keynote speaker Brad Brandon of Across Nigeria. The session also featured music

from Christian artist Sean Rodriguez. Later that evening, NRB President's Council members and guests mingled at a special VIP reception.

Throughout the week, NRB hosted a full slate of panels, talks, and networking opportunities, including discussions on artificial intelligence and ministry innovation, religious liberty and censorship, digital evangelism and the “information war,” mental health and human flourishing, engaging Gen Z and Alpha, and the future of podcasting, broadcasting, and Christian filmmaking. New this year,

On Wednesday morning, Feb. 18, the Exhibit Hall burst to life with a ribbon-cutting, opening the doors to a sprawling floor where attendees explored hundreds of booths, discovered the latest innovations, and connected with top exhibitors across cutting-edge media, technology, film, ministry, education, and more. This year, NRB debuted three immersive training labs on AI, new media, and church media, staged on the Exhibit Hall floor to equip ministries with practical skills, actionable insights, and the tools they need to thrive.

The Media Awards Luncheon recognized this year's recipients of the digital media, international, radio, and TV industry awards, honoring excellence and innovation across Christian communications. Newly added this year, the Veteran's Ministry Initiative Luncheon brought focused attention to ministry efforts serving veterans and their families, featuring keynote remarks from Lt. Col. Allen West.

Wednesday evening featured the annual Media Leadership Dinner with keynote remarks from Bill Abbott and Shannon Bream of Fox News Channel. The day concluded with a Worship Service led by Journey Worship Co. and a message from Samuel Rodriguez, followed by the Intercollegiate NRB Awards and Members-Only Ice Cream Social. The New Media Reception convened prominent voices shaping today's independent and faith-based media, featuring NRB representatives Lucas Miles of TPUSA Faith and Billy Hallowell of CBN News.

Thursday, Feb. 19 began with the annual, sold-out Breakfast to Honor Israel, presented in partnership with the American Friends of Magen David Adom, Combat Antisemitism Movement, and International Fellowship of Christians and Jews, featuring musical guest Omer Netzer.

Thursday evening's NRB Freedom 250 Celebration opened with a formal Color Guard procession and drum cadence from the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) Band, followed by the National Anthem sung by Alexis Wilkins. Pastor and author John Amanchukwu opened in prayer before the Honorable Secretary of War Pete Hegseth delivered keynote remarks.

“As religious communicators, you give voice to the average person in the pew,” Secretary Hegseth said. “Once you serve and strengthen their communities, it impacts every area of life, including serving in the military. We people of faith must not back down. We will continue to praise Christ and exalt God. And if we did back down, as

The Convention culminated Friday evening with the Closing Gala and Special Service Awards, celebrating excellence and faithful service in Christian media. Attendees enjoyed a time of worship led by Clark Beckham and an inspiring keynote message from Nancy DeMoss Wolgemuth.



Sometimes the Lord allows us to go through “faith journeys” to draw us closer to Him. Did you ever wonder what it would be like, if you completely lost your voice? As a recording artist, worship leader and lead vocalist with our music ministry, this thought was unthinkable.

I was grateful for the privilege to be on staff as the worship leader at a local church. During special holiday concerts and while leading worship,

I began noticing an increased raspiness in my voice, decreased

vocal range and unusual bouts of GERD, which I had never experienced. These medical concerns quickly prompted me to make an appointment with a ENT physician. Upon examination and reviewing my abnormal lab diagnostics, my doctor diagnosed me with hemorrhagic vocal chord ulcers. He inquired if I had recently vacationed in any tropical destinations. I mentioned that my husband and I had honeymooned in Hawaii the prior year. I also shared that I experienced burning sensations in my throat after returning home from the vacation, which subsided within a few days. My doctor shared that I may have unknowingly contracted a chronic bacterial infection while in Hawaii, which caused the vocal chord ulcerations.

The doctor advised starting with conservative treatment. Unfortunately since it did not resolve the problem, he recommended vocal laser surgery to remove the ulcerations, which included 2 months of COMPLETE voice rest.

While in prayer I cried out to the Lord asking why He allowed this infirmity. Then I felt His peace, strength and reassurance knowing that He would carry me throughout this journey, and that He had a better plan for me to be a witness for His glory. Proverbs 3:5, “Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding, in all your ways acknowledge Him and He will direct your paths.”

After my husband and I sought the Lord in prayer, I moved forward to have the surgery. I activated my faith and made the deliberate decision to trust the Lord as I placed my life within His loving hands. With His word to encourage me, my loving husband, family, friends and church praying for me, I began to embark upon this unknown journey. This was one of the most challenging faith journeys in my life, contemplating the post operative affects that could occur.

Throughout my two month recovery, I wore a button that said “I CANNOT SPEAK”, communicated using an online text to speech program, carried a marker with white board and my husband answered every phone call.

During this wilderness and silent season of voicelessness, God allowed me to experience the building blocks of embracing faith, exercising humility, bolstering courageous trust, diving deeper into His word and refreshing times of prayer with Him. Jeremiah 29:13; “You will seek me and find me, when you seek me with all of your heart.” It also empowered me accept the help of others, enhance my prayer life, envoke integrity, embody genuine faith and deepen my relationship with the Lord.

Despite roughness in my voice during my post surgical examination, I was able to extend a brief “thank you” to my doctor, and also say “I love you” to my husband and my parents. Tears of joy flooded my heart as I heard my voice for the first time in months!

After a regime of vocal therapy throughout the next few months, my doctor allowed me to gradually begin singing once again! By the grace of God, I am blessed to share that my vocal chords have healed with no reoccurrence’s, and I am hitting notes that I’ve never sang before. I thank the Lord for the opportunity to share my testimony, while providing vocal health awareness and helpful advice to other vocalists who have had similar problems.

After reflecting upon that spiritual “faith journey”, I am thankful as God opened doors for my testimony to be featured in faith based periodicals, along with invitations as a guest speaker and to perform on various local and national Christian TV and radio networks. I was able to record another CD titled “Inspirations”, and have been offered a national recording contract which I hope to pursue in the near future.

It is a blessing to minister throughout the Midwest as a soloist and with our music ministry at churches, national charities, holiday celebrations, weddings, corporate venues, sporting events, community outreaches including various ProBuCalls sponsored functions. After experiencing that wilderness season I adopted the platform of “Human Trafficking Awareness – A Voice For The Voiceless”, as an ambassador when representing various pageant systems.

God often creates our faith tapestry to allow us to deepen our relationship with Him, so He can use us as His conduits. What seemed to be a hopeless situation God turned into a blessing, so I could share my inspirational testimonial with others. Romans 8:28, “And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.”

Sometimes God allows “set-backs to ignite the flame of hope to fulfill your legacy! Look for God’s miracles every day, and allow Him to fulfill your mission calling and His divine destiny for your life! I am grateful to God for the privilege to sing for His glory and share His faithfulness! My personal motto; “PURSUE A PASSION TO PRAISE.”

JOHN A MOST INTERESTING PERSON

History becomes fascinating when a man proves that a historical event is important to learn about. Such an interesting person is Lt John Linstedt, a US Navy Submarine Force historian and a former nuclear submarine officer.



When President Eisenhower was in office, Russia was becoming a concern. Soviet aggression during the Cold War was becoming a problem. Our president saw the need to have our country to be better protected knowing that on the other side of the world Russia was building up their military. America needed to have a deterrence against Russia's plan to be number one in military strength. America needed to counter the growing Soviet military threat. President Eisenhower ordered the development of a sea launched ballistic missile system.

Lt. John Lindstedt became "qualified" in submarines in 1974 on the USS Kamehameha SSBN642. To become a qualified officer, you had to go through extensive studies, extensive testing and extensive long oral examinations.

"Submarines carry out some of the nation's most difficult, valuable, and secretive missions. This piece of equipment [subs] demands men and women to operate these complex crafts safely and efficiently."

The fleet ballistic missile submarine was built to form a Nuclear Triad with strategic bombers and intercontinental ballistic missiles. This Triad, the fleet ballistic missile submarine has held the peace since 1960.

The missile development system was designed for the submarine by prominent US companies. They were the Lockheed Corporation, Westinghouse, MIT, General Electric and the Aerojet company.

Lt. Lindstedt attended the US Merchant Marine Academy, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and the Arizona State University at which he studied electro-analytical chemistry.

Lt. Lindstedt also served in the Merchant Marine as a marine engineer sailing to Northern Europe and to South America. He made three deterrent patrols on the USS Kamehameha. John has many interesting insights in the field of submarines. He provides lectures to universities, high schools and senior citizen homes. The United States Submarine Veterans recognized his teaching skills and awarding him the "2024 Meritorious Shipmate Award" in 2024.

After his naval service, he returned home to Milwaukee to work in his family business Advanced Plating Technologies, which provides surface finishing to a wide variety of companies, defense work for all portions of the U.S. military.



SAUSAGE AND RICE CASSEROLE

- 1 pound pork sausage
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 1 1/2 c. diced celery
- 2 cloves minced garlic
- 1/2 c. diced green pepper, optional
- 1/4 tsp red pepper flakes, optional
- 1 can cream soup*
- 2 c. low-sodium chicken broth
- 1 c. uncooked basmati rice

Fresh parsley for garnish


Brown sausage, onion, celery, garlic and optional green pepper and red pepper flakes in a large skillet. Drain any grease. Add soup and broth to a 13 x 9 pan and whisk to combine. Stir in rice. Stir in sausage mixture. Cover casserole tightly with foil then bake in preheated 350 degree oven for 50-60 minutes or until rice is tender. Garnish with parsley.

- 3 T. butter
- 3 T. flour
- 1/2 c. milk
- 1/2 c. low -sodium chicken broth
- Salt and pepper to taste



Trump At National Prayer Breakfast: “Prayer Is America’s Superpower”

President Donald Trump delivered an expansive, faith-forward address at the National Prayer Breakfast, declaring that prayer remains America’s greatest strength and that the nation’s future depends on a return to God, biblical truth, and moral courage. Speaking candidly, Trump pushed back against what he called distorted media portrayals of his faith, saying his remarks are often stripped of context or humor, while emphasizing that religion in America is “back hotter than ever before.”

The president praised congressional leaders and allies for advancing faith-related priorities despite narrow margins, recounting late-night calls to rally votes on issues tied to religion, governance, and national renewal. Trump contrasted lawmakers who consistently support faith-based values with those who, in his words, reflexively oppose even broadly supported measures, arguing that resistance to religious freedom and voter integrity is ideological rather than democratic.

Trump asserted that no modern president has done more to defend religion, describing an era in which faith was sidelined by political leaders seeking “neutrality or worse.” He argued that Christians face growing hostility in public life and said believers must not retreat from civic engagement. “You have to have religion. You have to have faith. You have to have God,” Trump said, warning that a nation that abandons its spiritual foundation cannot remain great.

Throughout the speech, Trump tied faith to governance, citing policies aimed at restoring religious liberty. He highlighted the rollback of restrictions associated with the Johnson Amendment, allowing pastors and religious leaders to speak freely without fear of losing tax-exempt status. He also pointed to expanded school choice, new federal guidance protecting prayer in public schools, and the reinstatement of service members discharged over religious objections.

The president underscored his administration’s pro-life and pro-family stance, emphasizing efforts to stop taxpayer funding for abortion

advocacy abroad, defend the family, protect children from gender ideology, and preserve women’s sports. Trump framed these actions as moral imperatives rooted in the belief that rights come from God, not government, echoing the Declaration of Independence’s assertion that humanity is endowed by its Creator.



Trump also addressed the persecution of Christians worldwide, recounting decisive military action against ISIS forces targeting believers and highlighting the rescue of persecuted Christians, including Miriam Ibrahim of Sudan. “When Christians come under attack,” Trump said, “they know they’re going to be defended.” He presented this commitment as both a moral duty and a defining feature of American leadership.


Domestically, the president connected faith with law and order, crediting firm enforcement for dramatic reductions in violent crime in Washington, D.C., and other major cities. He argued that families should be able to attend church without fear and that protecting worship is inseparable from protecting communities. According to Trump, spiritual revival and public safety rise together when government upholds justice and accountability.

Looking ahead to America’s 250th anniversary, Trump announced plans for a national prayer gathering on the National Mall, inviting Americans to pray, give thanks, and rededicate the nation as “one nation under God.” He described rising church attendance, record Bible sales, and increased youth engagement as signs of a broader awakening already underway.

Closing his remarks, Trump reflected on stories of faith under trial, including young believers who survived tragedy through prayer. Nearly 250 years after the founding, he said, the faith of the American people remains unbroken. “Prayer strengthens. Prayer heals. Prayer saves,” Trump declared. “Quite simply, prayer is America’s superpower.”

Should Christians Influence Government?

The counsel that Jeremiah proclaimed to the Jewish exiles in Babylon also supports the idea of believers having influence on laws and government. Jeremiah told the exiles, “Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare” (Jeremiah 29:7). But if believers are to seek to bring good to such a pagan society, that must include seeking to bring good to its government. The true welfare of such a city will be advanced through governmental laws and policies that are consistent with God’s teaching in the Bible.



Other believers in God had high positions of governmental influence in non-Jewish nations, including Joseph, Moses, Nehemiah, Mordecai and Queen Esther.

In addition, there are several passages in the Old Testament prophets that address the sins of foreign nations around Israel. These prophets could speak to nations outside of Israel because the God who is revealed in the Bible is the God of all peoples and all nations of the earth. He is their Creator, and they will one day stand before Him in judgment. Therefore, the moral standards of God as revealed in the Bible are the moral standards to which God will hold all people accountable.

In the New Testament, John the Baptist and the Apostle Paul are examples of believers who influenced governments and governmental leaders.

Believers have a responsibility to bear witness to the moral standards of the Bible by which God will hold everyone accountable, including those in public office. Influencing government for good on the basis of the wisdom found in God’s own words is a theme that runs through the entire Bible.

Try to imagine what a nation and its government would be like if all Christian influence on government were suddenly removed—if all the churches and all the Christians in a society stopped seeking to have any kind of influence on laws or on government.

Within a few years, most people would have no moral authority beyond that of individual human opinion. How could a nation find any moral guidance?

We need to remember that the entire world is locked in a tremendous

spiritual battle. There are demonic forces, forces of Satan, that seek to oppose God’s purposes and bring evil and destruction to every human being that God created in His own image. They are seeking to bring destruction to every human society and every nation. “We know that we are from God, and the whole world lies in the power of the evil one” (1 John 5:19).

Therefore, if pastors and church members say, “I’m going to be silent about the moral and ethical issues that we face as a nation,” that will leave a moral vacuum, and it will not be long until the ultimate adversaries of the Gospel—Satan and his demons—will rush in and influence every decision in a way contrary to Biblical standards.

And if that happens, then governments around the world will increasingly use their power to silence the church. Governments will say, “Keep your homophobic, misogynist, oppressive, fear-inducing, intolerant, militarist, hate-mongering Christianity out of our lives, out of our schools, off of our college campuses, off of our radio and TV stations, out of any part of government, and out of our quiet suburbs—where you are never going to get permission to build any more churches. Keep your hate-mongering Christian religion locked up in the privacy of your own home!”

That is where moral standards will come from if Christians remain silent.

Questions Christians Should Ask Before Using AI

This article is an attempt to provide information for Christians who want to use, or who currently use, AI. It does not cover how to technically and safely use AI. Rather it is a first step to take as a Christian before using AI. The hope is it will allow them to check their Christian values to filter their use of AI.

1. Have I prayerfully asked God for help in using AI? (Phillipians 4:6 “But in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.”)
2. Am I using AI wisely as God would have me to use it? (Proverbs 1:7 “The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.”)
3. Is there anything in my approach, use and purpose for AI that even mildly becomes an idol for me or others? (Exodus 20:3-4 “You shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an image in the form of anything in heaven above or on the earth beneath or in the waters below.”)
4. What are the biblical principles I believe in and follow? Is my use of AI in conflict with any of those principles? (Exodus 20:1-17 The Ten Commandments)
5. Does what I plan to do with AI or am already doing with AI, or have done with AI, in any way promote an inappropriate bias or

prejudice? (Matthew 5:4 “But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you.”)

6. Is the data I use and share with AI any type of intellectual property or content owned by someone else? If so, do I have permission to use it and to what extent? (Ephesians 4:28 “Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with their own hands, that they may have something to share with those in need.”)
7. Christian discernment distinguishes right from wrong. Take my AI goals, work and results and filter through Christian discernment. Are there any discernible problems? (Charles Spurgeon: “Discernment is not knowing the difference between right and wrong, it is knowing the difference between right and almost right.” Some things may feel so right but in reality and in fact they are not right enough. A deep check and Holy Spirit lead understanding of the bible is needed for this level of discernment; especially with AI.)
8. AI has limitations; God does not. Am I using AI in the correct way to appropriately manage AI’s limitations? (2 Corinthians 12:9-10 “But he said to me, ‘My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness. Therefore I will boast all the

more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." God helps direct us even with our limitations.

9. AI can provide information that appears to be truthful but is not (hallucinations). If AI results provide any hallucinations can I detect them and manage them? (Proverbs 12:19 "Truthful lips endure forever, but a lying tongue lasts only a moment.." Proverbs 12:22 "The LORD detests lying lips, but he delights in people who are trustworthy.")
10. If data is fed by imperfect humans who copied some of God's perfect data. Am I respecting God by checking that humans added God's data correctly? (2 Timothy 3:16-17 "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work".)
11. Do you see AI as the source of all knowledge? Proverbs 2:6 "For the LORD gives wisdom; from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.")
12. Are you considering AI miracles as coming from AI or from God? (Jeremiah 32:26-27 "Then the word of the LORD came to Jeremiah: "I am the LORD, the God of all mankind. Is anything too hard for me?")

A PRAYER FOR CHRISTIANS USING AI

Lord, there is nothing artificial about your intelligence. You are all knowing, omniscient, omnipresent, faultless, flawless and full of love. Thank you for AI. Thank you that AI is a powerful tool that can be used for the good, the just and to bring blessings. Show me how to use AI your way. Forgive me for believing that any part of AI is more important than you are. Remind me that AI is still only a machine with software that does not have a body, a soul and a spirit.

And Father God there are really bad people, who are very smart, and who are using AI to steal and destroy, deceive and defraud. Help Christian AI adopters and other good AI users to prevent these nega-

tive outcomes. For the lonely as well emotionally challenged AI can appear human and addictive leading them to dangerous behaviors. Help us to pray for and reach out to the disenfranchised, the lonely, the widows and the poor, using AI as needed for support and assistance. Lord, the future of AI may look limitless. We may see what looks like miracles in the near future. Life on earth may experience significant change. My prayer is that this great advancement in technology will help us all grow closer to you; and to better serve others in your name. Help Christians to use AI to reach others with your grace and truth, forgiveness and blessings, healing and true knowledge. In Jesus Name,




"SOME TING WONG!" PLEASE PRAY FOR OUR CHURCHES!




